THE KENNESAW STATE GAME

Wofford is in the NCAA FCS Playoffs for the third-straight season ... The Terriers are one of seven teams to make the last three playoff fields ... In the opening round, the Terriers defeated Elon 19-7 at Gibbs Stadium to advance to the second round ... Wofford is 9-3 overall and was 6-2 in the Southern Conference ... Wofford shared the SoCon Championship and earned the automatic bid, marking the sixth league title in school history ... Kennesaw State is 10-1 overall and were 5-0 in the Big South to win the league title ... As the #4 overall seed in the playoffs, they had a bye last weekend ... Wofford is ranked 13th in the STATS FCS poll and 12th in the FCS Coaches poll ... Kennesaw State is ranked second in both the STATS FCS poll and the FCS Coaches poll.

TERRIER TOP NOTES

Here are the top notes of interest heading into the NCAA Playoff game at Kennesaw State:

- Wofford won the 2018 Southern Conference Championship, the sixth overall and first time winning back-to-back.
- Josh Conklin took over as head coach of the Terriers and earned a win in his first two games.
- The Terriers are fourth in the nation with 331.5 rushing yards per game, nearly 90 yards per game more than in 2017.
- Wofford is 16th in the nation in total defense and 24th in the nation in total offense.
- Players received a total of eleven All-Southern Conference honors, with five on the first team.
- Miles Brown was named Preseason All-American and to the initial Buck Buchanan Award Watch List.
- Andre Stoddard is the third-leading rusher in the SoCon (82.9 ypg) and is a Preseason All-American.

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT ...

KSU'S LAST GAME

A match-up of two FCS top 10 teams playing the first game at SunTrust Park was historic in its own right. However, No. 2 Kennesaw State (10-1) and No. 6 Jacksonville State (8-3) treated the 16,949 fans in attendance to a record-breaking performance during a 60-52 five-overtime thriller that ended with sophomore linebacker Bryson Armstrong intercepting a pass in the end zone and setting off a wild celebration by the Owls and their fans.

In a game in which the two teams combined for 944 total yards and 15 touchdowns, running back Darnell Holland capped the scoring with a 13-yard run. Burks and wide receiver Justin Sumpter connected for the 2-point conversion that gave KSU the lead.

The Owls kept alive their winning drive by converting a fourth-and six from the JSU 21-yard on an 11-yard run by Burks. Two plays later, Holland capped the drive with his second rushing score of the game. However, the Gamecocks had one more possession to try and extend the game, but Armstrong's interception on a third-and-11 play ended the titanic contest that lasted four hours and 12 minutes.

Kennesaw State came through with a late score in the fourth quarter to send the game to overtime when Burks scored from a yard out and Justin Thompson's extra point tied the score, 24-24, with 4:52 remaining. The drive was kept alive by a circus catch on the sideline by Sumpter in which he was initially ruled out of bounds before replay overruled the call and gave the Owls a first down at the Jacksonville State 20-yard line. The completion came on a fourth-and-10 play from the JSU 43-yard line.

Burks led the Owls with three rushing scores and two touchdown passes, while Holland and TJ Reed each scored twice.

Both teams came through under pressure as Jacksonville State converted four of five fourth-down conversions and Kennesaw State was three of four. The Gamecocks finished with 519 total yards (417 passing, 102 rushing), while the Owls totaled 425 yards (351 rushing, 74 passing). Kennesaw State scored eight touchdowns, while Jacksonville had seven. The two teams combined for nine rushing scores and six passing touchdowns, and 10 different players scored.

FUTURE OPPONENTS

Looking ahead a few years, Wofford and Kennesaw State will begin a home-and-home series in 2021.

TOP 25 MATCH-UPS

Since moving to the NCAA FCS in 1997, Wofford is 30-41 against teams ranked in the top 25. However, since 2002 the Terriers mark is 30-30. The last time Wofford played a team in the top 5 was on December 9, 2017 against #4 North Dakota State (42-10) in the quarterfinals. The last time the Terriers faced a team ranked #2 was also in the playoffs, a 28-21 loss to Northern lowa (12/3/2011).

COMMON OPPONENTS

Kennesaw State and Wofford have three opponents in common this season. Against Presbyterian College, Wofford (45-21) and Kennesaw State (56-0) both had wins. In games against Gardner-Webb, the Terriers won 45-14 and the Owls had a 56-17 victory. Against Samford, Kennesaw State (24-10) earned a win while Wofford (35-20) had a loss.

PEACH STATE TERRIERS

Wofford has 13 players on the roster from the state of Georgia, second only to South Carolina (36). Included in the 13 are starters John Beckley (Atlanta), Jireh Wilson (Calhoun), Devin Watson (Gainesville), Joe Newman (Riverdale), and Ryan Lovelace (Sugar Hill).

WOFFORD IN THE PLAYOFFS

The 2018 season marks the ninth appearance in the NCAA FCS Playoffs for the Terriers. In 2003, Wofford defeated North Carolina A&T 31-10 in the first round at Gibbs Stadium. In the second round, Wofford won 34-17 over Western Kentucky at Gibbs Stadium. Against Delaware in the semifinals, the Terriers were defeated 24-9. In the 2007 season, Wofford had a win at Montana and loss to Richmond. The Terriers were sent on the road in 2008 to face #1 James Madison and were defeated 38-35. In 2010, the Terriers won at Jacksonville State before falling at home to Georgia Southern in the quarterfinals. In 2011, Wofford was defeated at UNI. A home win in 2012 against New Hampshire and was followed by a loss at North Dakota State. In 2016, Wofford had wins over Charleston Southern and The Citadel before a double overtime loss at Youngstown State. During the 2017 postseason, Wofford had a win over Furman and loss at North Dakota State in 2017. Wofford is 9-8 overall in the playoffs after a win over Elon in 2018

