TODAY'S GAME

- For the second straight season the matchup between the Kennesaw State Owls and Monmouth Hawks will decide who wins the Big South Championship. With a Hawk win today, Monmouth would clinch at least a share of the 2018 Big South Title while the Owls could win their second consecutive outright BSC crown with a victory.
- The Hawks come into today's game winners of five straight games, recently defeating Charleston Southern at home 37-3. The Hawks have won 10-straight at home, the second in the Big South only to Kennesaw's 14 consecutive home wins.
- The Owls are winners of eight straight contests and come into the game as the No. 2 team in the country, boasting the FCS' top rushing offense and a defense that is allowing 10.8 points per game.
- The Hawks are receiving votes in both the AFCA and STATS FCS polls for the first time since September 17th.
- Today is senior day; 24 Monmouth players will be honored prior to the contest. It is also Veteran's appreciation day.
- Today's game can be viewed on ESPN3, with Matt Harmon (pxp), Eddy Occhipinti (analyst) and Suzi Mellano (sideline) on the call.

MONMOUTH AGAINST THE BIG SOUTH CONFERENCE

■ Since starting up Big South league play in 2014, Monmouth owns a 11-13 conference record.

■ The Hawks own a 3-1 record against Gardner-Webb, 1-0 against Campbell, 3-2 against PC, 2-3 vs CSU and and 0-3 vs Kennesaw State. Monmouth has yet to face future BSC opponent Northern Alabama.

■ Monmouth followed up a 0-5 season in '16 in Big South play by going 4-1 in 2017. The Hawks were selected to finish second in the Big South in the Preseason Coaches' Poll.

■ MU was 0-3 against members of the Big South prior to joining the league, including dropping a home and home series with Coastal Carolina and a non-conference tilt with Liberty.

CALLAHAN WINS 150TH CONTEST AT THE HELM OF THE HAWKS

With the win over Presbyterian last week, Monmouth Head Coach Kevin Callahan earned his 150th career victory. Callahan's 150 wins is the ninth most among active FCS coaches and just one of four to do it with one team.

REGGIE WHITE JR EYES ANOTHER RECORD

Senior Reggie White Jr. is on the cusp of another Big South career record, as he needs 66 receiving yards to become the league's all-time leader. The Big South's all-time receptions leader is second in conference annals with 3,105 yards and approaching the career mark of 3,170 set by Liberty's Darrin Peterson from 2012-15.

BACK TO BACK SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Junior placekicker Matt Mosquera tied a school record with three converted field goals in the win over Charleston Southern, en route to his 13 point day. The junior connected on a field goals of 44, 36 and 25 yards, which was no easy feat considering that the wind was steadily blowing out of the west end-zone at 25-35 MPH. Mosquera was also 4-for-4 on extra points, hitting all 31 he has attempted this season.

Guerreiro led all rushers with 117 yards on the ground while Farri finished with an even 100. It was the first time MU had two backs over 100 yards in a game since Guerreiro and Eric Zokouri did it last year aga against Liberty.



KENNESAW STATE OWLS

HEAD COACH BRIAN BOHANNON



Brian Bohannon was introduced as the first head coach in Kennesaw State history in March of 2013. In four years he has turned a brand new program in a nationally-ranked, championship winning team with a 34-11 record. A native of Griffin, Ga., Bohannon has 18 seasons of coaching experience at the FBS and FCS levels, all of which have come while working with Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson. Most recently Bohannon served as quarterbacks/B backs coach at Georgia Tech under Johnson. He has also coached at Navy and Georgia Southern. A four-year letter winner and standout as a wide receiver at Georgia, Bohannon started his coaching career at West Georgia before earning his first full-time position at Gardner-Webb (N.C.) as wide receivers coach in 1996.

Kennesaw State 52, Monmouth 21

Nov. 18, 2017 • First Third Bank Stadium • Kennesaw, GA

KENNESAW, GA - Monmouth dropped its regular season finale on the road to Kennesaw State, 52-21 in the Big South Championship on Saturday.

