NORTH ALABAMA IN SECOND SEASON IN FCS

• A charter member of the Gulf South Conference and the NCAA Division II, North Alabama completed its first season as a member of the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in 2018 with a 7-3 overall record and a four-game winning streak to close the season.



* UNA produced one of the most successful football programs in the history of the GSC and Division II, advancing to the Division II Playoffs 12 times in its final 15 seasons in the division and making 21 total playoff appearances, winning 35 post-season games and three national championships. The 21

post-season trips and 35 playoff wins rank second in DII history.

* The Lions officially moved to Division I status on July 1, 2018.

* UNA was 3-2 against FCS programs in 2018 with wins over Southern Utah, Alabama A&M and Jackson State and losses to North Dakota State and Campbell.

NORTH ALABAMA WAS AN INDEPENDENT IN 2018

* North Alabama was officially an FCS independent in 2018. All 11 games on UNA's 2018 schedule were non-conference games.

LIONS IN BIG SOUTH CONFERENCE IN 2019

* Although North Alabama is now a member of the Big South Conference, the Lions are not eligible to compete for the Big South Conference Championship until 2022 as part of the transition to Division I. UNA was not included in the Big South pre-season poll and the Lions' games against Big South Conference opponents in 2019 do not count in the conference standings.

FIRST SEASON WITH FULL FCS SCHEDULE

* The 2019 season will be UNA's first with a full, 11-game FCS schedule. The Lions will play five games at home and six on the road. Prior to this season, UNA had only played 18 total games against FCS schools.



150th ANNIVERSARY OF COLLEGE FOOTBALL

* The 2019 season marks the 150th Anniversary of the first collegiate football game between Princeton and Rutgers on November 6, 1869. Celebrations and recognitions are planned throughout the year and throughout the country to recognize the anniversary.

UNA IN 71ST SEASON OF FOOTBALL

• This is North Alabama's 71st season of intercollegiate football since the program was revived at the school in 1949. UNA has an overall 474-273-16 record. The school's .615 winning percentage during its years in Division II ranked 12th best in the Division's history.

2019 North Alabama Notes

LIONS VS. KENNESAW STATE

* This will be the first meeting between North Alabama and Kennesaw State in football.

UNA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

* Kennesaw State will be the third nationally ranked FCS opponent on North Alabama's 2019 schedule, and all three have been road contests.

* UNA has played 108 games against a nationally ranked opponent since 1992. The Lions are 61-46-1 in those 108 meetings with ranked opponents over the last 27 seasons.

* UNA has played 57 of those 107 games against teams ranked in the Top 10. The Lions are 31-26 in those previous 57 games.

* UNA played six nationally ranked teams in 2017 and three in 2018.

* UNA has played five games against nationally ranked FCS opponents:

* North Alabama has an all-time 65-31-1 against schools from the state of Georgia in football and has a winning record against all seven schools it has faced from Georgia.

NO LOSING SEASONS AT UNA SINCE 2002

* At 2-5 overall, a loss at Kennesaw State would guarantee North Alabama its' first losing season in football since 2002. That's a streak of 16 straight seasons with a .500 record or better.

* Since 2003, UNA has had 12 seasons with nine or more wins and just three years with a .500 record.

* The last losing season at UNA was a 4-7 record in 2002 in Mark Hudspeth's first season at the school. He would finish his seven-year run with the Lions with a 66-21 record that included two conference championships and five NCAA Playoff appearances.

LIONS LOOK TO AVOID THREE-GAME LOSING SKID

* North Alabama has lost its last two games to Hampton and Charleston Southern and will be trying to avoid its first three-game losing streak since 2012 when the Lions lost their last four straight games after a 5-1 start to the season.

LIONS STILL LOOKING FOR FIRST ROAD WIN

* North Alabama is 0-3 on the road in 2019 against a rugged schedule that includes games at nationally ranked Montana and Jacksonville State. The Lions other road loss was a six-point setback at Hampton.

* UNA's last road win over an FCS opponent was on October 20, 2018 at Jackson State in Jackson, Miss., 24-7.

* This game at Kennesaw State will be UNA's third road game this season against a nationally ranked opponent.

NORTH ALABAMA HAS SECOND WINNINGEST COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL PROGRAM IN ALABAMA SINCE 1990

The University of North Alabama ranks second only behind the University of Alabama for football success by a school from the State of Alabama since 1990. Over the last 30 seasons, North Alabama has a combined 247-102-1 record in football for a 70.9 winning percentage. Over the same period of time, Alabama has a 268-98 record for a 73.0 winning percentage. Tuskegee is third at 230-99-1 (69.6) and Auburn is fourth at 234-114-3 (67.0).