ABOUT WOFFORI

At quarterback, Joe Newman and Miller Mosley will both see action ... Both quarterbacks saw time last season but neither started a game until Newman got the nod in the season opener against The Citadel ... Newman is 80-of-132 passing with seven touchdowns and he has 555 rushing yards, along with five rushing touchdowns ... Mosley is 16-of-33 passing and has run for 246 yards and two touchdowns ... Fullback Andre Stoddard leads the team with 912 rushing yards and eleven touchdowns on 154 carries ... Halfback Lennox McAfee has 109 carries for 826 yards and eight touchdowns, while Blake Morgan has 34 carries for 221 yards ... Leading receiver Jason Hill has 26 catches for 278 yards and two touchdowns ... Linebacker Jireh Wilson leads the team with 57 tackles, while linebacker T.J. Neal and defensive lineman Miles Brown have 4.0 sacks to lead the squad ... Miles Brown has a team-high 7.5 tackles for loss, along with two forced fumbles and 4.0 sacks ... Cornerback George Gbesee and safety Mason Alstatt have three interceptions each, while linebacker Weston Rountree and safety JoJo Tillery have two interceptions each ... Luke Carter is 11-of-15 on field goals and has a 44.9 average on punts.

INJURY REPORT

RB Kent Phelps (shoulder), DB Zy Abercrombie (knee), WR Cole Cleary (ankle), DL Mikel Horton (arm), QB Jimmy Weirick (knee) and RB Blake Morgan (knee) will miss the season due to injury.

ANOTHER SOCON TITLE

Wofford posted a 6-2 record in conference play, tied with ETSU and Furman. This secured a share of the Southern Conference Championship. The automatic bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs went to Wofford on a tiebreaker of defensive points allowed as Wofford allowed only 175, while Furman (189) and ETSU (217) gave up more. Wofford won the title for the sixth time (2003, 2007, 2010, 2012, 201, and 2018) and for the first time had back-to-back championships.

SENIOR'S LAST LAP

The Presbyterian game marked the final regular season home contest for 17 Wofford seniors. The group includes: Spencer Alverson, Miles Brown, Cole Cleary, Ross Hammond, Armani Helligar, Billy Hinton, Campbell Jackson, Domo Lemon, Graham Massey, Lennox McAfee, Matt McQuilla, Weston Rountree, Andre Stoddard, JoJo Tillery, Tyler Traynham, Devin Watson and Brandon Zamary. In the past four years they have a 34-16 overall record and won the 2017 and 2018 Southern Conference Championships, along with NCAA FCS Playoff appearances in 2016, 2017 and 2018.

MIKE AYERS FIELD AT GIBBS STADIUM

Prior to the Mercer game, Wofford unveiled a new gateway field entrance and officially named the field at Gibbs Stadium in honor of Coach Mike Ayers. For the past 30 years, Ayers expected Terrier toughness on the field and Terrier determination in the classroom. He retired at the end of the 2017 season with a 207-137-1 overall record at Wofford.

A GOOD START FOR CONKLIN

There were 23 coaching changes at the FCS level for the 2018 season. Of those coaches, only three started their new positions at 2-0. Joining Josh Conklin were Bobby Hauck (Montana) and Scott Abell (Davidson). Wofford is now 9-3, while Davidson was 6-5 and Montana was 6-5. Randy Sanders (ETSU) had his team finish 8-4. The only new head coaches to reach the NCAA FCS Playoffs were Conklin, Sanders and Eric Morris (Incarnate Word) and Conklin is the only one to advance to the second round.

WINNING SEASONS

With a 9-3 mark so far in 2018, Wofford has a winning record for the third straight season and

the 16th time in the last twenty years. The Terriers were 5-6 in 2013, one game under the .500 mark, but rebounded with a 6-5 record in 2014. Wofford was 5-6 in 2015, but were 10-4 in 2016 and then 10-3 in 2017.

WOFFORD'S LAST GAME

Wofford defeated Elon 19-7 at Gibbs Stadium on Saturday afternoon in the opening round of the NCAA FCS Playoffs. The Phoenix had a 7-6 lead at the half, but the Terriers held Elon scoreless in the second half and scored three times for the win. Wofford was able to come up with two turnovers in the second half. Despite reaching the red zone six times, the Terriers scored only one touchdown and added four field goals. Wofford is 9-3 overall and Elon finishes the year at 6-5. The Terriers were led by Nathan Walker with 90 rushing yards and a touchdown, while Lennox McAfee added 63 rushing yards. Luke Carter was 4-of-5 on field goals in the contest. Elon was led by Daniel Thompson with 20-of-32 passing for 209 yards.

Wofford had 364 total yards, with 344 rushing yards. Elon had 260 total yards, 209 of which were passing. Wofford had 19 first downs, while Elon had 17. Wofford was 3-of-13 on third downs and 2-of-2 on fourth down. Elon was 8-of-13 on third down and 0-of-3 on fourth down. Wofford was called for four penalties to one for Elon. Wofford had a 37:11 to 22:49 time of possession advantage.

WOFFORD/ELON GAME NOTES

In a series that dates to 1921, Wofford has a 27-11 lead over Elon ... Mason Alstatt had his third interception of the season and fifth of his career in the third quarter ... Wofford was 6-0 at home this season ... Luke Carter made a career-high four field goals in the game. He also tied the school record for field goals in a game with Brett Schulman (vs. Elon, 1985) ... Nathan Walker's touchdown in the third quarter was the third of his career ... Jireh Wilson led the team in tackles with seven, including two for a loss ... Miller Mosley and Joe Newman combined for a season-low 8 passing attempts for a season-low 20 yards ... Game captains were Justus Basinger, Blake Jeresaty, Lennox McAfee, and Jireh Wilson.

