TOP STORYLINES

- · Kennesaw State continues its road trip to begin the 2018 when it travels to Cookeville, Tenn, to take on Tennessee Tech in the second half of a home-and-home series.
- · With the game being broadcast live on ESPNU, Thursday's matchup marks the first national television game for the Owls.
- Kennesaw State is looking to snap a twogame losing streak that dates back to the end of last season.
- · The Owls took on their first FBS opponent in program history to start the season, losing a heartbreaker to Georgia State, 24-20, despite leading in many statistical categories.
- Kennesaw State hasn't lost a regular-season game to an FCS opponent since August 31, 2017 when it fell to Samford, 28-23 (371 days).

- Kennesaw State's 26 wins through three years marks the second-most dominant start to a program since 2008 and joins Old Dominion as the only other startup to produce winning seasons in its first three years. (see "Winningest Starts, First 3 Years" on p. 4)
- · Kennesaw State's Anthony Gore, Jr. and Bryson Armstrong led the way for all Big South defenders in Week 1, standing alone at the top with nine total tackles.
- The Owls have forced a turnover in 15-straight games dating back to last season when the team led the nation in turnover margin (+1.64)
- · Kennesaw State is 1-0 when playing in the state of Tennessee and 2-1 overall when playing teams hailing from the state of Tennessee. (see "Kennesaw State vs. Opponents from Tennessee on p. 3)

A KENNESAW STATE WIN WOULD...

- up it to 1-1 on the season and 1-1 on the road.
- up it to 2-0 against Tennessee Tech over-
- be its 13th win in its last 15 games overall.
- be its sixth road victory in its last eight trips.
- improve it to 3-1 when facing opponents from the state of Tennessee and 2-0 when playing in the Volunteer State.
- up it to 9-2 all-time in the month of September and 20-5 in night games (after 6 p.m.).

A KENNESAW STATE LOSS WOULD...

- drop it to 0-2 on the season.
- drop it to 0-2 for the first time in program history.
- create only its third losing streak in program history.
- snap its 12-game regular-season winning streak against FCS opponents.
- drop it to 8-3 all-time in September and 19-6 in night games (after 6 p.m.).

NOTING TENNESSEE TECH

- The Tennessee Tech Eagles are coming off a disappointing season and are hoping for a new start with first-year head coach Dewayne Alexander.
- The Eagles finished last in the Ohio Valley Conference last year, mustering just a 1-10 record overall, 1-7 in conference action.
- Alexander joins his alma mater, TTU, as the 12th head coach in program history, previously serving at East Tennessee State, Cumberland University and Tennessee Tech (GA, D-Line Coach, Assistant Head Coach/ O-Line Coach, and Active Head Coach).
- The Eagles dropped a tough season-opener against in-state rival Chattanooga last Thursday as part of three-straight Thursday night games to start 2018.
- After a nearly three-hour weather delay (2:45 officially), Tennessee Tech fell to the Mocs, 34-10.
- TTU was led by freshman Bailey Fisher, who finished 10-26 with 117 yards. Unfortunately for the Eagles, his two interceptions proved costly to the end result.
- Fisher also accounted for a team-best 78 rushing yards off 11 carries, but also committed one fumble that was lost.

- Despite the youth in the backfield, Tennessee Tech's most dangerous option is junior Andrew Goldsmith, who led the team in Week 1 with 63 yards off three catches.
- Goldsmith led the team in rushing last season with 589 yards on 116 carries, including three touchdowns. He also finished third on the team in receiving at 15 catches for 164 yards.
- Freshman Jeremiah Edwards also hauled in a 44-yard reception in the effort.
- Defensively, the Eagles were anchored by veterans against Chattanooga. Redshirt junior Josh Poplar led the defense with eight tackles (five solo) and an interception for 14 yards.
- In all, four Eagles recorded five or more tackles on the night, including senior Tim Collins who got behind the line of scrimmage twice for two sacks for 14 yards of loss