THREE UNA LOSSES BY SEVEN POINTS OR LESS

* Three of North Alabama's 2019 losses have been by a touchdown or less. The Lions lost to Alabama A&M 31-24, Hampton 40-34 and Charleston Southern 25-20.

* UNA's only two losses by more than seven points were to nationally ranked teams on the road.

NO TURNOVERS = 2-0

* North Alabama has turned the ball over in five of its seven games this season but the Lions are 2-0 in the two games where they did not lose a turnover - Western Illinois and Presbyterian.

TIME OF POSSESSION NOT IN UNA'S FAVOR

* The Lions are averaging just 26:40 time of possession through the first seven games of the season, while UNA's opponents have had the ball an average of 33:20.

* UNA has only led in time of possession in one game this season and that was in the opener against Western Illinois - by 34 seconds.

* The North Alabama defense has had to defend for more than 80 plays in four games already this season.

UNA GROUND GAME IS LACKING

* North Alabama is rushing for just 101.4 yards per game through the first seven games of 2019. If that average holds, it would be the lowest average rushing by a UNA team since the 1987 Lions rushed for 98.5 yards per game. The Lions averaged 149.8 yards per game in 2018 in their first season in the FCS.

RETURN YARDAGE IS DOWN

* Andre Little had a 64-yard kickoff return against Charleston Southern to setup a touchdown for the Lions in their last outing, but for the season UNA has just 456 total return yards or just 65.1 per game.

* UNA's opponents have 760 return yards or 108 per game.

LIONS VS. FCS CONFERENCES

* North Alabama has a 5-7 record against FCS opponents since making the move to Division I.

2019 North Alabama Notes

JUST FOUR FCS HOME OPPONENTS SINCE 1992

- * Charleston Southern was just the fourth FCS opponent to play at Braly Stadium since 1992 and UNA is 2-2 in those four games.
- * Before hosting Western Illinois in the 2019 season-opener, North Alabama had played its last 11 straight games against FCS opponents on the road, dating back to a 1992 game at Braly Stadium against Troy.
- * Prior to the 26-17 win over Western Illinois, UNA's last win over an FCS opponent in Florence was a 17-3 win over Missouri State (then known as Southwest Missouri State), in 1982.
- * Overall North Alabama is 11-13 against FCS schools since 1978 and two of those 12 losses were in double-overtime.
- * The Lions hold a 2-2 record against FBS schools, including a 48-42, four overtime win at Louisiana-Lafayette in 1997.

LIONS LEAD BIG SOUTH IN ATTENDANCE

- * The Lions are currently ranked 22nd out of 126 FCS schools in football attendance with an average of 9,696. UNA leads the Big South Conference in attendance, with Kennesaw State a distant second at 7,431 per home game.

ATTENDANCE ON RECORD PACE

- * More than 89,000 fans have watched North Alabama in person through the Lions' first seven games in the FCS. That includes an average of 9,696 in four games at home. UNA's best average attendance for home games in school history was 10,133 in 2010.

GURLEY HAVING OUTSTANDING SEASON

- * Although there is a long way to go in the 2019 season, UNA junior punter Joe Gurley's current 44.0 average would set a school single-season record. The current record is 43.24 by John Crittenden in 1991.
- * Gurley is also having one of the best seasons of any kicker in the FCS. Although UNA is not eligible to be ranked in the NCAA statistics due to the school's transitional period, Gurley would rank among the FCS leaders in field goal percentage (84.6 - 11-13), field goals made per game (1.57) and punting (44.0 avg).
- * He also leads UNA in scoring with 44 points.
- * On the down side, Gurley has missed four extra points this season.

YOUNG RECEIVERS CONTINUE TO SHINE

- * North Alabama's group of four red-shirt sophomore receivers continue to lead the way for the UNA offense. Dexter Boykin, Cortez Hall, Jakobi Byrd and Andre Little have a combined 86 catches for 1,489 yards and seven touchdowns this season.
- * All four receivers average better than 10 yards per catch for their career.
- * As redshirt freshmen in 2018, they combined on a 145 catches for 1,861 yards and 14 touchdowns.
- * Dexter Boykin has caught at least one pass in all 17 games that he has played for the Lions.