2018 ALL-SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

The Southern Conference announced the 2018 football postseason awards on November 20. Overall, Wofford had eleven players earn first or second team honors from the coaches or media. The eleven Terriers are two more than the 2017 season. Earning first team honors from the Southern Conference Coaches were OL Justus Basinger, DL Miles Brown, and RB Andre Stoddard. Second team honors went to P Luke Carter, RB Lennox McAfee, DL Thad Mangum and DB JoJo Tillery.

In the Southern Conference Sports Media Association voting, first team honors went to OL Justus Basinger, DL Miles Brown, DB George Gbesee, OL Michael Ralph and RB Andre Stoddard. Second team recognition went to OL Josh Burger, OL Blake Jeresaty and P Luke Carter.

ETSU had a league-high 14 all-conference coaches selections, while Samford had eleven and Furman and The Citadel had ten each. Chattanooga followed with nine and Wofford had seven. In the media voting, ETSU had eleven selections and a league-best six on the first team. Wofford was second with eight overall honors by the media, with five on the first team.

PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL

In the 2018 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, the conference's nine head coaches and the media picked Samford to win the league. The coaches have Wofford coming in second, while the media picked the Terriers to finish third.

linebacker DT Wilson. Second team selections included safety Mason Alstatt, offensive lineman Justus Basinger, punter Luke Carter and defensive lineman Mikel Horton.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

Wofford defensive lineman Miles Brown and fullback Andre Stoddard were named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Brown was selected to the first team, while Stoddard earned a spot on the third team. Brown, a senior from Cheverly, Maryland, started all 13 games last season and had 44 total tackles while leading the team in sacks and tackles for loss. He was first team All-Southern Conference last season and a third team STATS All-American. Brown has also received preseason All-America honors from HEROES and Athlon.

Stoddard, a senior from Greenville, S.C., led the team in 2017 with 825 rushing yards on 176 carries and tied for the SoCon lead in scoring with 90 points. He was named first team All-Southern Conference by the media and second team by the coaches last season. A total of nine players from the Southern Conference were selected. Samford and Western Carolina had three players each named, while Wofford had two and The Citadel had one selected.

NO PLAYER OF THE WEEK?

For the first time since 2009, Wofford did not have a single Southern Conference Player of the Week. This was despite the fact that the team was 6-2 in the SoCon and won the championship. Last year the Terriers had eight Player of the Week awards as the team won the league title.

THE 2018 RETURNERS

Wofford welcomes back eleven starters from the 2017 season. On offense, the five players include offensive lineman Michael Ralph, halfbacks Blake Morgan and Lennox McAfee, along with fullback Andre Stoddard and wide receiver Jason Hill. On defense, the six returners are defensive linemen Miles Brown and Mikel Horton, cornerbacks Devin Watson and George Gbesee, linebacker Datavious Wilson and safety Mason Alstatt. In addition, punter/kicker Luke Carter and long snapper Ross Hammond return. An additional nine players who started at least one game also return.

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Blake Jeresaty has been named to the 2018 Google Cloud Academic All-District Football Team, selected by CoSIDA, recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom. Jeresaty is an offensive lineman from Charleston, South Carolina. He has started all ten games this season at center and has made 15 career starts in 21 games played. He is part of an offensive line that is fifth in the nation in rushing yards per game at 330.5 and is also fifth in the nation in fewest sacks allowed. He has been named to the Southern Conference

REACHING NINE WINS

Wofford had a 10-3 record last season and is 9-3 so far in 2018. This is only the 14th time in school history the Terriers reached nine or more wins. Nine of those seasons have been since 2002 (2002, 2003, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2012, 2016, 2017 and 2018). Wofford also had ten wins in 2010 and 2016, with eleven victories in 1949 and 1970 and a school record 12 wins in 2003.

FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the season opener against The Citadel in 2018, QB Joe Newman, OL Liam Ronan, OL Josh Burger, DL Thad Mangum, and LB John Beckley made their first career starts. In comparision, in 2017 ten players started their first game in the season opener. OL Zak Kurz (Mercer), WR T.J. Luther (GWU), DL Brandon Zamary (GWU), DL Austin Lufkin (Wyoming), LB Brandon Brown (WCU), RB Ryan Lovelace (Mercer), WR Armani Helligar (VMI), RB Nathan Walker (PC) and D'mauriae VanCleave (PC) also made first career starts this season.

VETERAN CAREER GAMES PLAYED/STARTS

The most veteran players on the team this year are Ross Hammond, JoJo Tillery and Domo Lemon who have played in all 49 games of their careers. Also playing in over 40 career games are Miles Brown (48), Lennox McAfee (44), Weston Rountree (45), Andre Stoddard (41) and Devin Watson (45). Brown leads the team with 47 career starts, followed by DT Wilson (37), Devin Watson (32), Jason Hill (35) and George Gbesee (28).

TRUE FRESHMEN ON THE FIELD

In 2018, true freshmen on the field in the opener against The Citadel included WR T.J. Luther, LB T.J. Neal, RB D'mauriae VanCleave, RB Nathan Walker and DB Isaiah Walker. With the new redshirt rules, players can see action in up to four games in 2018 and keep the redshirt.

2018 RECRUITING CLASS

Wofford welcomed a total of 16 student-athletes in the 2018 recruiting class. The class includes eight players on defense and eight players on offense. The student-athletes are from eight different states, including five from South Carolina, four from Florida and two from Georgia. On defense, the seven players include four linebackers, two linemen and one defensive back. On offense, the ten players include three offensive linemen, two running backs, two wide receivers, and one quarterback. They were joined by ten walk-ons for a total of 26 newcomers.