Kennesaw State forced Monmouth into a season-high five turnovers, including on three straight second half drives, to win their 10th consecutive football game. KSU quarterback Chandler Burks scored four times on the ground and threw for another score in the win.

Monmouth was led by redshirt freshman running back Pete Guerriero, who checked in with his sixth 100-yard performance, finishing with 141 yards on 19 carries with a pair of touchdowns. Guerriero also led the Hawks in receiving with 44 yards for 185 all-purpose yards. He became the first Monmouth back to eclipse 1,000 yards since the 2013 season.

The Hawks got two big plays from tight end Jake Powell on the opening drive, including a nine yard pick up from the redshirt sophomore on third down. It was tight end Shawn Clark who recovered a fumble on a goal-line dive to put the Hawks up 7-0. Monmouth's opening drive went 11 plays, 61 yards and covered 6:53 of game time.

Kennesaw State answered immediately with a 45 yard Shaquill Terry touchdown run, needing just three plays to equal the score. A three and out for the Hawks and a shanked punt gave KSU the ball inside Monmouth territory with the Owls taking the lead five plays later on a two-yard Chandler Burks touchdown. Guerriero's 28 yard run tied it up at 14-14 at the start of the second quarter.

Monmouth's defense held for the first time all game but the Owls forced their league-leading 28th turnover and scored five plays later to retake the lead, 21-14 with 10:14 to play in the half. Monmouth coughed up the ball just over midfield on their next possession and the Owls drove down and scored on an eight-play drive to go ahead 28-14 with 3:27 to play. Monmouth responded with a 19-yard Guerriero touchdown to cut it to one score, but the Hawks gave up a 36-yard touchdown pass with 20 seconds left in the quarter to go down 35-21 into the break.

KSU added a field goal at the start of the second half then went up 45-21 on Burks' third rushing score of the game. The Owl defense forced a trio of turnovers in the final 30 minutes, adding a fourth quarter touchdown to finish the scoring.

- Monmouth is now 0-3 all-time against Kennesaw State and 0-2 at Fifth Third Bank Stadium

- The Hawks had their seven game win streak snapped with the result

- After going 0-5 last year in conference play, Monmouth turned around and had a program record four wins in the Big South this season.

- The 52 points surrendered and five turnovers were both season-highs for the Hawks

- Monmouth was shut out by the Kennesaw State defense in the second half, with KSU scoring 21 points off of its five turnovers in the game

NOTES ON THE CHARLESTON SOUTHERN GAME

■ Monmouth improved to 7-2 on the season with their 10th consecutive home win, this time a 37-3 win over Charleston Southern on Saturday. It was the first win at home in the series for the Hawks and the second straight victory over CSU. It was also the most lopsided victory in the series at 34 points.

■ For the first time this season, Kenji Bahar wasn't sacked, while the defense recorded a pair of sacks on CSU.

■ The Hawks held CSU to 1-of-11 on third down and nine first downs. The MU offense had a season-high 27 first downs and went 10-of-17 on third down. The Hawks were also six-of-six in the redzone.

■ The Hawks have scored 221 points in five games at home this year (44.2 average). MU has owned the fourth quarter of the first nine contests, outscoring opponents 90-41.

■ Seniors **Matt Castronuova** and **Pete Righi** were selected as game captains against the Buccaneers.

■ Monmouth dominated the time of possession, 39:05 to 20:55 and had its two second longest drives of the year, a 14 play drive that ate up 6:17 and a 13 play drive that took 6:30 off the clock. Monmouth had a 15 play drive against Eastern Michigan and a drive that ate up 6:47 against Bucknell.

■ It was the first time in five games that Monmouth allowed more than 100 yards rushing in a game, with CSU registering 135 in the contest.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

■ Monmouth's offense is averaging 32.8 points per game in 2018, which is second in the Big South and 26th nationally.