2018 KENNESAW STATE FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

- The keys to the 27-14 win were plainly that the Owls forced five turnovers overall and rushed for 309 yards.
- The game was played before a rockin' sold-out crowd of 8,418 strong.
- Darnell Holland posted a career-high 129 rushing yards, averaging an astounding 32.2 yards per carry.
- Bryson Armstrong led the defensive effort, making nine tackles, one sack and recovering one fumble.
- Dorian Walker sealed the victory in the waning moments when he intercepted a TTU pass in the endzone that wouldn't cut it to a one-score game.
- Also recording interceptions on the night was Brenton Wimberly and Taylor Henkle. Henkle also recovered a fumble.
- The Owls posted a 17-0 points-off-turnover margin that ultimately made the big difference.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S LOSS TO GSU

- Georgia State scored 10 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to escape Kennesaw State on Aug. 30, 24-20.
- The game marked the first FBS opponent for the Owls.
- Kennesaw State was led by **Chandler Burks**, who recorded his third-career 200-yard passing game, finishing 12-for-19 with 201 yards, one touchdown and one interception.
- **Justin Sumpter** was the main receiving target on the night, falling just 5 yards shy of his fourth-career 100-yard receiving game. He hauled in seven receptions for 95 yards and a 23-yard touchdown.
- In addition to posting a career-high 63 yards -- including a career-long 60-yard reception -- receiving, **Shaquil Terry** led the ground attack with seven carries for 61 yards.
- Defensively, the younger Owls looked promising. The team held Georgia State to just 128 rushing yards.
- While the Panthers were able to amass 187 yards passing, the KSU backs were able to keep Georgia State from the big plays, not allowing a single 20-yard pass and only allowing two 18-yard passes overall.
- Anthony Gore, Jr. led the pack with nine tackles (all solo), two for loss and one sack, while **Bryson Armstrong** also finished with nine tackles (five solo) and 0.5 sacks.
- Transfer **Le'Vonte Larry** made a memorable debut when he forced a fumble in GSU's lone redzone appearance of the first quarter. Furthermore, the force allowed **Peyton Moore** to recover his first career fumble.

• The game marked the first time in program history that the Owls have lost a game in which they led at the end of the third quarter. Kennesaw State was previously a perfect 24-0 in closing out games.

KSU vs. TEAMS FROM TENNESSEE

- Kennesaw State has faced two opponents from the state of Tennessee in its three years of existence -- East Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech.
- The Owls currently own a 2-1 against the opponents, with its lone loss coming against ETSU in the 2016 home-opener -- a double-OT thriller at Fifth Third Bank Stadi-
- When playing in the Volunteer State, KSU is 1-0, having routed East Tennessee State on the road, 56-16 during the inaugural season for the Owls.

BIG SOUTH RECORD SETTERS

- Just the second Big South member to appear in the FCS Playoff quarterfinals

 joining Coastal Carolina (twice) and Charleston Southern — Kennesaw State made its mark in the conference record books in its third season.
- The Owls rushed for a league singleseason record 4,623 yards — becoming the first 4,000-yard rushing team in Big South history.
- The country's most prolific ground attack last season, KSU set conference records in rushing first downs (216) and most 300-yard rushing games (11).
- Overall, the Owls accrued 6,092 yards of total offense (ranking third-best all-time) to match the league-record 479.5 ypg average.
- Kennesaw State's stingy defense tied the Big South record for scoring defense, allowing a paltry 15.5 points/game.
- No Big South member team had allowed less points in league play than the Owls, who gave up just 52 points total (10.4 ppg).
- Pressure and the Plank were key members of the defense, tying conference records for quarterback sacks (31) and interceptions (27).
- In a total-team effort, Kennesaw State set the turnover margin record with +23 for the year.
- Graduate quarterback **Chandler Burks** became the first Big South signal-caller to rush for 1,000 yards and pass for 1,000 yards in the same season.

- Burks also set the league record for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback (18), while falling just two shy of the record for most touchdowns responsible for in a single season, finishing with 27 (18 rush, nine pass).
- Senior placekicker **Justin Thompson** fell just five points shy of being the all-time scoring kicker for a single season (103 points).
- Sophomore **Bryson Armstrong** set the single-season record for quarterback sacks by recording 11.0 unassisted for an overall loss of 79 yards.

