TODAY'S GAME

- ▶ Today is the fifth meeting all-time between the Owls and the Hawks, with Kennesaw State winning all four previous meetings. KSU comes into the game with a six-game winning streak while the Hawks have won four consecutive contests.
- ▶ The winner of today's game will remain as one of the two unbeaten teams in the conference, the other, Campbell (3-0) is facing North Alabama at 1:30 PM.
- ▶ Monmouth is coming off a 35-13 win over Charleston Southern and has the conference's top passer and nation's top running back in Kenji Bahar and Pete Guerriero, respectively. The Hawks and Owls have the top-two scoring defenses, total defenses and total offenses in the Big South.
- ▶ Kennesaw State is one of two schools in the country ranked in the top five in both scoring offense and scoring defense.
- ▶ The Hawks are looking to open the Big South season with four consecutive wins for the second time while Kennesaw State puts its 13-game conference unbeaten streak on the line.
- ▶ The game can be heard on the Shore Sports Network with Matt Harmon (pxp) and Eddy Occhipinti (analyst) on the call.

MONMOUTH AGAINST THE BIG SOUTH

- Since starting up Big South league play in 2014, Monmouth owns an 15-14 conference record, however is 11-2 since 2017.
- The Hawks own a 5-1 record against Gardner-Webb, 1-0 against Campbell, 4-2 against PC, 3-3 vs CSU and 0-4 vs Kennesaw State. The Hawks are also 2-0 against Hampton but those were non-conference contests. Monmouth has yet to face Northern Alabama.
- Monmouth has finished each of the last two seasons in second place in the Big South, and was selected second in the preseason poll.
- MU was 0-3 against members of the Big South prior to joining the league, including dropping a home and home series with Coastal Carolina and a non-conference tilt with the Flames.
- Today's game is the fourth conference tilt of the season for Monmouth, who are looking to win four straight to start Big South play for the second time in school history (2017).

INSIDE THE MONMOUTH-KENNESAW STATE SERIES

- Today's game marks the fifth time that Kennesaw and Monmouth have met, with KSU winning all four of the previous matchups. The Hawks held a 14-7 lead in the second quarter but KSU scored 44 unanswered points including pitching a shutout in the second half to win its second Big South title.
- The teams first met in 2015 down at Kennesaw. The Hawks struck first on a 12 yard Darren Ambush TD but KSU held Monmouth out of the endzone for the next 46+ minutes building a 23-7 lead in the process. Zach Welch had 112 yards on 16 carries in the contest for the Blue & White. KSU had 341 yards rushing with two 100+ yard rushers on the day.

GUERRIERO EARNS BIG SOUTH OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Pete PGuerriero ran for a career-high 221 yards in Monmouth's 35-13 win at Charleston Southern on Saturday, earning him Big South Offensive Player of the Week honors. The junior averaged 10.0 yards per carry and scored his ninth touchdown in the last 10 games on a 42 yard run. He currently leads the Big South in rushing and rushing yards per game. His 1,022 yards through eight games is the ninth most in school history and is 39 yards away from his career high. On his final run of the night he became the second Hawk to surpass the 3,000-yard plateau. He is the second Monmouth player to earn Offensive Player of the Week in the last two weeks with Kenji Bahar taking home the honors last week.

BAHAR SETS MULTIPLE MONMOUTH PASSING RECORDS

On his second pass of the night, a 36 yard touchdown to Terrance Greene Jr., Monmouth senior quarterback Kenji Bahar surpassed Brian Boland for the most passing yards in school history. A week before he became the MU leader in career pass attempts and on his eighth completion against CSU he set that career record as well. His 8,256 yards is more than any other Monmouth player and he needs just three touchdown passes to surge past Brian Boland on in that category.

DID YOU KNOW?

In the last three weeks Monmouth running back Pete Guerriero has scored on runs of 48, 65, 58 and 42 yards. Guerriero, who has 1,022 yards this season, is the only FCS running back to eclipse the 1,000-yard plateau this season. In Saturday's win he had seven rushes of over 10 yards.

