Kent State welcomes in the Owls of Kennesaw State for the 2019 home opener. This is the start of a two-year series with the Owls, who will be back at Dix Stadium in 2020. The Owls have enjoyed four-straight winning seasons including a 11-2 mark last year since starting their program in 2015.


FLASHFAST FACTS

- Kent State returns nine starters on the offensive side of the ball, headlined by redshirt junior quarterback **Woody Barrett**. Barrett threw for 2,339 yards and 11 touchdowns a season ago, and he ran for another 503 yards and seven touchdowns.
- The Golden Flashes also return their leading rusher, **Jo-EI Shaw**. Shaw rushed for 657 yards and seven touchdowns. He also caught nine passes for 84 yards and two touchdowns.
- In addition to Barrett and Shaw, the Flashes bring back their top-three receivers from 2018. Senior **Mike Carrigan** led the receivers with 597 yards and five touchdowns. Redshirt senior **Antwan Dixon** led the team in receptions with 52.

Sophomore **Isaiah McKoy** added 42 catches for 423 yards and three touchdowns.

- The offensive line returns 72 career starts heading into 2018, including redshirt junior **Adam Gregoire**, who missed all of 2018 due to injury after starting six games in 2017. The O-line is led by Rimington Trophy watch list member, senior **Nate Warnock**, who has 24 consecutive starts at center. Sophomore **Julian Sams** started all 12 games as a freshman.
- The Golden Flashes defense returns six starters, led by senior linebackers **Matt Bahr** and **Nick Faulkner**. Bahr tied for the team lead in tackles with 91, as well as leading the team with 7.5 tackles for loss. Faulkner totaled 36 tackles, including 5.0 tackles for loss.
- Three members of the secondary return for the Flashes. Junior **Keith Sherald Jr.** tied for the team lead with 91 tackles in 2018. Senior **Jamal Parker** was third on the team with 83 tackles, while junior **Elvis Hines** racked up 41 tackles.
- Kent State also returns all three specialists for 2019, headlined by First Team All-MAC sophomore kicker **Matthew Trickett**. Senior **Joey Palumbo** does the long snapping, while redshirt

Media sideline credentials will be issued only to accredited photographers and reporters on assignment. Both a credential and an armband must be displayed for access to field level. Armbands may be picked up in the media area on the first floor of the press box. Media members may not work between the 25-yard lines as suggested in the NCAA game management manual.

Saturday's game can be seen on ESPN 3, the home of the Mid-American Conference. The game can be heard live on 640 AM WHLO and the free Golden Flashes Radio channel on iHeart-Radio with a one-hour pregame show. **Ty Linder** handles the play-by-play duties and is joined by 11th-year color analyst **Rob Polinsky**. **Jacob Pavilack** will be on the sideline. By 2017, iHeart-Radio reached over 100 million registered users.

THE COACHES

Sean Lewis is the youngest head coach in the FBS at age 33 and earned his first victory against Howard in Week 2 of the 2018 season. He picked up his first Mid-American Conference win against his former school Bowling Green, 35-28. Lewis spent the previous six years under Dino Babers at three different schools, most recently spending two seasons as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Syracuse. The Orange proved to be a program on the rise with a victory over then defending national champion Clemson. Lewis served in the same position for two seasons at Bowling Green, helping the Falcons to a MAC title and two bowl appearances. Lewis also coached at Eastern Illinois, Akron and Nebraska Omaha.

Brian Bohannon (Georgia'93) is in his fourth season at the helm of Kennesaw State. In four seasons, Bohannon has run up an impressive 37-12 mark and back-to-back Big South Conference titles. Bohannon is the only coach in Kennesaw State history and came to the Owls after serving under Paul Johnson and his triple-option offense at George Tech, Georgia Southern and Navy.