WINNINGEST THREE-YEAR STARTS

- Since 2008, Kennesaw State's 26 victories in its first three seasons are second among all NCAA Division I startups.
- Only Kennesaw State and Old Dominion were successful enough to secure winning seasons in each of its first three years.
- The Owls' 12 wins is the most for any FCS program in its third year sponsoring football.

HOME-FIELD DOMINANCE

- Despite only hosting three years of football, Kennesaw State's Fifth Third Bank Stadium has become one of the tougher venues to play in.
- During its 12-game win streak last season, the Owls trounced seven opponents in front of its home crowd, including the first-round FCS Playoffs matchup against Samford.
- Kennesaw State hasn't lost a game at home since Oct. 15, 2016 vs. Liberty (21-36).
- In total, the Owls have rattled off ninestraight home victories and are 16-3 overall at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.
- Over the course of the nine-game winning streak, Kennesaw State has outscored opponents 349-102; outrushed teams 3,172-839; thrown just one interception, while picking off 15; and converted on 50.4 percent of third downs, while holding opponents to 34.2 percent.

SUNTRUST SHOWDOWN

• Kennesaw State announced last year its highly anticipated 2018 regular-season finale against Jacksonville State would be the first football matchup hosted at the home of the Atlanta Braves, SunTrust Park.

• The contest marks just the 17th FCS football game at a professional sports venue since 2010.

OFFENSE

- Kennesaw State ranked third in the conference in scoring offense (20) and third in scoring defense (24) after just the first week of action.
- Only Campbell and Gardner-Webb scored more touchdowns (7).
- The Owls finished with uncharacteristically low rushing numbers in the first game, but did manage 201 passing yards for only the third time in the last two years.
- Through the 201 yards through the air, KSU kept efficient, ranking second in the Big South in pass efficiency at 158.90 (12-19-1, 1 TD). Nobody in the league completed a better percentage than its 63.2 percent.
- Early in the year, Kennesaw State has gone after the fourth-down conversion, getting 66.7 percent (4-for-6) of them to rank second in the conference and 23rd in the nation.
- Last season, Kennesaw State touted the country's leading rushing attack last year, gaining 4,623 yards on 816 attempts (330.2/game) en route to a national-best 216 first downs via the ground.
- The Owls also sported the Big South's top offense overall, leading in rushing offense, scoring (30.1 points/game; 421 total points) and total offense (435.1 yards/game).

"WE RUN THIS STATE"

 After posting the top rushing attack in the nation last season, Kennesaw State has made it clear that it intends to lead the state of Georgia in the ground game.

- Among the seven Division I Georgia schools, Kennesaw State also led in rushing first downs (216 43 more than No. 2 UGA).
- The Owls ranked second in the state in rushing touchdowns (41 one shy of UGA) and yards/attempt (5.7 0.1 shy of UGA).
- Kennesaw State's spread option offense gives its drives a March of Death reputation.
- After just Week 1, the Owls led the Big South in time of possession at 32:37.
- Close in proximity and style to its ACC neighbor Georgia Tech, Kennesaw State only trailed the Yellow Jackets by eight seconds of possession (33:30/game).
- The Owls led the Big South and ranked eighth in the FCS (33:22/game).

• No matter the opponent's defensive numbers, KSU would still put up gaudy run numbers on teams.

• Scoring from the Owls comes from all sides of the field. Entering 2018, four of the six players to account for more than 100 career points are starters.