■ Against the Bucs quarterback **Kenji Bahar** was 15-of-25 for 155 yards and three touchdowns -which matched a season-high. Bahar now has 2,135 passing yards this season, which ninth most in school history but 297 yards away from the top spot.

■ Monmouth holds the Big South's longest active scoring streak at 46 games just one ahead of KSU, the 10th longest streak in league history.

■ **Devell Jones** currently has eight rushing touchdowns on the season and 19 in his career. His 19 career rushing TDs is seventh most in MU history.

■ **Pete Guerriero** has recorded 11 rushing touchdowns in eight career home games. He ranks ninth all-time with 15 career touchdowns and ninth in program history with 1,764 career rushing yards. He has now rushed for over 100 yards 10 times in his career (18 games); which puts him tied for third all-time with former Hawk Lavon Chaney and one behind Julian Hayes for a tie for second.

■ **Juwon Farri** had his fifth 100+ yard rushing day against CSU, his fourth in the last five games. Farri was recently added to the Jerry Rice Award Watch list; the second straight year and third time a MU back has been named to the watch list.

■ **Reggie White Jr.** has caught a pass in 42 of 43 career games (Coastal '15). His 10 100-yard receiving days is second most all-time at MU trailing only **Miles Austin III**, who finished his career with 12.

■ White Jr. caught a touchdown for the fifth consecutive game, scoring on an 18-yard pass in the fourth quarter. White Jr. is 66 yards away from setting the Big South all-time receiving yards record.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

■ Monmouth sophomore **Justin Terry** recorded his first career interception and his team leading 10th pass defended. Senior **Tymere Berry**, who leads the team in tackles with 46 is right behind him with nine PD.

■ Monmouth's defense has not allowed an individual 100-yard back since last year's NCAA Playoff game against Northern Iowa.

■ The Hawks are allowing 106.3 rushing yards per contest in 2018, which ranks them first in the Big South and 13th among all 125 FCS Teams.

■ The Monmouth defense allowed just three points, the least amount since a 2006 season. In the last two weeks, the MU defense has allowed just 10 total points and one touchdown.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

■ **Vinny Grasso** currently has 251 punt return yards, needing just seven yards for the most in a single season in school history.

■ Grasso currently ranks 10 in the NCAA in combined kick returns, totaling 554 yards on kickoff and punt returns. His 11.4 PR average is 18th nationally.

■ Monmouth continued its streak of blocked kicks with **Kahari Scarlett** getting a piece of a CSU punt in the third quarter. Monmouth has blocked six total kicks (4 PKs, 2 punts) in 2018.

■ Junior placekicker **Matt Mosquera** has made his last 35 extra points, including 31-31 this year. He tied a Monmouth record with three successful field goals against the Bucs. He is 4-for-4 in kicks of 40+ yards in 2018.

WEST LONG BRANCH, NJ - Behind two 100-yard rushers, three touchdown passes from quarterback Kenji Bahar, and a dominant defensive performance, the Monmouth University football team defeated Charleston Southern on Saturday afternoon, 37-3.

Sophomore running back Pete Guerriero piled up 117 rushing yards and a touchdown, while freshman running back Juwon Farri added 100 yards on 21 carries. Sophomore wide receiver Terrance Green Jr. registered a career high six catches for 63 yards and a touchdown in the win. In addition to his three touchdown passes, Bahar compiled 52 rushing yards for a total of 207 yards in the contest. Senior wide receiver Reggie White Jr. caught a touchdown for the fifth consecutive game, scoring on an 18-yard pass in the fourth quarter. The Hawks defense allowed its fewest points in a single game since 2006, when the Blue & White earned a 19-0 victory over Albany to win the NEC Championship.

Junior kicker Matt Mosquera made all three of his field goal attempts, including a 44-yarder in the second quarter. Monmouth is now 10-0 in the new Kessler Stadium dating back to last year, and the team has won five straight games.