MAC PRESEASON POLL

The Golden Flashes were picked fourth in the MAC East after back-to-back seasons being picked last. The fourth-place projection is the highest for Kent State since 2013 when it was picked to finish third in the East. The last time the Flashes were picked to finish in fourth place was the 2012 season, when KSU finished the season 11-3 and earned its third trip to a bowl game in school history.

ARIZONA STATE INFORMATION

PREVIEWING KENNESAW STATE

Kennesaw state is coming off an impressive 11-2 season in 2018 and a trip to the FCS quarterfinals. The Owls bookended the 2018 season with losses (to Georgia State and South Dakota State, respectfully) and won 11-straight games in between. The Owls began the 2019 season ranked 10th nationally in the FCS polls. Saturday's game marks the second ever contest against an FBS opponent for Kennesaw State.

The Owls return only one offensive starter, running back Shaq Terry.

Defensively, the Owls employ a 4-2-5 defense that allowed just 15 points per game last season and returns four of its top-five tacklers

In 2018, the Owls rolled up over 350 yards per game rushing to lead the FCS. Defensively, they gave up just over 250 yards per game, good for second in the FCS.

Kennesaw State narrowly edged Monmouth as the pick to win the Big South. The Owls landed five players on the preseason first-team, all on the defensive side of the ball.

KEY PLAYERS TO WATCH

Quarterback David Daniel has to fill in the big shoes of recently graduated Chandler Burks. Burks rushed for over 900 yards and 29 scores. Daniel rushed for a pair of scores last season and saw action in nine games.

Junior linebacker Bryson Armstrong is the preseason Big South Player of the Year. He enters his third season with the Owls with a team best 13.5 career sacks.

Junior tailback Shaq Terry is the leading returning rusher for the Owls. Terry was pre-season Big South honorable mention after running for 614 yards and five scores. Terry averaged nearly nine yards per carry last season.

The Owls will have the most freshmen on their roster since their inaugural 2015 season. A staggering 48 freshman will suit up for the Owls in 2019.

While also referring to a style of play on the field, #FlashFAST is the team mantra with FAST representing fun, accountable, smart and tough.

RED ZONE DEFENSE

In 2018, the Golden Flashes ranked seventh in the country in red zone defense. They held opponents to a 73.3 percentage despite allowing 60 red zone attempts, tied for the fifth most in the nation.

RED ZONE OFFENSE

Last season, Kent State ranked 12th in the country in red zone offense. The Golden Flashes scored points on 90 percent of their red zone trips in 2018.

HOME RUN HITTERS

The Flashes made game-changing plays all over the field last season. On the first play of the game against Ohio, **Woody Barrett** hooked up with **Isaiah McKoy** down the sideline for a 75-yard touchdown. **Jamal Parker** took over kick return duties late in the season and made an instant impact with a 43-yard return against Toledo. He followed that with a season-best 64-yard return against Eastern Michigan. **Jo-El Shaw** led an offensive explosion in his first career FBS game against Howard with a 76-yard touchdown, the longest play by a Golden Flash in 2018.

GROUND AND POUND

In both of Kent State's 2018 wins, the Golden Flashes outgained their opponents on the ground. Since 2012, the Flashes are 24-10 when out-rushing their opponent. Contrarily, KSU is just 3-49 when the opposition runs for more yards in that span.

2019 CAREER HIGHS

In the opener, the defense had three players have career nights against the Sun Devils. Qwuantrezz Knight had a team-high 10 stops in his Golden Flashes debut. Akeam Peters had a career best eight stops and forced a fumble. Zayin West had a big night that saw him record his first collegiate sack.

LUCKY NUMBER 27

Since the beginning of the 2013 season, Kent State is 11-2 when scoring 27 or more points in regulation. Kent State is 5-53 when falling short of 27 during that time.

Q KNIGHT WINS APPEAL

Redshirt junior Qwuantrezz Knight was cleared by the NCAA and ruled eligible for game competition following his transfer from the University of Maryland. Knight appeared in 27 games in three seasons for the Terps and made 45 tackles.