TWO LIONS AVERAGE 20-PLUS YARDS PER CATCH

- * UNA redshirt sophomore receivers Cortez Hall and Dexter Boykin are averaging better than 20 yards per pass reception this season. Hall has 19 catches for 449 yards and a 24.7 average, while Boykin has 19 catches for 434 yards and a 22.8 average. They rank No. 1 and 2, respectively, in the Big South in yards per catch.

UNA'S FIRST WIN OVER A BIG SOUTH SCHOOL

- North Alabama got its first win over a Big South school with a 41-21 win over Presbyterian. UNA's only other game against a Big South opponent was a loss at Campbell in 2018.

WIN OVER PRESBYTERIAN WAS SECOND BEST

- * North Alabama's 20-point victory margin over Presbyterian (41-21) was the second best ever by a Lion team over an FCS opponent. UNA beat Middle Tennessee State 36-0 in 1980.

GURLEY HAS TWO BIG SOUTH POW AWARDS

- * Joe Gurley, the starting punter for North Alabama in 2017-18, also took on place-kicking duties in week one after freshman Sam Contorno missed a PAT following the Lions' first score of the season. Gurley has since made nine of 10 field goal attempts, leads the team in scoring and has earned two Big South Conference Player of the Week awards.
- * In the Western Illinois game, Gurley came on to drill field goals from 48 and 42 yards, hit both of his PAT attempts and averaged 40 yards per punt. He was named Big South Conference Special Teams Player of the Week.
- * Against Presbyterian, Gurley made all five of his PAT attempts, was two-for-two on field goals, averaged 43.5 yards on four punts and tied his individual career long of 61 yards on a punt to earn his second Big South Player of the Week award.
- * At Montana he made his only field goal attempt from 21 yards, hit both PATs and averaged 48 yards on seven punts.
- * In week three against Alabama A&M, Gurley was four-for-four on field goals of 40, 39, 25 and 25 yards, averaged 47.9 yards on seven kicks with a long of 61 and had four punts downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

2019 North Alabama Notes

CHRISTIAN LOPEZ TRIPLED 2018 INT'S

* Through the first seven games of the season, Christian Lopez has been picked off seven times, after throwing just two interceptions in the entire 2018 season.

* He threw three interceptions at Montana, one at Jacksonville State and three against Charleston Southern.

* In 2018, Lopez threw a school record 253 consecutive passes without an interception. He threw seven passes at Southern Utah in the season-opener before being picked off on UNA's second possession of the season. He threw 35 more passes in that game without a pickoff and he threw another 218 in the Lions last nine games. He did not throw another interception until his 14th pass of the final game against North Greenville.

* The previous UNA record for consecutive passes without an interception was 168 by Will Hall in 2002.

LOPEZ NOW IN UNA CAREER RANKINGS

* UNA senior quarterback Christian Lopez has moved into the Top 10 in many of the Lions' career passing categories. He is eighth in career passing yards, ninth in career completions, eighth in career pass attempts and tied for tenth in career touchdown passes. He has accomplished those marks in just a season and a half so far at UNA.

WILLIS IN 18TH SEASON AT UNA, THIRD AS HEAD COACH

* After helping lead the University of North Alabama to 12 playoff appearances and seven conference championships in his 15 seasons on the coaching staff, Chris Willis was named as the 10th head football coach in UNA history on December 22, 2016.

* An assistant coach at North Alabama under Mark Hudspeth, Terry Bowden and Bobby Wallace, Willis served the Lions as defensive coordinator for the last five seasons and directed defensive efforts that helped UNA become the first school in Gulf South Conference history to win four straight league championships.

* 2017 was his first head coaching position in his 19 seasons as a collegiate coach and he led the Lions to a 5-5 record.

* Willis now has a 14-13 overall record as a head coach.

SEASON OPENERS

* The Lions game with Western Illinois was the 71st season-opening football game for UNA. The Lions have an all-time 42-25-4 record in those 71 season openers and are 15-2 in their last seventeen openers.

* Current UNA head coach Chris Willis is 2-0 in his season openers.

LIONS 51-19-1 ON HOMECOMING

* The Lions are 51-19-1 all-time in their 71 all-time Homecoming games after beating Presbyterian 41-21 in week five. UNA has won 15 straight Homecoming games, dating back to a 24-20 loss to Valdosta State in 2004.