HEAD COACH BRIAN BOHANNON



Brian Bohannon was introduced as the first head coach in Kennesaw State history in March of 2013. In five years he has turned a brand new program in a nationally-ranked, championship winning team with a 44-13 record. A native of Griffin, Ga., Bohannon has 18 seasons of coaching experience at the FBS and FCS levels, all of which have come while

working with Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson. Most recently Bohannon served as quarterbacks/B backs coach at Georgia Tech under Johnson. He has also coached at Navy and Georgia Southern. A four-year letter winner and standout as a wide receiver at Georgia, Bohannon started his coaching career at West Georgia before earning his first full-time position at Gardner-Webb (N.C.) as wide receivers coach in 1996.

THE LAST MEETING

WEST LONG BRANCH, NJ - Behind 412 rushing yards and 44 unanswered points, Kennesaw State defeated the Monmouth University football team to win the Big South Championship on Saturday, 51-14 Monmouth went ahead 14-7 with 11:22 left in the second quarter, but the Owls would score the next six touchdowns to go along with a 40-yard field goal to win their second straight conference title. Kennesaw State converted 69% of its third down opportunities, and held the Hawks to just 29%. Owls running back Darnell Holland rushed nine times for 195 yards and three touchdowns, while quarterback Chandler Burks extending his FCS-leading rushing touchdown total to 26. The Hawks lose at home for the first time since October 29, 2016, snapping a 10-game streak. Sophomore Pete Guerriero and freshman Juwon Farri each scored a rushing touchdown in the loss.

NOTES

■ Kennesaw State's first drive used 6:15 off the clock, as the Owls went 72 yards in 11 plays to take a 7-0 lead. Six different players rushed the ball, including 23 yards and a touchdown from Darnell Holland.

- Monmouth answered on the next drive with a 12-play, 65-yard march ending in a Guerriero 5-yard touchdown. The Hawks converted two fourth downs on the drive, including a 29-yard rush from Bahar on fourth-and-4 and a seven yard pass to Grasso on fourth-and-3.
- In the second quarter Monmouth Juwon Farri took over with a six-yard rush, a 20-yard rush, and a nine-yard touchdown run. The Hawks took a 14-7 advantage after the nine-play, 72-yard
- The Hawks went three-and-out on the next drive, and Kennesaw got the ball on their own 32 after the punt. Burks passed for 36 yards to help the Owls get down to Monmouth's 23, and Justin Thompson made a 40yard field goal with time expiring. At the end of the first half, Kennesaw State led 17-14.
- After the Kennesaw State defense forced a three-and-out to open the second half, the Owls rushed 10 times for 66 yards and another Burks touchdown. They led 24-14 with 8:01 left in the third

NUMBERS CRUNCH

- In the third quarter, Kennesaw outgained Monmouth 132-10 and went 4-for-5 on third and fourth down plays. The Owls outscored Monmouth 34-0 in the second half.
- Senior Vinny Grasso now has 260 punt return yards this season, which breaks a school record Adam San Miguel (2006) and Kevin Faulkner (2002) previously held the record of 257.
- Junior Tymere Berry, senior Diego Zubieta, and junior Kahari Scarlett each totaled eight tackles.
- Guerriero has 16 rushing touchdowns in 19 career games.
 Farri scored his seventh touchdown in his 10th career game.
- White Jr. is 18 yards away from setting the Big South all-time receiving yards record. He already holds the Big South and Monmouth receptions record (239), as well as the Monmouth yards record (3,153)
- Mosquera has made his last 37 extra points, including 33-33 this year.