DEEP THOUGHTS ...

Wofford is one of 25 teams that has three or fewer losses at the FCS level ... By quarter, the Terriers are outscoring opponents in all four quarters with the biggest difference in the second quarter (128-72) ... Of the 60 scoring drives, 16 were for 10 or more plays, while 27 covered 70 yards or more and 15 took over five minutes off the clock ... Of the 154 carries by Andre Stoddard, 53 have been for a first down or touchdown ... Of the 104 receptions this season, 56 have been for a first down or a touchdown ... Wofford has 15 rushes on fourth down and has converted eight of them into first downs ... The Terriers have an average start of the 30.7 yard line, while opponents had a 28.4 yard line average start ... Jason Hill completed a pass at Gardner-Webb (and at Samford), joining his father, Jason (1986-88), as Terriers to complete passes. The only other known father/son duo to complete passes at Wofford were Charlie Bradshaw (1956-58) and Charlie Bradshaw, Jr. (1979-82).

PLAYER INTEREST NOTES

S Devin Watson is cousins with Houston Texans QB Deshaun Watson, however they were never on the field at the same time in Clemson game in 2015 ... CB George Gbesee (Ghana) is the lone foreign born players on the roster ... S Graham Massey's twin brother Reed is an infielder on the Wofford baseball team ... LB Rob Saylor's twin sister plays lacrosse at Wofford ... K Luke Carter's father is the president of Francis Marion University ... LS Ross Hammond's father is serving as South Carolina Secretary of State ... DL Miles Brown went to high school at Sidwell Friends, where he was classmates with former President Obama's daughters ... WR TJ Luther's high school coach was Wofford alum Jordan Ingman who played football from 2007-10 for the Terriers ... DL Elijah Ball's brother played at Alabama from 2012-16 ... WR Landon Parker's brother is currently the punter at Duke and his father punted for the Denver Broncos.

WOFFORD 100-YARD RUSHERS

Wofford began 2016 with a 100-yard game from Will Gay against Tennessee Tech and had a 100-yard rusher in eleven of the 14 games. Wofford had a 100-yard rusher in four of 13 games in 2017

with Blake Morgan, Andre Stoddard (2) and Joe Newman reaching the mark. In 2018, Wofford had a pair of 100-yard rushers (Andre Stoddard and Lennox McAfee) at Gardner-Webb and then added a pair of 100-yard rushers at Chattanooga (Andre Stoddard and Joe Newman). Lennox McAfee had over 100 yards against ETSU, while Andre Stoddard added 119 yards against Mercer.

OPPONENT 100-YARD RUSHERS

A big part of the defense is not allowing an opponent to have a 100+ yard rusher. The Terriers went 17 games without allowing a 100+ rusher (last 2 games in 2013, 11 games in 2014, first four games in 2015). They then went an additional 19 games without a 100+ rusher. The 200+ rushing yards by Jody Webb were the most allowed since 2009. Wofford didn't allow a 100+ rusher in 2017. Twice in 2018 there have been 100+ yard rushers against the Terriers.

UNDER 100 YARDS RUSHING

In nine of the 14 games in 2016, the Terriers held opponents to under 100 rushing yards. Wofford started 2016 by holding Tennessee Tech to 41 rushing yards and then Ole Miss ran for 174 yards. Youngstown State had 240 in the playoffs, the most by an opponent that season. Wofford held 2017 opponents to under 100 yards rushing six times (Gardner-Webb 99, Samford 10, ETSU 15, Chattanooga 99, VMI 80, and Furman 52). In 2018, VMI, Wyoming, Gardner-Webb, Chattanooga, ETSU, Samford and Elon have been held to under 100 rushing yards.

REACHING 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Lennox McAfee reached the 1,000 career rushing yard mark in the NCAA FCS Playoff game against Furman (12/2/17). Andre Stoddard had 37 yards in the 2018 season opener against The Citadel, putting him over the mark. Blake Morgan reached the mark with a 14-yard run at Gardner-Webb. Joe Newman is nearing the mark with 936 career rushing yards.

NEARING THE 2,000 CAREER RUSHING MARK

Since passing the 1,000 rushing yard mark, seniors Lennox McAfee (1898) and Andre Stoddard (1884) have steadily been climbing towards the 2,000 yard mark. There have only been 16 Terriers in school history to reach the 2,000 mark.

PUTTING UP SOME YARDS

Twice so far this season the Wofford offense has put up more than 600 yards of total offense in a game. There have only been eight games with more than 600 yards in school history.

A LITTLE MORE PASSING

In 2012, Wofford ran the ball almost 90% of the time. Since then, the Terriers have relied a little less on the run in the option offense. Of the 814 plays in 2017, 658 were rushes with 156 passes for an 81.1% run offense.

LESS PASSING, MORE WINS

Since the start of the 2010 season, the Terriers have been most successful when they throw the ball ten times or less in a game. With ten or fewer attempts, Wofford is 43-19 overall. With eleven or more passes per game, Wofford is 29-18 overall.

NEWMAN WITH THE PASS

Junior quarterback Joe Newman has thrown for 917 yards so far this season. That marks the fourth-most by a Wofford quarterback in the last 17 seasons. His 80 completions this year rank 7th on the school single season list.

HILL WITH THE CATCH

Junior wide receiver Jason Hill is leading the team in receptions this season with 26 for 278 yards. The 26 receptions are the most since Brenton Bersin also had 26 in the 2011 season.