2019 North Alabama Notes

LIONS HAVE LOST 11 TURNOVERS IN 2019

- * Through the first six games of the season, North Alabama has lost eight turnovers (four interceptions and four fumbles).
- * The Lions did not have any turnovers in wins over Western Illinois and Presbyterian.
- * North Alabama's offense lost just nine turnovers during the entire 2018 season, setting a school record for the fewest turnovers in a season in school history. The previous record was 15 in 2008.
- * UNA's five lost fumbles in 2018 was also a school record for the fewest in school history in a season. The previous best was six fumbles lost in 2005, 2006 and 2011.
- * UNA's four interceptions thrown in 2018 tied the school record for fewest in a season. It tied the mark of four thrown by the 1992 Lions. The 2018 Lions threw just four interceptions in 306 pass attempts. The 1992 Lions threw four interceptions but also only attempted 81 passes the entire season.
- * UNA did not commit a single turnover from scrimmage for a stretch of 284 plays from the fourth quarter of the week five loss at Campbell until the second quarter of Week ten's game against North Greenville.
- * UNA quarterback Christian Lopez had a streak of 253 straight passes without an interception and the Lions had a streak of 199 consecutive passes as a team without an interception.
- * As a team, UNA did not throw an interception during a stretch of 25 straight quarters, from a pick-six by North Dakota State at the 13:38 mark of the fourth quarter on September 15 until the 4:59 mark of the second quarter in the season-finale against North Greenville.

UNA HAS SEVEN NATIONAL TITLES

- * North Alabama has won seven total NCAA Division II National Championships.
- * UNA won men's basketball national titles in 1979 and 1991, football in 1993, 1994 and 1995, women's volleyball in 2003 and women's softball in 2016.
- * UNA is one of just four schools in NCAA history on all levels to have won at least two National Championships in football and men's basketball. The others are Florida, Michigan State and Wisconsin-Whitewater. UNA was the first school to do it and is still the only Division II school to accomplish it.

TOUGH SCHEDULES CONTINUE FOR LIONS

- * North Alabama has already played two nationally ranked FCS opponents in 2019 and three teams on UNA's 2019 schedule are ranked in the latest AFCA poll:
 - 4. Kennesaw State
 - 11. Montana
 - 21. Jacksonville State
- * In 2017 North Alabama faced the toughest regular-season schedule in the NCAA Division II, taking on six playoff teams in its 10-game schedule, including eventual national champion Texas A&M-Commerce and eventual national runner-up West Florida.
- * In 2018 the Lions opened at Southern Utah, a 2017 FCS playoff team and Big Sky Champions, followed by playing at the No. 1 ranked team in the FCS and eventual national champion, North Dakota State, in week three. The Lions then hosted the 24th ranked team in Division II in Azusa Pacific in week four and then faced its third ranked opponent of the season in West Florida in week six.
- * In 2020, UNA has Brigham Young on its schedule, along with with road trips to Western Illinois and Chattanooga and a home game with Jacksonville State.

LIONS EARN PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- * UNA senior running back Terence Humphrey of Huntsville, Ala., and junior kicker Joe Gurley of Killen, Ala., were honored by the Big South Conference for their efforts in UNA's season opening 26-17 win over Western Illinois.
- * This is UNA's first week to be eligible for Big South awards.
- * Humphrey rushed for 113 yards on 12 carries and scored on a 62-yard run in the third quarter that helped secure UNA's win. That performance earned him Big South Conference Offensive Player of the Week honors. In his fifth year in the UNA program, Humphrey has battled injuries for much of his career but had a break-out game against the Leathernecks.
- * Gurley was named Big South Conference Special Teams Player of the Week after coming on to kick field goals of 48 and 42 yards, making both of his extra-point attempts and averaging 40 yards on seven punts with a long of 54. Gurley was expected to just handle punting duties but came on to kick the two long distance field goals after the Lions had a missed PAT after their first score of the season.
- * Gurley earned his second Player of the Week award on Sept. 30 against Presbyterian. He made all five PAT attempts, both field goal attempts of 21 and 30 yards and averaged 43.5 yards per punt with a career long 61.

LIONS FINALLY KILL GRASS STREAK

- * With a 24-7 win at Jackson State, UNA finally ended a streak of having not won a game on a natural grass field since 2013. The Lions lost seven straight games on grass, beginning with a 42-39 playoff loss at Lenoir-Rhyne in 2013. The previous week UNA had defeated UNC-Pembroke 37-13 on grass for the Lions last win before the streak started.