NOTES ON THE CHARLESTON SOUTHERN GAME

- Monmouth won its third straight Big South Conference game with a 35-13 win against Charleston Southern. The Hawks have now won three straight against the Bucs to even the all-time series at 3-3.
- **Kenji Bahar** threw three touchdowns in the contest, including two to Shawn Clark, the first multiple-touchdown reception game of the tight end's career.
- Monmouth is 15-14 all-time in league play, the first time the Hawks have been above .500 since joining the league in 2014.
- The Hawks led in time of possession 32:09 to 27:51, marking the eighth straight game that Monmouth has led in time of possession this season.
- **Pete Guerriero** finished with a career-high 221 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries for an impressive 10 yards per carry. In the last two weeks Guerriero has rushed for 407 yards on 42 carries for a 9.69 average and three TDs.
- Monmouth racked up 539 yards of offense compared to 371 for CSU. In the last two games the Hawk offensive unit has rolled up 1,138 yards.
- Guerriero recorded 161 yards of his night in the second half.
- Guerriero and **Devell Jones** both recorded touchdowns against Charleston Southern. They each now have 25 career touchdowns which is fifth at MU. Their 150 points ties them for 10th in the Monmouth history books.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Monmouth quarterback **Kenji Bahar's** 42 games played is second all-time, trailing only all-time leader Brian Boland (44) for the most games played by a MU signal caller. His 34 career starts is also second all time.
- After throwing for a trio of scores against CSU, Bahar now has 56 career touchdown passes which ranks him second all-time at Monmouth (4th in the Big South). He needs two more to tie all-time leader Brian Boland with 58. His 16 TD passes this season is tied for eighth most in a single season at Monmouth.
- Gueriero's 1,022 yards leads the FCS. He is the only FCS player with more than 1,000 yards and is one of six Division I players with over 1k.
- \blacksquare With his 127.4 rushing yards per game Guerriero leads the Big South and ranks second in the NCAA.
- Guerriero is one of two active players in the Big South with over 3,000 all-purpose yards (3,627) recently moving past Lavon Chaney for second all-time at Monmouth. His 129.5 all-purpose yards per game is fifth among active FCS players. His career 107.2 yards per game is third among active rushers.
- The Hawks rank second in the Big South (Hampton) in time of possession and 12th in the NCAA averaging 32:28 per contest in 2019.
- The MU offense have converted 15 of 20 fourth down attempts (.750) which ranks seventh in the NCAA. Of all the team's in the top-10 in percentage, only the Citadel has more attempts (24).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- After eight games Monmouth's defense now has 16 sacks and 12 turnovers after having 11 sacks and 11 turnovers in 11 games last season.
- **Anthony Budd** ranks third in the NCAA in interceptions with five in eight games. His five interceptions is tied for second most in the nation.
- Linebacker **Da'Quan Grimes** is fifth in the FCS with three forced fumbles this season. He recorded all three of those in the first six games of the season.
- The Hawks currently have six players with 100+ tackles, led by senior **Tymere Berry** with 166 stops. Most recently junior **Justin Terry** joined with his six-tackle effort against CSU. Next in line to hit triple digits is **Grimes** with 99 career tackles.
- Monmouth's defense is allowing just 104.5 rushing yards per game which ranks the Hawks 14th in all of FCS and second in the Big South Conference.
- **Eric Massey** is the team's current actively leader with 12.0 tackles for a loss, including a career-best seven this season. Massey is tied for first on the team for active sack leaders with 5.5 along with **Kahari Scarlett**.
- Freshman **Davis Smith** had nine tackles in the win over CSU, two shy of his career high. Smith had seven solo stops and a pass break up in his third career start.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Despite not having a kickoff return against CSU, Moore IV moved into second place all-time for kickoff return yards. He's up to 1,111 in his career, just 244 yards behind the leader Mike Avent (2007-10).
- Placekicker **Matt Mosquera** went five-for-five on PATs, pushing his season totals to 27-of-28. He leads the team with 51 points and has 167 points which is ninth all-time at Monmouth. He needs 21 more points to tie Reggie White Jr. for eighth.
- Sophomore punt returner **Eddie Morales III** currently ranks first in the Big South in punt returns and in yardage with 13 and 120, respectively.

MONMOUTH EXTRA POINTS

- Tymere Berry ranks fifth in the Big South history with 27 career pass breakups. Berry ranks third all-time at Monmouth in passes defended with 32.
- Monmouth's defense has allowed just two 100-yard rushers all season (Montana, Gardner-Webb).
- ▶ Lonnie Moore IV has averaged 25.9 yards per kickoff return this season and currently has 389 kick return yards which is 10th most in a single season. He is third in average and yardage in the Big South in 2019.
- ▶ Kenji Bahar set the Monmouth record for total offense last season with 2,769 yards. He currently has 2,142 which sets right outside the top-10.
- Bahar now ranks first or second in every major career passing category.
- Guerriero has now recorded 16 100yard rushing performances in his 28 games, which is second all-time behind David Sinisi (25)
- Bahar has thrown a touchdown pass in 25 of his last 26 games, failing to throw one in the 2018 season opener against Eastern Michigan and Kennesaw State.
- Guerriero has scored a rushing touchdown in nine of his last 10 games.
- Bahar moved into the Big South's alltime Top 10 for career passing yards during Week 1 and is now fifth on the list with 8,000 yards. He needs 175 yards to move into fourth place.
- ▶ Monmouth junior cornerback **Justin** Terry recently moved into the top-10 with 23 passes defended. Terry has 21 pass breakups and two interceptions in 29 career games for the Blue & White. He is one of two active players on the top-10 list for passes defended.