CARTER WITH THE KICK

Junior kicker/punter Luke Carter is making his mark on the record books at Wofford. This season he is 11-of-15 on field goal attempts and 47-of-47 on extra points. Against Elon (11/24) in the playoffs he tied the school record for field goals in a game with four. His 11 made field goals are tied for fifth in school history, and his 22 career field goals made are ranked sixth. With his 47 made PATs this year, he has set a new school mark for consecutive made PATs in a season. He has also made all 89 career PAT attempts, shattering the previous school mark of 54 straight. With 80 points this year, he is fourth in school history and his 155 career points is ranked ninth among the kickers.

THE RED ZONE

The Wofford red zone offense was 44-of-48 overall with 33 touchdowns and 11 field goals for a 91.7% success rate which is third in the nation. The red zone defense is impressive as well, ranking fourth in the Southern Conference and 67th in the nation at 80.9%. The Terriers opponents were 38-of-47 in the red zone with 29 touchdowns and nine field goals. So far in 2018, Wofford is 38-of-47 in the red zone (81.0%) and opponents are 25-of-32 (78.0%).

THE BIG PLAY IS BACK

In 2017, the big play (20+ rushing and receiving; 30+ return) was a key part of the Wofford offense, with 67 total big plays. So far in 2018, the Terriers have 63 big plays which included eleven each against VMI and Gardner-Webb. Twelve of the 58 big plays have been for 50 or more yards. Lennox McAfee leads the team with twelve big plays, followed by T.J. Luther with ten and Andre Stoddard with eight big plays. Twenty different player have plays of 20 or more yards.

COACHING CHANGES

Following the retirement of Mike Ayers after 30 seasons, there were numerous changes on the staff. Head Coach Josh Conklin added to the staff defensive coorindator Sam Siefkes, along with llir Emini (safeties), Trey Johnson (offensive line), Allen Smith (defensive line), and Trey McCray (outside linebackers). Wade Lang returns as offensive coordinator in his 31st season on staff, while Freddie Brown (wide receivers), BJ Connolly (tight ends), Dane Romero (running backs) and Rob Greene (cornerbacks) also remain.

POLL POSITIONS

In the 2016 preseason polls, Wofford received votes in both polls. Following the win over Chattanooga, Wofford returned to the top 25 on November 14, sitting at #19 in the FCS Coaches poll and #20 in the STATS FCS poll. In the final poll, Wofford was #11 in the Coaches Poll and #9 in the STATS poll. The Terriers began the 2017 season ranked #11 in both polls and finished 6th (STATS) and 7th (Coaches). The highest ranking ever for the Terriers was second (2003 and 2004).

DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense is a true team effort with contributions from numerous players this season. Overall, 16 players have recorded 20 or more tackles. Twenty-three players had at least a share of a tackle for loss, while eleven recorded sacks. Six players have interceptions. In the twelve games,

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) in eight of the last eleven seasons to earn public recognition. In 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017, Wofford had the highest APR in the SoCon. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 146 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003.

Among all NCAA Division I (FBS and FCS) football teams, Wofford's APR score of 983 is 41st in the nation. The Terriers are ahead of schools such as Harvard (981), Georgia Tech (980), Samford (980), Baylor (879), Rice (977), and Wake Forest (979).

Wofford has had at least one player named CoSIDA/Capital One First Team All-District in each of the last 19 seasons. In 2018 Blake Jeresaty was named Academic All-District. In addition, safety James Zotto was named an Academic All-American in 2014.

there are nine different players with a share of being the leading tackler.

PREVENTING THE SACK

In 2015, the offensive line gave up only eight sacks all season which ranked third in the nation (0.73 per game). In 2016 they allowed just one sack each against Johnson C. Smith, ETSU and Samford to lead the nation. Last season they were ranked seventh with only ten sacks allowed and so far in 2018 have allowed only seven sacks (Wyoming, Western Carolina and Presbyterian, with two each at Furman and Samford) to rank fourth.

GOING OVERTIME

The overtime game wins against Western Carolina and Chattanooga in 2017 mark 11 overtime games in school history. The Terriers lost the first two overtime games, then won the next two. In 2012, a 24-17 double overtime loss at Samford was followed by a win over Chattanooga. There was a win over Mercer in 2015 and losses to The Citadel and Youngstown State (double overtime) in 2016. Wofford is now 6-5 all-time in overtime games.

RUSHING LEGACY

Wofford has finished among the top ten schools in the nation in rushing in each of the past 20 years. The Terriers' wingbone offense puts a premium on ball control and keeping the opponent's offense on the boundary. Eight times the Terriers have been second in the nation in rushing yards per game, while in 2010 and 2011 they finished first.

WOFFORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE FCS OPPONENTS

Since 2000, Wofford is 25-3 in non-conference regular season FCS games ... Wofford's loss to Coastal Carolina in 2006 snapped a streak of 10 straight regular season non-conference wins against FCS opponents ... The Terriers had not lost a non-conference regular season game to a FCS opponent since dropping the 2000 season opener to Lehigh 34-14 ... The loss to Gardner-Webb in 2013 ended a nine-game streak and Wofford lost again to Gardner-Webb in 2014.

TERRIERS AT HOME

Wofford has won 74 of its last 93 games played in Gibbs Stadium, including going 5-0 in 2014 and 2018 ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 99-33 (.750) ... The Terriers have won 56 of 82 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium.

TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS

The 2018 season marked the 21st time in the last 22 seasons the Terriers have played against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A). Overall, Wofford is 1-20 in those games. In 2011, Wofford had a lead at Clemson in the third quarter. At South Carolina in 2012, the game was tied at 7-7 at the start of the fourth quarter. Wofford was down five points to Georgia Tech in 2014 with ten minutes to go in the game. In 2017, Wofford trailed South Carolina 14-10 in the third quarter. Wyoming scored with 17 seconds left in the game in 2018. Clemson returns to the schedule in 2019, 2023 and 2027. Wofford heads to North Carolina in 2021 and South Carolina in 2020.