NOTES

■ Monmouth had a turnover on downs and a fumble lost on its first two possessions, but a nine-play, 62-yard drive gave it a 7-0 lead in the first quarter. The Hawks racked up 57 yards on the ground, including an eight-yard Guerriero touchdown run up the middle.

■ After the Hawks forced a three-and-out to open the second quarter, the offense used a 14-play, 87-yard drive to take a 14-0 advantage. On a third-and-goal from the six-yard line, Bahar tossed a touchdown to senior Vinny Grasso on a slant.

■ The Hawks gained 43 yards on six straight run plays after the turnover. After catching a 10-yard pass to get down to CSU's 23, Greene Jr. caught a wide-open 17-yard touchdown pass from Bahar to give Monmouth the 21-0 lead.

NUMBERS CRUNCH

■ Juwon Farri registered his fifth 100-yard game of the season. The rookie has 858 rushing yards and six touchdowns in his first career nine games.

■ Guerriero registered his fourth 100-yard game in just seven contests this year. The sophomore has 15 rushing touchdowns in 18 career games.

■ It was the first time Monmouth had two 100-yard rushers since October 21, 2017. Guerriero had 162 and sophomore Eric Zokouri had 193 in the win over Liberty last year.

■ Bahar's three touchdown passes ties a season high. He increases his career totals to 5,467 passing yards (4th all-time) and 35 passing touchdowns (5th all-time).

The only head coach in the history of football at Monmouth, Kevin Callahan has developed a winning tradition in West Long Branch. Callahan, whose 151 wins is 9th among active coaches at the FCS level, has guided a once fledgling non-scholarship program to the Big South Conference and its first NCAA playoff berth in 2017.

Beginning his 26th season at the helm of the Hawks, Callahan has amassed a 151-120 record while his teams have captured five conference titles. Along the way, Monmouth has been ranked among the top 20 in total offense on two occasions and in total defense five times. Meanwhile, over 135 players have earned conference recognition, while numerous Hawks have earned regional and national honors. Regarded as an outstanding coach by his peers, Callahan served as the President of the FCS Football Coaches Committee in 2007-08 and served a 10-year term as a member of the committee. Under his watch, 11 former Hawks have earned spots on NFL rosters, including Super Bowl Champion Chris Hogan and Miles Austin who was an All-Pro wide receiver for the Dallas Cowboys.

Academically, Callahan's squads have consistently performed at a high level. Ten players have been named to the prestigious FCS ADA Academic All-Star team (average of 55 FCS players selected per season) a total 13 times. Monmouth has had at least one representative on the Capital One Academic All-District Team in 15 of the last 16 seasons, including three-time selection Joe Johnson who was also a two-time Big South All-Academic Team member. Monmouth has ranked either first or second among Big South schools in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last three seasons that data has been available.

The Hawks took another huge step in 2017, opening the brand new 16 million dollar Kessler Stadium, earning its first national ranking and its first NCAA Playoff berth. Callahan guided the Hawks to a 9-3 overall record, including a 4-1 mark in the Big South, and faced Northern Iowa in the NCAA First Round. In addition to going 5-0 at home, the Hawks strung together a seven-game win streak heading into the final game of the regular season. For his efforts, Callahan finished 10th in the voting for the Eddie Robinson Award, handed out to the nation's top FCS Coach. Under his tutelage, Mike Basile became the most decorated player in Monmouth history, earning consensus All-America honors including First Team accolades from the Associated Press. Basile, who was named as the FCS's top defensive back by the FCS ADA, led nine players on All-Big South teams, including freshman Pete Guerriero who was a first team selection at both running back and kick returner. Guerriero was the Big South's Co-Freshman of the Year and was named to two All-American teams.

The honors didn't stop there for Basile and Guerriero, with each being named as finalists for national awards, with the former earning a sixth place finish in the voting for the Buck Buchanan Award (Nation's top defensive player). All-

American offensive lineman Alex Thompson became the latest Hawk in the National Football League after agreeing to a free agent deal with the Baltimore Ravens in April.