QUARTERBACK

- The graduate quarterback **Chandler Burks** started off the 2018 campaign with a bang, throwing darts all night long against Georgia State last week.
- Burks threw a career- and program-high 12-for-19 for 201 yards and one touchdown -- his third 200-yard passing game of his career.
- In his last two home-openers, Burks has gone 32-41-2 for 426 yards, one touchdown.
- Burks' lone mistake on the night came with less than a minute to go in the first half.
- On a first-and-10, Burks found a cutting Sumpter, but placed the ball behind him, allowing GSU to intercept the pass and eventually turn that into a game-tying touchdown.
- The last time that Burks faced Tennessee Tech, the then-senior finished 5-for-8 for 88 yards and one touchdown, while also taking 15 carries for 67 yards on the night.
- Against the Big South, he finished second in total offense (237 yards), second in passing yards (201), second in yards/completion (16.8 -- 10th in FCS) and second in efficiency (158.9).
- Nobody finished with a higher completion percentage than Burks in the conference (63.2).
- En route to becoming the first player in league history to be voted both the Big South Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year in the same season, Burks directed the nation's top rushing attack.

- A Walter Payton Award finalist, Burks coled the nation with 18 rushing touchdowns

 good for third-best among all Division I quarterbacks (FCS or FBS).
- Burks exploded for a nationally lauded performance in the Owls' regular-season finale showdown against Monmouth when he tied the conference record with four rushing TDs and 245 yards of offense.
- The then-senior topped the Big South in scoring (108 points) and rushing yards (1,103), while finishing second in TD's responsible for (27 a school record) and fourth in total offense (172.1 ypg).
- The signal caller's 1,103 yards of rushing ranked him third in the nation among all FCS quarterbacks.
- Efficient through the air when needed, Burks also completed 76-of-155 passes for 1,307 yards and nine touchdowns on the season.
- Burks is only 56 rushing yards away from 2,000 for his career, becoming only the second signal caller in Big South history to reach the milestone -- 24th player overall.

• During his record-breaking 2017 season, Burks maintained a 3.9 GPA in sports management to earn his undergraduate degree.

RUNNING BACKS

- Kennesaw State owns one of the most efficient, prolific and dangerous running corp. in the country.
- Despite being held to an uncharacteristically low 181 yards rushing, the team still showed early signs of returning the rushing giant is was a season ago.
- Sophomore **Shaquil Terry** led the way for the Owls in Week 1, recording seven carries for 61 yards -- ranking sixth in the conference. His yards per rush numbers (10.0) ranked third-best in the league.
- Terry also hauled in a career-high 63 yards (fourth in BSC) off just two receptions -- caught a career-long 63-yarder against Georgia State.
- In all, Terry led the Big South in allpurpose yards with 124, ranking 61st in the country.
- Last year, Kennesaw State touted the country's leading rushing attack, gaining 4,623 yards on 816 attempts (330.2/game) en route to a national-best 216 first downs via the ground.
- Kennesaw State's "March of Death" offense consistently owned the time-ofpossession battle.

- The Owls held possession for 467:08 overall (33:22/game), an average ranked eighth in the country.
- The Owls touted three running backs on the Big South's top-10 rushing leaderboard.
- Then-freshman Terry led all KSU running backs with 806 yards on 63 carries to rank sixth, while **Jake McKenzie** (163-731) and **Darnell Holland** (80-727) ranked seventh and eighth, respectively.
- Despite being third among the total rushing yards, Holland led the backs with eight touchdowns, including an 84-yard breakout touchdown, to rank fifth in the Big South.
- The 84-yard run by Holland was the thenlongest rushing attempt in program history. The effort was tied later that season by Terry.
- Holland owns three of the top 10 longest rushing attempts in school history.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Despite the run-heavy style of offense the Owls run, the wide receivers are some of the most experienced in the offense and it showed in Week 1.
- Senior **Justin Sumpter** fell just 5 yards shy of his fourth 100-yard receiving game, leading the Big South with 95 yards.
- He also finished second in the league with seven receptions and was one of just four players in the league to catch a TD in Week
- He averaged 13.6 yards/catch, with a game-long reception of 23 against Georgia State
- Last year, Sumpter caught just 33 passes on the season, but finished with 610 yards for a average of 43.6 yards per game and 18.5 per catch -- good for second in the Big South.
- Always a threat in the redzone, Sumpter finished fourth in the league in touchdown receptions with five.
- His 55-yard completion against Tennessee Tech in 2017 ranks tied-sixth all-time in program history.
- For his career, Sumpter leads all receivers with three 100-yard receiving games.