GIDDY-UP PARTNER!

Redshirt junior quarterback **Woody Barrett** enters his second season in the saddle of the Kent State offense. Barrett put up unprecedented numbers (387 yards total offense) for a Golden Flashes QB in his first career FBS start at Illinois last season. He completed 28 passes for 270 yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for 117 yards and one score. During one stretch, Barrett completed 28-of-34 passes. After winning the QB battle during camp last season, Barrett has taken control and not looked back. He ranked fifth in the Mid-American Conference and school history in total offense a season ago with 2,842 total yards. He threw for 11 touchdowns and rushed for an additional seven.

RAISING THE BAHR

Sixth year linebacker **Matt Bahr** thought his playing career was over after a 28-20 loss to Eastern Michigan in last season's finale. He wanted to return and the NCAA granted him the ability to play a sixth year. Bahr earned his undergraduate degree in three years with a 3.89 GPA and earned a master's degree this past December. Bahr is a three-time MAC Distinguished Scholar-Athlete, an Academic All-MAC selection and a Campbell Trophy nominee. He has been named to the Wuerffel Trophy watch list three years in a row. He earned a postgraduate scholarship from the Northeast Ohio Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

On the field, Bahr tied for the team lead in tackles last season with 91. He led the Flashes with 7.5 tackles for loss. Bahr started his career as a walk-on safety before making the switch to linebacker before the 2017 season. Last year, he earned a single digit number and was named a team captain. He's also been a multi-year nominee for the Burlsworth Trophy.

Away from academics and football, Bahr served two years as president of Kent State's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. He also served on the MAC's Student-Athlete Executive Committee. Bahr was nominated for the All-State AFCA GoodWorks Team. Bahr's many service projects included trips to Belize and Costa Rica working with "Courts For Kids."

DIXON DEFIES LIFE-THREATENING ILLNESS

Wide receiver **Antwan Dixon** led the team with 52 receptions in 2018, but just two years ago, catching passes were the least of his worries. Dixon played for the first time in three years in the 2018 season opener at Illinois after battling aplastic anemia, a rare blood disorder. After leading the team in receiving yards (355) in 2015, Dixon's condition forced him to leave school. As his condition worsened, his weight dropped to 125 pounds, but a life-saving bone marrow transplant from his father (Anthony Dixon) led to one of the best comeback stories in all of college football. He was named the 2018 Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year.

RETURNING RECEIVERS

The returning receivers picked up where they left off in 2018 in the season opener. Antwan Dixon led the team with four grabs for 44 yards. Woody Barrett dropped a 21-yard pass into the bucket to Isaiah McKoy for a score.

LEGEND OF SHAW

In his first FBS game, senior **Jo-EI Shaw** rushed for 105 yards and three touchdowns against Howard, including a 15-yard TD on his very first carry. At Ole Miss, Shaw had an 18-yard touchdown catch and a 42-yard kickoff return, his longest of the season. Shaw finished the season as the team's leading rusher with 657 yards and seven touchdowns. Shaw averaged 113.3 yards per game in four starts. He totaled 453 yards, scored four touchdowns and had three 100+ yard games.

TRICKETT KICKS IT

Sophomore placekicker **Matthew Trickett** earned a starting spot in 2018 preseason camp as a true freshman. Trickett finished the season 14-for-17 on field goal attempts and 33-for-34 on PATs. Trickett went 4-for-4 against Ohio, including a 49-yard field goal. His four field goals in the game are tied for the most in Kent State history, and the 49-yard boot is tied for the fourth-

longest in school history. His 82.4 field goal percentage in 2018 ranked 26th in the nation, and it is the best at Kent State since Travis Mayle connected on 85.7 of his field goal attempts in 2002.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE

Senior tackle Bryce Gibbs and junior guard Nathan Monnin each made their first start of the season at Ball State on the offensive line in 2018. Two returning offensive linemen made their first career FBS starts at Illinois: senior left tackle Jamil Viaud and sophomore left guard Julian Sams. Sams started all 12 games as a freshman, and is the first true freshman offensive lineman to start every game in Brian Winters in 2009. Senior Nate Warnock leads the heart of the O-line, having started a team-high 24 consecutive games. Junior tackle Adam Gregoire returns after missing all of 2018 due to injury. He started six games in 2017.