Prior to accepting the head coaching position at Monmouth in August of 1992, Callahan served as assistant coach at Colgate University for eight seasons. While with the Raiders, Callahan served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, while tutoring the linebackers and secondary. Callahan groomed his defensive coordinating skills at Wagner College from 1981 to 1983.

In 1980, Callahan served as an assistant coach prior to accepting the head coaching position at Monmouth in August of 1992, Callahan served as assistant coach at Colgate University for eight seasons. While with the Raiders, Callahan served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, while tutoring the linebackers and secondary. Callahan groomed his defensive coordinating skills at Wagner College from 1981 to 1983. In 1980, Callahan served as an assistant coach under Frank Maloney at Syracuse University. He served as the assistant offensive backfield coach for the Orangemen.

A native of Elmira, N.Y., Callahan began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for three seasons at the University of Albany from 1977 to 1979. Callahan was a two-year standout defensive back at the University of Rochester. He earned a bachelor's degree in history from Rochester in 1977.

Callahan and his wife, Ann Marie, reside in Spring Lake Heights. They have two children, Kevin Jr. and Julia. His son Kevin Jr is the running backs coach at Lafayette College.

THE HAWKS AT KESSLER STADIUM

Construction began on the Kessler Stadium project prior to the start of the 2016 football season, with the old structure being completely removed days after Monmouth's last home game on Oct. 29. The new stadium features more than 4,200 seats, including 800 chair-back seats, and stretches from endzone to endzone. The facility includes full concourse with concession stands and bathrooms, a state-of-the-art press box, multimedia booths, coaches' booths and a ticket office.

For the opening of the Monmouth Hawks' first football season in 1993, a 3,000-seat grandstand with press box was built. Alumni John and Henni Kantor Kessler, class of 1969 and 1968, respectively, donated \$250,000 toward construction. Kessler Field was built in 1993 and opened for the Hawks' inaugural season. On September 25, 1993, the first-ever game was played at Kessler Field as the Hawks hosted Sacred Heart University. Incidentally, the Pioneers won the coin toss and elected to receive the ball, which was kicked off by Randy Brewster at 1:06 p.m. The Hawks' first offensive play was a reverse, resulting in a four-yard gain by William Holder. Sacred Heart posted a 12-0 shutout in the contest.

Although the facility officially seats 4,600 fans, a record crowd of 6,233 packed Kessler Field on Homecoming Weekend in 1993. The spectators witnessed a barnburner as the Hawks fell to Hartwick, 17-13. On December 2, 2007 Kessler Field hosted the Inaugural Gridiron Classic.

HENNI KANTOR KESSLER & JOHN H. KESSLER

This season will mark the second season of football in Henni Kantor Kessler & John H. Kessler Stadium. On July 10, 2017 the Kesslers announced a seven-figure gift to name Monmouth's brand new stadium. The Kesslers were members of the original "Touchdown Club," which helped bring football to the school back in 1992. Henni and John pledged the first gift to get the original Kessler Field built, and saw more than 350,000 fans support 109 football games over the first 24 years of the program. The Kesslers have been involved with Monmouth University since arriving on campus as students. Both Henni and John have a long history with Hawk athletics, Henni serving as captain of the cheerleading team while John played baseball for the Blue & White. Henni is a former trustee and member of the University's Society of Trustees, while John is a trustee emeritus.

HAWKS PLACE EIGHT ON PRESEASON BIG SOUTH TEAMS

Eight players were named to a total of nine preseason all-conference positions, including two of Monmouth's starting offensive linemen. Fifth-year seniors **Russ Clayton**, **Ryan Wetzel** and **Reggie White Jr.** and senior **Jake Powell** and junior **Tymere Berry** earned all-conference nods. Sophomore running back **Pete Guerriero** was named preseason All-Big South as both a running back and at kick returner, positions that he was a first team honoree at the end of 2017. Additionally, redshirt junior quarterback **Kenji Bahar** and senior linebacker **Diego Zubieta** were honorable mention selections.