- Sumpter is joined in the starting lineup by senior Xavier Harper, who is second alltime in program history for receiving yards behind Sumpter.
- For his career, Harper has 605 yards and four touchdowns, averaging more than 20 yards per catch and 17.3 yards per game.



OFFENSE

- He finished with just two receptions for 20 yards against Georgia State, hauling in a long 14-yarder.
- Harper finished second on the team in 2017 in receiving yards with 182 for the season off nine catches. His longest was a 53-yarder against Gardner-Webb.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Kennesaw State's offensive line helped create the holes and lanes for the nation's top ground attack all season long in 2017.
- In addition to helping the run game, the offensive line protected the pocket better than most, allowing a conference-low 10 sacks all season ranking fourth in the nation.
- That protectiveness was on full display against Georgia State in Week 1 as it only allowed one sack on the night, late in the game when the defense knew the Owls had to pass.
- The returning offensive line recorded 458 knockdowns last season with the line holding 803 career knockdowns entering this season.
- Senior **Ryan Warrior** leads all linemen with 197 heading into this season, while All-American graduate center **C.J. Collins** recorded 195.
- Also reaching the 100-knockdown plateau was senior **Joeseph Alexander, Jr.** (179), senior **Chiaza Nwadike** (113) and sophomore **Nick Eldridge** (103).

DEFENSE

- Despite being known for its offensive prowess, Kennesaw State also touted one of the country's stoutest defensive units last season.
- Defensively in Week 1, the young Owls showed promise. The team held Georgia State to just 128 rushing yards, the least amount since Nov. 18, 2017 (Monmouth).
- Kennesaw State had its streak of consecutive games with an interception snapped, but with Peyton Moore's first career fumble recovery in the first quarter, the Owls extended their turnover-forced streak to 15-straight games.
- The interception streak dated back to Aug. 31, 2017.
- Of the five Big South players who recorded a sack in Week 1, four of them play for Kennesaw State -- Gore (1.0), Billingslea (1.0), Armstrong (0.5) and Butcher (0.5).
- KSU held an opponent scoreless for the first quarter for the first time since Nov. 11, 2018 (Charleston Southern)
- Kennesaw State led the Big South in Week 1, allowing just 315 total yards of offense overall to FBS opponent Georgia State.
- KSU held GSU to just 128 rushing yards, marking the first time the Owls have held a team below 150 yards since Nov. 18, 2017 (Monmouth).
- The Owls also ranked second in the conference this week in scoring defense (24 points).
- Kennesaw State's made a name for themselves in 2017 for stingy defense when it tied the Big South record for scoring defense, allowing a paltry 15.5 points/game.
- No Big South member team had allowed less points in league play than the Owls in 2017, who gave up just 52 points total (10.4 ppg).
- KSU also led the conference in rushing defense (102.1 ypg; 10 TDs), pass defensive efficiency (117.0 rating) and ranked third in pass defense in pass defense (199.4 ypg).
- Held strong the entire season with backs against the wall, leading the Big South in redzone defense: 76.9 percent, just 20 scores allowed in 26 chances.
- Kennesaw State also held defenses to an impressive 34.5 percent (59-of-171) on third down attempts last season to rank second in the Big South.
- Then-freshman Bryson Armstrong was the anchor to the Owls' defense, earning the Jerry Rice (National Freshman of the Year) Award.
- A force to reckoned with behind the line of scrimmage, he set the single-season Big South record for quarterback sacks by recording 11.0 unassisted for an overall loss of 79 yards.

- Armstrong also co-led the nation in fumbles recovered (4), while also leading Big South in sacks (11 solo) and all league linebackers in tackles (114). He also ranked third in the conference in tackles-for-loss (12.5) and fourth in tackles per game (8.6).
- A consensus preseason All-American, Armstrong was named to the 2018 Buchanan Award watch list.