CHARLESTON, SC- Monmouth University senior quarterback Kenii Bahar became the school's all-time passing leader as the Hawks improved to 6-2 (3-0 Big South) with a 35-13 win over Charleston Southern (2-6, 0-2 Big South) on Saturday night.

Bahar threw for 194 yards and three touchdowns to pass Brian Boland as the Monmouth leader in passing yards. The fifth-year senior now has

8,000 yards passing for the Blue & White. Running back Pete Guerriero finished with a career-high 221 yards rushing on 22 carries with a touchdown. His 221 yards is the fourth most in school history. He now has 1,022 yards on the season, his second career 1,000-yard game.

Monmouth, who has won three straight in the series, has oustcored CSU 72-16 in the last two games.

On Bahar's second completion of the game he uncorked a 36-yard pass perfectly to Terrance Greene Jr to put move past Boland for first in the MU annals. The reception also put the Hawks up 7-0 just 12:18 into play.

With Monmouth driving on their second posession a tipped ball was intercepted and returned to the MU 42. CSU moved deep into Monmouth territory on an inside run but the defense forced a 33-yard Alex Usry field goal to preserve a 7-3 lead.

After a Ryan Kost punt put the Bucs back on their own two, CSU drove 88 yards on 16 plays but the Monmouth defense stiffened again, forcing a 27-yard field goal. The Hawks answered with an eight-play 58 yard drive that ended in MU's second touchdown of the contest. On the drive Lonnie Moore had a 17-yard reception and a 19-yard run to set the Hawks up deep in CSU territory. After Devell Jones converted a fourth and one, Bahar hit Shawn Clark for a 13 yard touchdown to put MU ahead 14-6 late in the second.

The Hawks went up 21-6 in the third quarter on a four-yard Jones touchdown which was setup by a Guerriero 63 yard scamper. The Hawks expanded that lead on a play action pass from Bahar to Clark, putting Monmouth up 28-6. Guerriero finished the scoring for the Blue & White with a 42 yard run with 5:08 to play. CSU finally reached the endzone with 4:01 remaining on a Jack Chambers scramble.

NOTES

- The first quarter interception was the first turnover in two games for the Hawks
- Pete Guerriero went over 100 yards for the fifth time this season and 16th of his career
- Guerriero's 63-yard run in the third quarter was the second longest run of the season for the redshirt junior behind last week's 65 yarder.
- Justin Terry recorded his 23rd career pass defended which ties him for 10th all time with former Hawk Mike Pitts
- Shawn Clark scored a pair of touchdowns in the same game for the first time in his career
- Bahar has now thrown 56 career touchdown passes, two away from tying Brian Boland for most all-time for the Blue & White
- Senior linebacker Evan Powell ended a drive deep in Monmouth territory with a strip sack of Jack Chambers, also recovering the ball.

HEAD COACH KEVIN CALLAHAN





The only head coach in the history of football at Monmouth, Kevin Callahan has developed a winning tradition in West Long Branch. Callahan, whose 158 wins is 8th among active coaches at the FCS level, has guided a once fledgling non-scholarship program to the Big South Conference and its first NCAA playoff berth in 2017. He is one of three FCS coaches with 150+ wins all at one institution and his 26 years as a head coach is the seventh most among

active coaches.

Currently in his 27th season at the helm of the Hawks, Callahan has amassed a 158-123 record while his teams have captured five conference titles. Along the way, Monmouth has been ranked among the top 20 in total offense on three occasions and in total defense five times. Meanwhile, over 140 players have earned conference recognition, while numerous Hawks have earned regional and national honors. Regarded as an outstanding coach by his peers, Callahan served as the President of the FCS Football Coaches Committee in 2007-08 and served a 10-year term as a member of the committee. Under his watch, 12 former Hawks have earned spots on NFL rosters, including Super Bowl Champion Chris Hogan and Miles Austin who was an All-Pro wide receiver for the Dallas Cowboys.