SUPER SPECIALIST TRIO

The Golden Flashes return their specialist trio that is heavily decorated. As a freshman last season, kicker **Matthew Trickett** earned First Team All-MAC accolades. Junior punter **Derek Adams** was named to the All-MAC second team in 2017 before redshirting in 2018 due to injury. Adams ranks third in Kent State history with a 41.7 career punting average. Senior long snapper **Joey Palumbo** allows the trio to succeed at the highest level. Palumbo is a two-time Academic All-MAC recipient, and he was named to the Patrick Mannely Award preseason watch lists, which honors the nation's best long snapper.

STEVE HARVEY SCHOLARSHIP

Kent State freshman **Anthony Morris** was awarded the Steve and Majorie Harvey Foundation scholarship. Morris appeared on Harvey's talk show "Steve" on June 26. Harvey, a former KSU student, is known for hosting Family Feud.

FLASHES GAINING HONORS

For the third consecutive season, grad linebacker **Matt Bahr** was named to the Wuerffel Trophy preseason watch list, as well as the All-State AFCA Good Works Team. Bahr isn't the only Golden Flash popping up on preseason watch lists. **Nate Warnock** was named to the Rimington Trophy watch list for the second straight season. **Jamal Parker** was named to the Paul Hornung Award watch list, which is given to the most versatile player in college football. **Woody Barrett** was named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award preseason watch list.

Kent State ran a total of 914 plays in 2018, the most since the 2012 season. **Sean Lewis** and the new #FlashFAST offense ran an average of 76.6 plays per game a season ago, a number they are looking to increase in 2019. Junior

quarterback **Woody Barrett** shattered the Kent State record for most plays in a single season with 553. The new pace of play led to the most points (287), yards (4,603) and touchdowns (35) since the 2012 season. They averaged nearly 24 points per game in 2018 and return nine starters.

GOLDEN STANDARD GUYS

When **Sean Lewis** began meeting with the team in January of 2018, he took away all single-digit jerseys. Only players that met the team's Golden Standard on and off the field would earn a single digit. On the morning of the 2018 spring game, linebacker **Matt Bahr** and defensive back **Elvis Hines** became the first two players to gain the honor. Following preseason camp, defensive back **Jamal Parker**, running back **Will Matthews** and outside linebacker **Nick Faulkner** joined the elite group. Before the 2019 season, **Cepeda Phillips** and **Kavious Price** joined the single digit club bringing the total to seven Golden Standard guys

HONORING #54 JASON BITSKO

On Aug. 20, 2014 during a preseason practice, Kent State's football team received tragic news of the unexpected overnight death of **Jason Bitsko**. The fourth-year junior was slated to be the team's center after starting 12 games at right tackle in 2013. Bitsko had become a team leader, mentor and friend to many both on and off the field. In Bitsko's honor, the number 54 is now worn by a select offensive lineman every season. For the second year, senior **Nate Warnock** was chosen by teammates

and coaches to wear the jersey. In previous years, it was worn by Reno Reda, Stefano Millin and Nathan Puthoff. In 2014, 54 was displayed on one side of every player's helmet throughout the year.

RIVALS TURNED TEAMMATES

Seniors **Nick Faulkner** and **John Henry Bronczek** came to Kent State from opposite sides of the greatest rivalry in high school football. The War of 1894, Canton McKinley vs. Massillon Washington. The storied programs have combined for 36 state titles and 1,700 wins. Both players made their first appearance in 2016 and have gradually improved with each season. Faulkner, a former defensive end, has found his niche as an outside linebacker in the 3-4 defense, while Bronczek is making an impact on special teams

Lewis joins the ranks of esteemed Kent State greats such as **Josh Cribbs**, **Lou Holtz**, **Nick Saban** and **Dri Archer** to have sandwiches named after them.