BULLDOGS FIRST TRIP TO FLORENCE SINCE 1996

- * Alabama A&M's made its first trip to Braly Stadium since 1996 on Sept. 14 and 12,767 fans turned out, making it the fifth best regular-season home crowd in UNA history. The last four games played between A&M and UNA in Florence rank as the top four regular-season crowds to watch UNA play at Braly Stadium.

After helping lead the University of North Alabama to 12 playoff appearances and seven conference championships in his 15 seasons on the coaching staff, Chris Willis was named as the 10th head football coach in UNA history on December 22, 2016.

In his first season leading the UNA program, Willis and the Lions faced Division II's toughest schedule and overcame a rash of key injuries to emerge with a 5-5 overall record and a 5-3 Gulf South Conference mark. Despite playing six NCAA playoff teams on its 10-game schedule, UNA boasted one of the nation's premier defensive units in 2017.

Last season Willis and the Lions followed with a strong 7-3 record in the team's first season as a member of the Division I Football Championship Subdivision. UNA opened the season with a 34-30 road win at Southern Utah in the Lions' first game as an FCS member and the Lions followed with a 25-20 road win at state rival Alabama A&M. UNA closed the 2018 season with four consecutive wins and will carry that momentum into 2019.

An assistant coach at North Alabama under Mark Hudspeth, Terry Bowden and Bobby Wallace, Willis served the Lions as defensive coordinator from 2012-16 and directed defensive efforts that helped UNA become the first school in Gulf South Conference history to win four straight league championships. In 2016 the Lions were No. 1 in Division II in passing efficiency defense, third in scoring defense, fourth in interceptions and 20th in total defense as UNA went 11-2 and reached the national championship game.

A 1998 graduate of Delta State University, Willis initially joined the UNA staff in 2002 under Mark Hudspeth and coached tight ends. He then coached running backs in 2003 before moving to the defensive secondary from 2004-11. Wallace elevated Willis to defensive coordinator in 2012 and also assistant head coach. Willis also served as UNA's recruiting coordinator from 2002 to 2005.

As a student-athlete, Willis spent two years at Itawamba Community College on a football/baseball scholarship. He was a pitcher on the baseball team that claimed the school's first state championship in 1993. He was quarterback at Aberdeen (Miss.) High

School where, in 1990, he led his team to the third round of the playoffs as the team posted a school best 12-1 record. In his last two seasons at Aberdeen, he quarterbacked the Bulldogs to a 20-2 record before his graduation in 1992.

Willis received his Bachelor's Degree in Education in 1998 from Delta State and his Master's Degree in Education in 1999 from Delta State. While at DSU, he also taught in the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Department.

Born on February 2, 1974, Willis is married to the former Tara Beausoliel of Greenville, Miss. They have three sons, Beau (12), Cody (10) and Drew (6).

Willis at UNA Year-By-Year

* In 2002 Willis joined the UNA staff under Mark Hudspeth and served as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator.

* In 2003, while helping lead the Lions to a 13-1 record that included a Gulf South Conference title and an NCAA playoff appearance, Willis coached a tandem of All-GSC running backs in Demarcus Blount and Randy Vickers. He also served as director of football operations.

* In 2004 he moved to defense and coached the outside linebackers. That season he coached All-GSC and Academic All-GSC performer Jay Snipes.

* North Alabama went 11-3 in 2005 and again reached the semifinals of the Division II playoffs. The Lion defense ranked among the Division II national leaders in every category, including ranking 18th in scoring defense and total defense. The Lions also picked off 21 passes and ranked ninth nationally in turnover margin.

* In 2006 UNA was 11-1, won a GSC title and advanced to the quarterfinals of the Division II playoffs. On that team, Willis coached All-GSC and All-South Region pick Derrell Ashford.

* During the 2007 season the Lions were 10-2 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the Division II playoffs and UNA safety Craig Fox was named to numerous Division II All-American teams.

* In 2008 UNA was 12-2 and reached the semifinals of the Division II playoffs. The Lions' defense led Division II with 32 interceptions and three members of the UNA secondary, David Raymond, Darron Dampier and Bobby Brooks, earned All-GSC honors. Raymond and Dampier were also all-region and Raymond was named to several All-American teams.