Academically, Callahan's squads have consistently performed at a high level. Eleven players have been named to the prestigious FCS ADA Academic All-Star team (average of 55 FCS players selected per season) a total 14 times. Monmouth has had at least one representative on the Capital One Academic All-District Team in 15 of the last 16 seasons, including three-time selection Joe Johnson who was also a two-time Big South All-Academic Team member. Monmouth has ranked either first or second among Big South schools in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last three seasons that data has been available.

In 2018 Monmouth's offense was one of the top in all of the FCS setting over 15 individual and team records. The Hawks completed their second consecutive eight-win season while finishing second in the Big South. A Monmouth record 12 Hawks earned spots on the All-Big South Team while freshman running back Juwon Farri earned Big South Offensive Freshman of the Year and finished fifth in the Jerry Rice Award voting. Wideout Reggie White Jr. set almost every single-season and career receiving mark and his efforts were rewarded with numerous All-America nods and a free agent contract with the New York Giants.

The Hawks took another huge step in 2017, opening the brand new 16 million dollar Kessler Stadium, earning its first national ranking and its first NCAA Playoff berth. Callahan guided the Hawks to a 9-3 overall record, including a 4-1 mark in the Big South, and faced Northern Iowa in the NCAA First Round. In addition to going 5-0 at home, the Hawks strung together a seven-game win streak heading into the final game of the regular season.

For his efforts, Callahan finished 10th in the voting for the Eddie Robinson Award, handed out to the nation's top FCS Coach. Under his tutelage, Mike Basile became the most decorated player in Monmouth history, earning consensus All-America honors including First Team accolades from the

Associated Press. Basile, who was named as the FCS's top defensive back by the FCS ADA, led nine players on All-Big South teams, including freshman Pete Guerriero who was a first team selection at both running back and kick returner. Guerriero was the Big South's Co-Freshman of the Year and was named to two All-American teams.

The honors didn't stop there for Basile and Guerriero, with each being named as finalists for national awards, with the former earning a sixth place finish in the voting for the Buck Buchanan Award (Nation's top defensive player).

Prior to accepting the head coaching position at Monmouth in August of 1992, Callahan served as assistant coach at Colgate University for eight seasons. While with the Raiders, Callahan served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, while tutoring the linebackers secondary. Callahan and his defensive aroomed coordinating skills at Wagner College from 1981 to 1983. In 1980, Callahan served as an assistant coach prior to accepting the head coaching position at Monmouth in August of 1992, Callahan served as assistant coach at Colgate University for eight seasons. While with the Raiders, Callahan served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, while the linebackers tutoring and secondary. Callahan his defensive coordinating skills at Wagner College from 1981 to 1983. In 1980, Callahan served as an assistant coach under Frank Maloney at Syracuse University. He served as the assistant offensive backfield

coach for the Orangemen.

A native of Elmira, N.Y., Callahan began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for three seasons at the University of Albany from 1977 to 1979. Callahan was a two-year standout defensive back at the University of Rochester. He earned a bachelor's degree in history from Rochester in 1977.

Callahan and his wife, Ann Marie, reside in Spring Lake Heights. They have two children, Kevin Jr. and Julia. His son Kevin Jr, a five-year veteran of collegiate coaching, recently joined the Hawk coaching staff mentoring the wideouts.

Construction began on the Kessler Stadium project prior to the start of the 2016 football season, with the old structure being completely removed days after Monmouth's last home game on Oct. 29. The new stadium features more than 4,200 seats, including 800 chair-back seats, and stretches from endzone to endzone. The facility includes full concourse with concession stands and bathrooms, a state-of-theart press box, multimedia booths, coaches' booths and a ticket office.

For the opening of the Monmouth Hawks' first football season in 1993, a 3,000-seat grandstand with press box was built. Alumni John and Henni Kantor Kessler, class of 1969 and 1968, respectively, donated \$250,000 toward construction. Kessler Field was built in 1993 and opened for the Hawks' inaugural season. On September 25, 1993, the first-ever game was played at Kessler Field as the Hawks hosted Sacred Heart University. Incidentally, the Pioneers won the coin toss and elected to receive the ball, which was kicked off by Randy Brewster at 1:06 p.m. The Hawks' first offensive play was a reverse, resulting in a four-yard gain by William Holder. Sacred Heart posted a 12-0 shutout in the contest.