BRENTON BERSIN

Wide receiver Brenton Bersin ('12) signed as an undrafted free agent with the Carolina Panthers in April of 2012. He spent the 2013 season on the Panthers practice squad. He re-signed with the Panthers again in 2014 and made the 53-man roster and had his first NFL catch against Detroit on September 14. He caught his first touchdown on October 19 at Green Bay and made his first start on October 26 against Seattle. Bersin's 1-yard touchdown reception at Green Bay was the first touchdown catch by a player from Wofford since Jerry Richardson had a touchdown as a member of the Baltimore Colts at Dallas (10/30/60). In 2015, Bersin had a career-high four catches against Tampa Bay (10/4). He remained on the roster for the remainder of the season as the Panthers won the NFC Championship and played in Super Bowl 50. He was on the active roster for the 2016 season and 2017 seasons, but is currently a free agent.

KASEY REDFERN

Punter Kasey Redfern ('14) made the 53-man roster for the Detroit Lions and kicked in the season opener against Arizona. However he suffered a knee injury and was placed on injured reserve. He joined the Lions as a free agent after most recently spending time with the Cleveland Browns. He spent time on the Chargers practice squad in 2015 before joining the Carolina Panthers during the 2016 preseason and was traded to the Browns. He entered the NFL as an undrafted rookie free agent with the Jaguars in 2014.

DAVID MARVIN

Kicker David Marvin ('17) spent the 2017 season with the University of Georgia and reached the national championship game. He signed as a free agent with the Atlanta Falcons and handled kicking duties in four preseason games before being waived in the final roster cuts. He has signed to play for the Georgia Force of the AAF that will begin this winter.

MR. RICHARDSON

Jerry Richardson came to Wofford in the mid-1950s as an unheralded pass receiver from Fayetteville, N.C. By the time he left to begin his pro career with the Baltimore Colts, the passing combination of Charlie Bradshaw to Jerry Richardson had received nationwide fame. Richardson was an Associated Press Little All-America selection in 1957 and '58. He still holds Wofford's single-game record with 241 receiving yards vs. Newberry in 1956 and is the record holder for touchdown receptions in a season (9 in 1958) and in a career (21). As a senior at Wofford, he scored 72 points on nine touchdowns, 12 extra points and two field goals. Drafted by the defending world champion Colts, Richardson played two seasons in the NFL, earning Colt Rookie of the Year honors in 1959 and finishing third in the balloting for top NFL rookie. He was the founder of the Carolina Panthers. In 2015, Wofford announced the construction of two new facilities on campus donated by Richardson. The Rosalind S. Richardson Center for the Arts opened in the spring of 2017 and is the home to academic programs in theatre arts, visual arts and art history. The Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium is a 123,000-square-foot facility opened in September of 2017 and includes a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 400-seat volleyball competition venue.

CAROLINA PANTHER TRAINING CAMP

The Carolina Panthers have held summer training camp at Wofford since their inaugural season in 1995 and it is contracted held on campus until 2019. The

camp provides Wofford tremendous national exposure and visibility. Media members that visit Wofford during the camp include ESPN, Fox Sports, NFL Network, *USA Today* and *Sports Illustrated*. In 2017 the camp drew 99,196 visitors to campus.



RECENT SUCCESS

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in 14 of the last 15 years, winning six SoCon Championships. In the last 15 years, the Terriers have won 75 of 114 SoCon games played. Over that time, Wofford is the winningest program in the Southern Conference with a .657 win percentage.

2017 SEASON RECAP

The Wofford football team saw the 2017 season come to an end on December 9 in the Fargodome ... North Dakota State, the second seed, scored three touchdowns in the final five minutes of the first half to build a lead that the Terriers could not overcome for a 42-10 final score ... The Bison advanced and won their sixth national championship in seven years ... To reach the quarterfinals, the #7 seeded Terriers had a bye in the opening round and then defeated Furman 28-10 at Gibbs Stadium in the second round ... This marked the eighth season the Terriers reached the NCAA FCS Playoffs and the seconds straight time reaching the quarterfinals ... Wofford ended the season10-3 overall and 7-1 in the Southern Conference, winning the league title for the fifth time and receiving the SoCon automatic bid ... The team reached the double-digit win mark for the sixth time in school history and it was the first time posting back-to-back 10 win seasons ... In the national stats, Wofford finished third in red zone offense and first in fewest passes intercepted ... The Terriers were eighth in the nation in rushing offense, 121st in passing and 73rd in total offense ... They were 25th in rushing defense, 51st in passing defense and 26th in total defense ... Wofford finished the season ranked 6th in the STATS FCS poll and #7 in the FCS Coaches poll.

Wofford is currently the third-smallest school in NCAA Division I-FCS with an enrollment of 1,650 students. The smallest school is Presbyterian College at 1,100 and VMI is second with 1,559. Wofford ranks in the top five nationally in the percentage of undergraduates receiving credit for study abroad. Home to one of the nation's 276 Phi Beta Kappa chapters, Wofford's historic 175-acre campus is recognized as a national arboretum. Affiliated with the United Methodist Church, the college is committed to provide superior liberal arts education that prepares its students for extraordinary and positive contributions to society. Wofford College announced on Tuesday, January 2, 2018, the hiring of Josh Conklin as head football coach. Conklin, who spent the past three seasons as the defensive coordinator at the University of Pittsburgh, was an assistant coach at Wofford from 2007-09 working with the secondary. He becomes the 23rd football coach in the college's history, which began playing the sport in 1889.

Conklin has additional experience at Florida International, Tennessee, The Citadel and South Dakota State University, serving as the defensive coordinator at Pitt, Florida International and The Citadel. He has worked with the 4-3, 4-2 and 3-4 defensive packages during his career.