THANK THE PLANK

- Kennesaw State and its sideline character, "Turnover Plank" wrecked opponent's offenses, creating the nation's top turnover margin (+23) last year by creating 24 interceptions (second in FCS) — 11 more than next Big South team.
- Despite having its streak of consecutive games with an interception snapped at 14, it did force a fumble to extend its streak of games with a forced turnover to 15.
- Peyton Moore recovered his first career fumbles against Georgia State after Le'Vonte Larry forced his first career fumble at KSU.
- In 2017, the Owls were third in the country in turnovers gained (35), forcing 11 fumbles and intercepting 24 passes.
- The Owls also took redzone appearances personally last year, leading the conference with an impressive four interceptions in the redzone.
- Also a quarterback's nightmare was senior cornerback Keon Roman, who ranked third in the Big South with four interceptions on the year and second in interception returns with 68 yards.

DEFENSE

DEFENSIVE LINE

- Kennesaw State boasts size and speed on the defensive line as well as plenty of depth.
- **Desmond Johnson, Jr.** leads all active linemen with 8.0 career sacks for 42 yards, all of which have been solo.
- In Week 1 against Georgia State, Johnson finished tied-fourth on the team in tackles with five total (four solo) on the night to rank second in the Big South among linemen.
- Last season, Johnson touted 36 tackles last season (21 solo), including 8.0 tackles-for-loss for 26 yards. He also led the team with nine quarterback hurries.
- A huge loss in the preseason was **Auzoyah "Big Z" Alufohai,** who will miss the 2018 campaign due to a lower-body injury.
- Alufohai was a force of nature last year on the defensive line, committing 31 tackles (15 solo) with 1.5 tackles-for-loss for 3 yards.
- Alufohai also battled for two pass breakups and recovered a fumble against Monmouth.
- Hoping to help make up for the loss of Big Z, **McKenzie Billingslea** looked locked and loaded for the season in Week 1, finishing tied-fourth on the team in tackles (5 total, three solo) -- also good for second-best in the Big South among linemen.
- Billingslea came up with a huge tacklefor-loss in the game that pushed GSU back 6 yards.

LINEBACKERS

- The literal and metaphorical backbone to the Kennesaw State defense has been the linebackers.
- Kennesaw State's **Anthony Gore, Jr.** and **Bryson Armstrong** led the way for all Big South defenders in Week 1, standing alone at the top with nine total tackles each.
- Not surprisingly, the biggest storyline was the emergence of Jerry Rice Freshman of the Year Armstrong, who led all defensive players last year with 114 total tackles (85 solo) and 12.5 tackles-for-loss, including an amazing 11.0 sacks for 78 yards.
- Armstrong also forced three fumbles and recovered four to rank among the nation's best.
- Armstrong co-led the defense in Week 1 against Georgia State, finishing with nine tackles (five solo) and 0.5 sacks for a loss of 3 yards.
- Gore returns this season after finishing third on the team in tackles last season (73 51 solo). He also committed 2.0 sacks for a loss of 18 yards.

- He showed in Week 1 that he's ready to be the senior leader of the linebackers, leading with nine solo tackles, a sack for a loss of 12 yards and 2.0 tackles-for-loss for 16 yards on the night.
- His nine solo tackles lead the Big South and was tied for third-best in FCS. It ranks fourth among all Division I (FCS or FBS)

- Transfer **Charlie Patrick** got his first career start against his former school in Week 1 (Georgia State) and made the most of it, coming up with four total tackles (three solo).
- Gore and Patrick both led the Big South in tackles for loss with 2.0, also finishing tied-28th in the nation.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- A defensive backs corp. that helped them create an impressive 24 interceptions -- 11 more than the next-highest Big South team.
- Kennesaw State enters the 2018 season with an impressive streak of 14 consecutive games with one or more interceptions.
- The Owls will have some young talent to replace this season after the departure of Keon Roman, Taylor Henkle and Bert Birdsall -- all due to graduation.
- Those three departing seniors combined for 97 total tackles and seven interceptions last season.
- Hoping to continue as leaders this season will be **Dorian Walker**, **Jace White** and **Nicolas Snowden**.
- Walker finished seventh on the team overall last season in tackles with 40 (30 solo), including 5.0 tackles-for-loss and two interceptions.
- White finished fifth on the team with 51 total tackles (44 solo) and three interceptions for 68 yards.
- White took full advantage of his veteran status in Week 1, finishing third on the team in tackles with seven total, five solo and 0.5 for loss.
- His seven tackles ranked him second in the Big South among all DBs, ninth overall.
- Two of White's three interceptions last season rank on the top 10 longest returns in program history.