Although the facility officially seats 4,600 fans, a record crowd of 6,233 packed Kessler Field on Homecoming Weekend in 1993. The spectators witnessed a barnburner as the Hawks fell to Hartwick, 17-13. On December 2, 2007 Kessler Field hosted the Inaugural Gridiron Classic.

HENNI KANTOR KESSLER & JOHN H. KESSLER

This season will mark the second season of football in Henni Kantor Kessler & John H. Kessler Stadium. On July 10, 2017 the Kesslers announced a seven-figure gift to name Monmouth's brand new stadium. The Kesslers were members of the original "Touchdown Club," which helped bring football to the school back in 1992. Henni and John pledged the first gift to get the original Kessler Field built, and saw more than 350,000 fans support 109 football games over the first 24 years of the program. The Kesslers have been involved with Monmouth University since arriving on campus as students. Both Henni and John have a long history with Hawk athletics, Henni serving as captain of the cheerleading team while John played baseball for the Blue & White. Henni is a former trustee and member of the University's Society of Trustees, while John is a trustee emeritus.

KENJI BAHAR NAMED BIG SOUTH PRESEASON OFFENSIVE POY

- Senior quarterback Kenji Bahar has been named Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year. Bahar led the league in almost every passing category a season ago en route to setting the Monmouth single season passing record with 2,626 yards in 11 games.
- Bahar, Monmouth's first preseason offensive player of the year, was also named to the Walter Payton Watch List the FCS version of the Heisman.
- In addition to the Big South Honor, the fifth-year senior who has started 26 consecutive games for the Blue & White, was named to the NFLPA Bowl Watch List and as a CFPA Performer of the Year Watch List.

HAWKS SELECTED SECOND IN PRESEASON POLL

Monmouth University was selected to finish second in the 2018 Big South Conference preseason poll, tied for the highest it has been selected since joining the league in 2014. The Hawks received five first place votes, the most in program history.

HAWKS SELECT TEAM CAPTAINS

Fifth-year senior quarterback **Kenji Bahar**, senior linebacker **Evan Powell**, fifth-year senior defensive back **Tymere Berry** and fifth-year senior **John Gallina** have been named as team captains for the 2019 season. Berry is the only returning captain and the move to four captains is a departure from the last two seasons when MU had two season captains and two game captains.

GUERRIERO RUSHES INTO SECOND IN MONMOUTH RECORD BOOKS

Junior running back Pete Guerriero moved into second all-time at Monmouth in rushing with 2,594 yards. He went over 100 all-purpose yards for the fifth time this season while finishing with 11 carries for 81 yards with a 48 yard touchdown. He came into the game just 63 yards shy of second place and Julian Hayes but now trails David Sinisi by 2,457 yards for first all-time. He is now 11th all-time in Big South history in rushing and needs just 29 to move into 10th place all-time.

AUMER NAMED AS AFCA ALLSTATE GOODWORKS NOMINEE

Junior defensive lineman **Kurt Aumer** recently became the second Monmouth player to be named as a AFCA AllState Goodworks Team Nominee (Ryan Wetzel, 2018). Off of the field, Aumer is in involved with almost every community service project that the team is involved with. For the second straight year he was an integral part of the Monmouth's "Be the Match" campaign, a national football program that matches donors to patients with blood cancers. Aumer is also heavily involved with Monmouth Football's Team Impact effort, mentoring and spending time with the Hawks' selected teammate. He spent hours in January reading to children as part of the 'Read Across America' and he annually participates in the Schroth School for Children Holiday Party and Super Bowl Party. He is part of the Monmouth SAAC Executive board and one of the Co-Founders and MSAAC Representative of the Peer Mentor Program starting this fall called FLIGHT Academy.

GUERRIERO BECOMES THE FASTEST HAWK TO 2,000 YARDS

Monmouth University junior running back Pete Guerriero became the fastest Hawk to reach 2,000 yards rushing - in both games played and carries- when he took his fourth carry of last week's game for eight yards on third down. Guerriero moved past all-time great David Sinisi, achieving the feat in two less games and an astonishing 66 less carries. Guerriero is currently sixth all-time in rushing with 2,086 yards and is on pace to be second all-time by mid-season.