Conklin served as Pitt's defensive coordinator for three seasons. Under Conklin's watch, Pitt featured one of the most productive pass rushes in the country. The Panthers ranked sixth nationally in sacks in 2016, averaging 3.31 per contest. Pitt compiled 111 sacks the past three seasons.

In 2017, the Panthers ended the season with a 24-14 upset of undefeated and #2 ranked Miami. Senior cornerback Avonte Maddox was recognized on the All-ACC third team, while junior linebacker Oluwaseun Idowu and junior safety Jordan Whitehead received Honorable Mention All-ACC honors.

Conklin's 2016 unit also boasted lofty national rankings in rush defense (16th, 119.6 yards per game) and defensive touchdowns (eighth, four TDs). The Panthers had a 43-42 win over eventual national champion Clemson in Death Valley to highlight an 8-5 season that culminated in the trip to the Pinstripe Bowl. In his first season as defensive coordinator, Pitt posted an 8-5 record and earned a berth in the Military Bowl.

Conklin joined Pitt after building an impressive resume as FIU's defensive coordinator for two years (2013-14). In his final season, he was nominated for the prestigious Broyles Award after overseeing a unit that ranked first nationally in fumble recoveries (19), second in defensive touchdowns (six), fourth in turnovers gained (33), eighth in turnover margin (plus-11 overall; 0.92 margin per game) and 35th in total defense (363.8 yards per game).

Prior to FIU, Conklin was the safeties coach at the University of Tennessee (2012) and defensive coordinator and safeties coach at The Citadel (2010-11). While at The Citadel, Conklin coached cornerback Cortez Allen, a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers from 2011-15.

From 2007-09, Conklin coached the defensive backs at Wofford. He added special teams to his responsibilities in his final season working with the Terriers. In Conklin's initial two years, Wofford had 33 interceptions. The Terriers led the Southern Conference in 2007 with 20 interceptions and

ranked second in 2008 with 13. Wofford advanced to the FCS Playoffs in each of those seasons. In 2007, the Terriers won the second Southern Conference title in school history and led the league in scoring defense. After an historic win at Montana in the first round of the playoffs, the Terriers were defeated in the quarterfinals by Richmond. Cornerback Brian Kemp was named second team All-Southern Conference.

The 2008 season was capped with a loss to James Madison in the first round of the playoffs to end the year at 9-3. Safety Jason Leventis and cornerback Mychael Johnson earned second team All-Southern Conference honors as the team was second in the league in interceptions. While working with the specialists in 2009, punter Chris Tommie was named first team All-Southern Conference with a 43.8 average.

Conklin's coaching career was launched at South Dakota State, where he served as a graduate assistant in 2003 and 2004. He then was promoted to a full-time post with the Jackrabbits, coaching the secondary and special teams in 2005 and 2006. In 2006, SDSU finished 21st in the nation and ranked second in the conference in pass defense.

Conklin is a 2003 graduate of Dakota State University. He was a starting linebacker and Academic All-American for the Troians. A native of Gillette. Wyoming, Conklin was born June 19, 1979.

In addition to his bachelor's in physical education from DSU, Conklin also earned a master's in sport administration from South Dakota State. He and his wife, Molly, have two children - son Clark and daughter Millie.

The Terriers jumped out to a 21-0 lead before the Bulldogs tied it in the third quarter. A touchdown with 7:48 remaining in the game by Blake Morgan and a defensive stand gave

Wofford opens the season 1-0 overall and in the Southern Conference, while the Bulldogs are 0-1 to begin the year. The Terriers were led by Lennox McAfee with 85 rushing yards and two touchdowns, while Ryan Lovelace added a 70-yard touchdown run. The Bulldogs were led by Lorenzo Ward with 124 rushing yards on 22 carries along with a touchdown. Noah Dawkins had two interceptions for The Citadel, with one returned for a touchdown.

The Bulldogs had the ball first and gained two first downs before coming up short on a fourth-and-four on a tackle by John Beckley. Both teams then traded three-and-outs. With the ball back, Wofford had a 70-yard touchdown run by Ryan Lovelace to make it a 7-0 game at the 7:00 mark. After the Bulldogs went three-and-out, Wofford had another big play as Lennox McAfee went 62-yards for a touchdown. With 3:35 left in the first quarter, the Terriers had a 14-0 lead.

An eight-play drive by Wofford that covered 80 yards was capped by a two-yard touchdown run by Lennox McAfee for a 21-0 advantage at the 11:06 mark of the second quarter. The Citadel picked up a fourth-and-one on their next drive, but ultimately were forced to punt. Both teams then traded three-and-outs. With the ball back, Joe Newman was intercepted by Noah Dawkins at the 21-yard line. It took the Bulldogs just three plays to score on a 10-yard run which cut the lead to 21-7 with 1:14 left in the first half. Wofford went three-and-out and punted. The Bulldogs had a run for 43 yards on the final play of the half.

Wofford had the ball first to begin the second half. After a first down, Noah Dawkins picked off a pass by Joe Newman and returned it 47 yards for a touchdown to make it a 21-14 game. The Terriers had a first down on the next drive but were forced to punt. The teams then traded punts. The Bulldogs went three-and-out and punted, but the ball hit a Wofford player and the punt was recovered by The Citadel. On the next drive, the Bulldogs converted and fourth-and-one and then were faced with fourth-and-goal from the one. Rod Johnson took the ball in for the touchdown and the game was tied at 21 with 15 seconds left in the third guarter.