* In 2009 the Lions were 11-2 under head coach Terry Bowden and won a GSC championship and advanced to the quarterfinals of the Division II playoffs with Willis as co-defensive coordinator. UNA was sixth in the nation in pass efficiency defense and 11th in scoring defense. The Lions were also 11th in turnover margin. UNA's secondary also placed four players on the All-GSC team: Quinton Andrews, Jason Tate, J.J. Johnson and Chad Daniel. Tate and Andrews were also all-region picks and Andrews made the D2football.com All-America team.

* In 2010 the Lions went 9-4 and advanced to the second round of the Division II playoffs. Defensive back Chad Daniel earned All-GSC, All-Super Region 2 and All-American honors. In addition, UNA was ranked third nationally in interceptions (22), third in turnovers gained (41) and sixth in scoring defense (14.7) and 10th in passing efficiency defense.

* Willis coached the secondary in 2011, in addition to serving the team as assistant head coach. North Alabama was 9-3 in 2011 and again reached the second round of the playoffs. UNA defensive backs Rod Woodson and Janoris Jenkins were All-GSC selections and Jenkins also earned all-region and All-American honors.

* Bobby Wallace returned to UNA as head coach in 2012 and Willis was elevated to defensive coordinator. That 2012 UNA defense produced two All-Americans in linebacker Tavarius Wilson and defensive back Caleb Massey. The Lions also recorded two shutouts and held four teams to two touchdowns or less.

* In 2013 the UNA defense produced three All-Americans in linebacker Tavarius Wilson, defensive lineman Taylor Carney and defensive back Caleb Massey. Wilson was named Division II National Defensive Player of the Year by Beyond Sports Network and was selected as Super Region 2 Defensive Player of the Year by both Daktronics and Don Hansen.

* In 2014 the UNA defense produced five All-GSC performers and ranked 18th nationally in scoring defense (19.2) and 13th in passing efficiency defense. The Lions went 9-2, won a share of the GSC crown and advanced to the Division II playoffs. The UNA defense led Division II with 29 interceptions and 39 turnovers gained. The Lions also ranked 18th in pass efficiency defense, 21st in scoring defense and ninth in turnover margin.

* The 2015 UNA defense had five All-GSC selections and an All-American in safety Floyd Jones. The Lions finished 10th in passing efficiency defense in the nation (101.15) and 13th in red zone defense (74.2). UNA was 9-3 and won a share of a third straight GSC championship and advanced to the second round of the Division II playoffs.

* In 2016 the Lions went 11-2, won an unprecedented fourth straight Gulf South Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Division II National Championship Game. UNA ranked first nationally in pass efficiency defense (90.50), third in scoring defense (14.5), fourth in interceptions (23), 12th in turnover margin and 20th in total defense.

* In his first season leading the UNA program, Willis and the Lions faced Division II's toughest schedule and overcame a rash of key injuries to emerge with a 5-5 overall record and a 5-3 Gulf South Conference mark.

Despite playing six NCAA playoff teams on its 10-game schedule, UNA boasted one of the nation's premier defensive units in 2017.

* In 2018, Willis led the UNA program into Division I FCS status and the Lions responded with a solid 7-3 record. UNA opened the season with a 34-30 road win over defending Big Sky Conference Champion Southern Utah and followed with a road win over Alabama A&M for back-to-back FCS wins. The 2018 Lions lost just nine total turnovers all season, setting a school single season record. UNA also closed the season with four straight wins.

* Prior to coming to UNA, Willis served as recruiting coordinator and coached numerous positions at Delta State University for three years. He joined the DSU staff in 1999 under Steve Campbell as a graduate assistant. In 2000 the Statesmen won the NCAA Division II National Championship at Braly Stadium, with Willis working along side former UNA Head Coach Mark Hudspeth with the running backs and quarterbacks. In 2001, he worked with then DSU offensive coordinator Cody Gross.

North Alabama has played 108 games against nationally ranked opponents since 1992 .

The Lions are 61-46-1 in the 108 previous meetings with ranked opponents over the last 27 seasons.

UNA won 18 straight games against nationally ranked teams at home from 1992-99, dating back to a 14-12 loss to third ranked Jacksonville State in the 1992 playoffs, prior to a 28-21 loss to Pittsburg State in 1999.

UNA HAS RICH FOOTBALL TRADITION

North Alabama Has Claimed Seven National Championships:

The University North Alabama athletic program has won seven NCAA Division II National Championships with three in football (1993, 1994, 1995), two in men's basketball (1979, 1991), one in women's volleyball (2003) and one in softball (2016).