REGGIE WHITE JR NAMED STATS FCS ALL-AMERICAN

Fifth-year senior **Reggie White Jr.** was recently named to the FCS STATS Preseason All-American Third Team. White Jr. is the conference's top returning wide receiver in the conference in every receiving category, including yards, yards per game, receptions and finished 2018 tied for third in touchdowns. White Jr. finished with three 100-yard games and caught at least two passes in every contest. He currently ranks third in career receptions, fourth in reception yardage and touchdowns. He was recently added to the **Reeses 2019 Senior Bowl Watch List**, another first for the MU program.

JUWON FARRI EARNS BIG SOUTH FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS

- Farri broke out in his first collegiate game, rushing 13 times for 111 yards against FBS foe Eastern Michigan.
- The Northwest High School (MD) product averaged a whopping 8.5 yards per rush against what is considered one of the best defensive fronts in the Mid-American Conference.
- In the fourth quarter, facing a third and four from the EMU 38 the true freshman burst up the middle of the line of scrimmage, broke a tackle and raced to the endzone for his first collegiate TD.
- Farri had five rushes of nine or more yards and also had one reception in the contest.

- He is the third Hawk running back to earn FOTW honors in the past two years, with Pete Guerriero and Eric Zokouri earning the honor last season.

GUERRIERO IN ELITE COMPANY

Only four players in Monmouth football history have rushed for 200 yards in a single game. All-American David Sinesi achieved the feat four times (including the MU record 247 yards against St. Francis in 2008) while Pete Guerriero joins Jim Varick (94) and Chris Reed (1998) as running backs to eclipse the mark once in their careers.

GUERRIERO EARNS BIG SOUTH PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- Guerriero had a career day for the Blue & White, rushing for a personal best 209 yards on 21 carries with a career-high three touchdowns.
- Guerriero, who averaged just under 10 yards per run, tore off touchdown runs of 28 and 67 yards and had six runs of 10 yards or more.
- The sophomore had just one run for negative yardage on 21 carries and finished the day with 226 all-purpose yards.
- In the first half alone, he racked up 145 yards and two touchdowns on just 12 carries (12.1 average).
- He jumped Mike Medrano and Jim Varick in the win against the Pirates, and his 1,304 career rushing yards ranks 11th in program history.
- Guerriero was also an honorable mention for STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Week. He has won three Big South Weekly Awards in two seasons.

HAWKS MAKE HISTORY AGAINST PIRATES

Monmouth is the first team in Big South history to have a 300-yard passer and 200-yard rusher in the same game when the Hawks achieved the feat against future Big South member Hampton last Saturday. Quarterback Kenji Bahar passed for 326 yards and three touchdowns, while Pete Guerriero ran for 209 yards and three scores. It was also the first time in school history that MU had a 200-yard rusher and a 300-yard passer.

GRASSO SETS MONMOUTH MARK FOR APY

Against Wagner, Monmouth senior wideout **Vinny Grasso** crushed the Monmouth all-purpose yard record with 306, surpassing Pete Guerriero's mark of 263 set against Lehigh last season. Grasso had a career-high 147 yards in kickoff returns, a season high 63 yards in punt returns, three receptions for 58 yards and ran the ball twice for 38 yards. He recorded a punt return for 49 yards and had a pair of kickoff returns that were 35+ yards.

BLOCKING EVERYTHING UNDER THE SUN

Justin Terry became the first Hawk in seven years, and just the fifth Hawk overall, to return a blocked extra point for a score on Saturday. After the Bison took a 6-0 lead on a long screen pass, senior **Gerron Pendarvis** blocked the Bucknell extra point attempt and Terry scooped it up and returned it 98 yards for a touchdown. It was the first time since the 2011 season that Monmouth has returned a blocked extra point for points. The Hawks have blocked four kicks in 2018 which is 7th in the NCAA, with Pendarvis blocking two of them.