- The transfer junior forced a fumble on Georgia State's lone redzone trip of the first quarter, allowing **Peyton Moore** to pick up his first a career recovery.
- In addition to the turnover, Larry made two tackles (one solo) and broke up a deeproute pass.



SPECIAL TEAMS

- An often overlooked aspect that the Owls vastly improved in last season was their production from special teams.
- \bullet The Owls led the Big South in points scored kicking (103 23 points higher than next-highest team), knocking home 17 field goals and 52 PATs.
- KSU also topped the league in field goals made (17th 7th-best in nation) and percentage (81.0 17-of-21).
- Scoring-wise, **Justin Thompson** led the charge as one of the top placekickers in the country.
- Of the 10 PKs in the country who made 50 or more PATs last year, only five connected on 100 percent of them (52-for-52).

ATLANTA - Despite a career receiving effort from Shaquil Terry, Kennesaw State was unable to hold on to a late three-point lead, falling 24-20 to Georgia State on Thursday night.

With 2:25 left in the fourth quarter, the Owls (0-1) were caught in no-man's land between a punt and a long fourth-down attempt at the GSU's 35-yard line. An 8-yard pass completion to Justin Sumpter wouldn't be enough and KSU turned it over on downs, giving the ball back to GSU with 2:01 left on the clock.

Two key penalties on the final drive kept hope alive for the Panthers (1-0), before they were able to score the go-ahead touchdown with 41 seconds remaining – not enough time for the Owls to respond.

Kennesaw State was led by quarterback Chandler Burks, who recorded his third-career 200-yard passing game, going a career-high 12-for-19 with 201 yards, one touchdown and one interception. His main receiver on the night was Sumpter, who finished 5 yards shy of his fourth-career 100-yard receiving game with seven receptions for 95 total yards and a 23-yard touchdown.

On the ground attack, Terry led the charge with seven rushes for 61 yards and a 5-yard touchdown. He also hauled in a career-best 63 yards in receiving yards, thanks mainly to a career-long 60-yard catch in the third quarter.

Defensively, the young Owls showed promise. The team held Georgia State to just 128 rushing yards, the least amount since Nov. 18, 2017 (Monmouth). Anthony Gore, Jr. led all defenders with nine tackles (all solo), one sack and 2.0 tackles-for-loss, while Bryson Armstrong also finished with nine tackles (five solo) and 0.5 sacks.

Both Le'Vonte Larry and Peyton Moore combined for defensive career-firsts in the first quarter when Larry forced his first fumble in GSU's lone redzone appearance, giving Moore the opportunity to snag his first fumble recovery at their own 15-yard line.

The Owls will now ready for its final Thursday night football game of the regular season, heading to take on Tennessee Tech on Sept. 6. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. ET and will be broadcast live on ESPNU.

NOTES

With Moore's fumble recovery in the first quarter, Kennesaw State extended its turnover-forced streak is extended to 15-straight games ... KSU held an opponent scoreless for the first quarter for the first time since Nov. 11, 2018 (Charleston Southern) ... the loss snaps a three-game winning streak for Kennesaw State versus opponents from the state of Georgia (3-1 all-time) ... Burks has now thrown for 200-yards three times in his career ... in his last two season-openers, he's gone 32-41-2 for 426 yards ... with 0.5 sacks tonight, Armstrong has recorded at least half a sack in five of the last seven games ... Justin Thompson's 32- and 24-yard field goals in the third quarter makes him 10 for his last 11 ... Kennesaw State had its streak of 14-consecutive games with an interception snapped ... the streak dated back to Aug. 31, 2017.