UNA is One of Just Four Schools With at Least Two Basketball and Two Football Titles:

North Alabama is one of just four schools in NCAA history on all levels to have won at least two National Championships in football and men's basketball. The others are Florida, Michigan State and Wisconsin-Whitewater.

Two National Player of the Year Awards Named for Former UNA Athletes:

The Division II National Player of the Year Awards in two sports are named for former North Alabama student-athletes: The Josh Willingham Award in baseball and the Harlon Hill Trophy in football.

FOOTBALL

North Alabama has Second Winningest Collegiate Football Program in Alabama Since 1990:

The University of North Alabama ranks second only behind the University of Alabama for football success by a school from the State of Alabama since 1990. Over the last 30 seasons, North Alabama has a combined 241-94-1 record in football for a 71.79 winning percentage. Over the same period of time, Alabama has a 255-98 record for a 72.1 winning percentage. Tuskegee is third at 224-91-1 (71.0 %) and Auburn is fourth at 226-109-3 (67.21 %).

North Alabama was First NCAA Scholarship Football Team to Win Three Straight National Titles:

With three straight NCAA Division II Football National Championships from 1993-95, North Alabama became the first school in the history of NCAA scholarship football to win three consecutive football national titles. The only other schools to match that feat since have been FCS members Appalachian State (2005-07) and North Dakota State (2011-15).

UNA was First Collegiate Football Team to Win 40 Games in Three Years:

North Alabama was the first college football program in NCAA history to win as many as 40 games in just three seasons when the Lions went 41-1 from 1993-95. The only loss during that three-year span was 17-10 on the road at Youngstown State in 1994. Youngstown State went on to win the FCS football national championship that season.

North Alabama is Only Division II Football Program to Visit the White House:

In 1995 North Alabama became the first, and so far only, Division II football team invited to the White House. President Bill Clinton invited the Lions to Washington, D.C. after UNA went 14-0 in 1995, winning its third consecutive NCAA Division II National Championship.

Lions Prominent in National Football League:

The North Alabama football program has had 17 players drafted by National Football League teams, another 55 have signed NFL free-agent contracts and five former UNA Lions have gone on to play in the Super Bowl. Former UNA tight end Harlon Hill earned NFL Rookie of the Year and NFL Most Valuable Player honors with the Chicago Bears.

Five former North Alabama Lions went on to play in the Super Bowl during their careers in the National Football League. The first was receiver Robert Steele who played as a backup with the Dallas Cowboys in Super Bowl XIII. A pair of former Lions were in the same secondary in Super Bowl XXIV as Lewis Billups and Daryl Smith were teammates on the Cincinnati Bengals. Wide receiver Stevie Hobbs was a team captain and special teams starter on the Washington Redskins in Super Bowl XXVI and defensive tackle Shawn Lee was a starting defensive lineman for the San Diego Chargers in Super Bowl XXIX. Hobbs is the only former Lion on the winning team in the Super Bowl as Washington defeated the Buffalo Bills 37-24.

Lions Reached NCAA Football Playoffs in 12 of Last 15 Seasons:

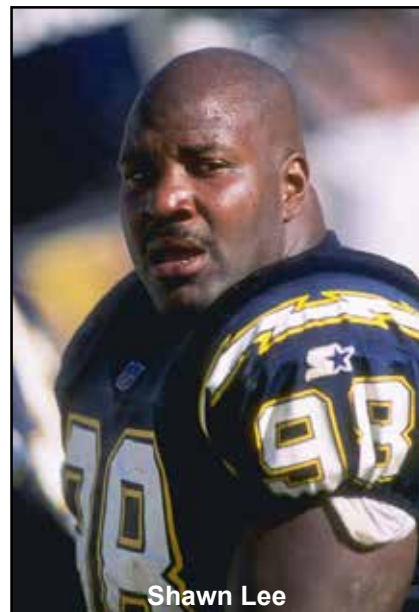
The University of North Alabama football program advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 12 of the Lions' last 15 seasons in Division II (2003, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016)

UNA's 21 All-time Football Playoff Appearances Rank Second in Division II History:

The University of North Alabama football program advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs 21 times between 1980 and 2016. It is the second most appearances in the history of the Division II playoffs by current or former members. The Lions 35 all-time playoff wins also rank second in DII history.