UP NEXT

Kent State will head to SEC territory for a matchup with Auburn on Sept. 14, 2018. The Tigers started their season with a win over Oregon on a game-winning touchdown by true freshman quarterback Bo Nix.

FLASHES IN THE PROS

FLASHES IN THE COACHING RANKS

Two players from Don James' 1972 squad (he himself a member of the College Football Hall of Fame) have gone on to find great coaching success of their own. Current Alabama head coach **Nick Saban** (defensive back, 1970-73) won a national championship with LSU in 2003 and five more with Alabama, while **Gary Pinkel** (tight end, 1971-73) directed Missouri to a school-record 12 victories in 2007, finishing the season fourth in the final Associated Press poll after being ranked No. 1 earlier in the year. **Dan Dorazio**, who was a student assistant under James, has coached for over 40 years in the CFL. Furthermore, **Bob Stoops** — who led Oklahoma to the 2000 national title — got his full-time coaching start as an assistant at Kent State in 1988. In addition to College Football Hall of Fame inductee **Lou Holtz**, the list also includes former head coach **Glen Mason** (1986-87), who went on to find success at Minnesota, **Dean Pees** (head coach, 1998-03) currently defensive coordinators with the Tennessee Titans, and **Dom Capers** (graduate assistant, 1972-74) who recently retired as Green Bay Packers defensive coordinator. Capers also worked under James.

Head Coach • 2nd Season (Wisconsin)

Sean Lewis became Kent State University's 22nd head football coach on Dec. 21, 2017. He is entering his second season as head coach and remains the youngest coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) at 33 years old.

In his first season at Kent State, Lewis engineered a drastic offensive improvement from the previous season. The 2018 campaign saw the Flashes improve in scoring offense by 11.2 points per game and 108.4 yards per game.

He recorded his first career win in the home opener with a 54-14 triumph against Howard. Kent State posted more than 50 points for the first time since 2008 and the first time at Dix Stadium since 2004. Lewis also guided the Flashes to a road victory over Bowling Green, the first since 2012, in his return to the school where he served as co-offensive coordinator.

Lewis brought an extensive coaching résumé to Kent State and has been one of the fastest-rising coaches in the nation over the last decade. He came to the Golden Flashes after serving as the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Dino Babers at Syracuse. Lewis' background stretches from his four-year playing career at the University of Wisconsin under Barry Alvarez, to winning the 2015 MAC Championship as the co-offensive coordinator at Bowling Green.

That ascension led Lewis to becoming the youngest Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) head coach in the nation at the age of 31. That distinction was previously held by the University of Oklahoma's Lincoln Riley at age 34.

Lewis spent his previous six seasons alongside head coach Babers at Syracuse (2016-17), Bowling Green (2014-15) and Eastern Illinois (2012-13).

During Lewis' first season with the Orange in 2016, its offense set or tied over 40 program records including most passing yards in a season (3,855). Syracuse quarterbacks ranked 11th in the nation in passing. Its 5,290 yards of total offense were the second most in program history.

In 2015, Bowling Green ranked fourth in the nation in total offense (546.8) and sixth in scoring offense (42.2 ypg). Lewis served as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for Matt Johnson, that season's MAC Offensive Player of the Year. Johnson finished second in the nation in both passing yards (4,946) and touchdowns (46). All-American wide receiver Roger Lewis finished second in the nation in receiving yards (1,544) and third in touchdown catches (16). One year earlier, the Falcons won a MAC East title and the Camellia Bowl.

Lewis earned a bachelor's degree from Wisconsin in agricultural sciences in 2007. He and his wife, Sarah, have a son, Rory.