The Terriers responded with a drive that took eight minutes off the clock and gained six first downs. Blake Morgan capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown run to give Wofford a 28-21 lead with 7:48 remaining in the fourth quarter. After trading three-and-outs, the Bulldogs took over with 4:40 left on the clock. They gained a first down, then converted a fourth-and-four with a pass. The Bulldogs then had a fourth-and-one from the seven with 29 seconds left and picked up the first down. Four incomplete passes from the five-yard line ended the game.

SPARTANBURG, S.C. — The Wofford College football team scored the first five touchdowns of the game on the way to a 59-14 win over VMI on Saturday night at Gibbs Stadium. The Terriers had eight different players score touchdowns and set a school record with 671 yards of total offense.

Wofford opens the season 2-0 overall and in the Southern Conference. The Keydets are 0-2 on the season and 0-1 in the league. The Terriers were led by Nathan Walker with nine carries for 92 yards and a touchdown. The Keydets were led by Reece Udinski with 21-of-35 passing for 162 yards and a touchdown.

The Keydets had the ball to open the game and had three first downs, but the drive ended with a 43-yard field goal that was missed. Wofford took over and scored on a 25-yard touchdown pass from Joe Newman to Jason Hill for a 7-0 lead at the 7:20 mark of the first quarter. VMI then went three-and-out and punted back to the Terriers. After a first down by Blake Morgan, Ryan Lovelace went 42-yards for a touchdown. Wofford had a 14-0 lead with 5:01 remaining in the first half. The Keydets went three-and-out and punted. Andre Stoddard ran 32-yards for a touchdown and a 21-0 lead with a minute remaining in the first quarter.

After the Keydets went three-and-out on their next drive, Wofford took over

again at the eight-yard line. A 63-yard run by Nathan Walker led to a 21-yard touchdown pass from Joe Newman to Landon Parker and Wofford had a 28-0 lead at 13:45 in the second quarter. VMI converted a fourth down play with a fake punt but had to punt after a sack. Miller Mosley ran the ball in from the 10-yard line for a 35-0 lead at the 6:42 mark in the second quarter. VMI responded with a drive that included four first downs and was capped by a 4-yard pass reception by Jakob Herres for a 35-7 score with 4:09 remaining in the first half. Nick Karas caught a 45-yard pass and Nathan Walker ran it in for a 42-7 lead. The Keydets went three-and-out and then Wofford took a knee to send the game to halftime.

The Terriers opened the second half with Jimmy Weirick at quarterback. After four first downs, Luke Carter hit a 38-yard field goal to make it a 45-7 game at 8:03 in the third quarter. The Keydets punted after gaining one first down. Jimmy Weircik ran 63 yards for a touchdown as the Terriers pushed the lead to 52-7 with 5:09 on the clock in the third quarter. Wofford opens the season 2-1 overall, while the Cowboys are 2-2 on the season. BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. — The Wofford College football team ran for 490 yards and had over 600 yards of total offense as they defeated Gardner-Webb 45-14 on Saturday night at Spangler Stadium. The Terriers averaged 9.3 yards per play and five different players scored touchdowns.

Wofford opens the season 3-1 overall, while the Runnin' Bulldogs are 1-4 on the season. The Terriers were led by Andre Stoddard with 20 carries for 200 yards and two touchdowns, while Lennox McAfee had 12 carries for 131 yards and a touchdown. The Runnin' Bulldogs were led by quarterback Jordan Smith with 14-of-25 passing for 165 yards and two touchdowns.

Wofford opens the season 4-1 overall and 3-0 in the Southern Conference, while Chattanooga is 4-2 overall and 2-2 in league play. SPARTANBURG, S.C. - Wofford earned a 30-17 win over East Tennessee State University on Saturday afternoon at Gibbs Stadium. In a battle of top-25 opponents. the Terriers took an early 17-0 lead and never trailed.

Wofford is 5-2 overall and 4-1 in the Southern Conference, while ETSU is 6-2 overall and 4-1 in league play. The Terriers were led by Lennox McAfee with 12 carries for 121 yards and two touchdowns, while Andre Stoddard added 12 carries for 54 yards and two touchdowns. The Bucs were led by Austin Herink, who was 21-of-33 passing for 201 yards.

The Bucs had the ball to open the game and had one first down before punting. Wofford opened the game with a 38-yard run by Lennox McAfee. After two more first downs, the drive stalled and the Terriers settled for a 20-yard field goal by Luke Carter for a 3-0 lead at 6:52 in the first quarter. Wofford is 6-2 overall and 5-1 in the Southern Conference, while Mercer is 4-4 overall and 3-2 in league play. SPARTANBURG, S.C. – Wofford defeated Elon 19-7 at Gibbs Stadium on Saturday afternoon in the opening round of the NCAA FCS Playoffs. The Phoenix had a 7-6 lead at the half, but the Terriers held Elon scoreless in the second half and scored three times for the win.

Wofford is 9-3 overall and Elon is 6-5. Wofford advances to play at #4 seed Kennesaw State next Saturday. The Terriers were led by Nathan Walker with 90 rushing yards and a touchdown, while Lennox McAfee added 63 rushing yards. Luke Carter was 4-of-5 on field goals in the contest. Elon was led by Daniel Thompson with 20-of-32 passing for 209 yards.

The Phoenix had the ball to open the game and went three-and-out. Wofford had four first downs and scored on a 32-yard field goal by Luke Carter to take a 3-0 lead at the 6:32 mark of the first quarter. Elon answered with a 16-play drive that ended with a one-yard touchdown run by Brelynd Cyphers for a 7-3 lead at 14:23 in the second quarter. On the next drive by Wofford, Ryan Lovelace had a 56-yard run down the sideline. Luke Carter was wide left on a 36-yard field goal attempt with 11:34 on the clock in the second quarter.

With the ball back, Elon had two first downs and then faced a fourth-and-one. The Terrier defense stopped the run and took over at the 32-yard line.