North Alabama's Ronald McKinnon was Inducted into College Football Hall of Fame:

Former University of North Alabama All-American linebacker Ronald McKinnon (1992-95) was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in July of 2008. His class included such notables as Joe Paterno and Doug Flutie. A three-time consensus All-American on three national championship teams, McKinnon is the only defensive player to ever be selected as the Harlon Hill Trophy winner as Division II player of the year. He went on to a 10-year NFL career where he recorded more than 1,000 tackles.

Spirit Hill

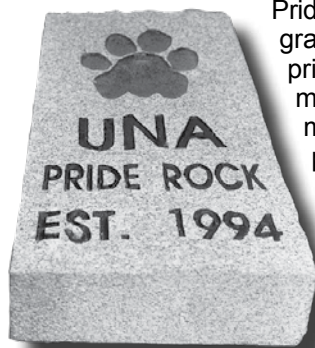
Spirit Hill is the location for UNA's pre-game tailgate parties throughout the fall. Thousands of Lion fans cover the hill, adjacent to Braly Stadium, prior to every UNA home football game. Campus organizations, alumni groups and others reserve spots on the hill, and there are also places for children's activities. Two hours prior to kickoff the UNA football players pass through on their Lion Walk into the stadium.

Lion Walk

Members of the UNA football team walk through the Spirit Hill tailgate area two hours and 15 minutes prior to all Lion home games at Braly Stadium to meet and greet fans and family members.

Pride Rock

The University of North Alabama's Pride Rock tradition at Braly Stadium began in 1994, with the rock making its first appearance at a Lion football game on Sept. 10 at Braly Stadium against Alabama A&M.



Pride Rock is a 60-pound, engraved granite stone with an actual paw print from Leo, UNA's live lion mascot. The rock is used as a motivational tool for the Lion players. It is placed just behind

the north end zone at all Lion home games and the players file past and touch the rock on their way to the field. It serves as a reminder to the current Lion players of the proud tradition that has been established at the school and of all the former players who have played a part in building that tradition. It also symbolizes the pride and unity of the team and the university.

UNA sports information director Jeff Hodges originated the idea of the Pride Rock after the home of the Pride of Lions in the movie the Lion King.

Leo's former trustee, Joe Wallace, designed the rock, and it was crafted and donated to the university by Richard Beckman of Florence Marble Works.

Webster's Ninth New Collegiate Dictionary defines pride as, 1: The quality or state of being proud; a: delight or elation arising from some act, possession, or relationship; 2: a source of pride: the best in a group or class; 3: a company of lions.

Victory Flame

The victory flame returned to the UNA campus in 1995 through the efforts of the UNA National Alumni Association. An important University symbol, the Victory Flame burned on the UNA campus from 1962 to 1986 but was extinguished with the building of the Guillot University Center. The new Victory Flame and Victory Garden stand between Bibb Graves Hall and the Memorial Amphitheater, directly across the street from the flame's former site. The flame is lit following every Lion victory or significant event in the life of the University. A miniature replica of the Victory Flame also stands atop the Lion football dressing room at Braly Stadium and is lit on game days.

UNA'S LIVE LION MASCOTS

The University of North Alabama boasts the only live Lion mascots in the country living on a college campus. Leo III and Una, born on November 18, 2002, reside on the UNA campus in the 12,764 square-foot George H. Carroll Lion Habitat and carry on a tradition that has covered more than 40 years.

On July 22, 1974, former UNA president Dr. Robert M. Guillot brought a 35-pound lion cub to the campus and Leo spent the next 14 years "roaring" the school to victory. The original Leo died on Jan. 20, 1988, and a great outpouring of support from the Shoals community resulted in Leo II being brought to UNA in July of 1988.

Leo II lived in the compound that once housed the original Leo and grew to a weight of more than 600 pounds at eleven years of age. In 1997, Leo II was selected as the nation's "Second Best Mascot" by Sports Illustrated. He died in February of 2000.

Approaching their 17th birthdays, Leo III and Una are exhibited seven days a week from approximately 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. (weather conditions permitting), unless they are appearing in local venues.

In 2012 Leo III and UNA were ranked No. 1 of the 25 Best Real Animal Mascots in College Football by totalprosports.com. UNA was the only non-Division I institution to make the list, joining the company of competitive NCAA teams such as the Baylor Bears, LSU Tigers and Texas Longhorns.

All funds associated with the care and feeding of Leo III and UNA, the operation of their habitat, and the conduct of a related educational program are funded exclusively by charitable contributions.
