> TOP STORYLINES

- · Kennesaw State returns to Fifth Third Bank Stadium for the third of four straight home games, welcoming the Samford Bulldogs to town on Saturday.
- · Samford was the victim of KSU's first FCS playoff win in program history last year as the Owls knocked off the Bulldogs 28-17.
- · The Owls are coming off their highest point production in school history last Saturday, scoring 70 points to roll to their third straight victory. During the last three games, KSU is outscoring opponents 181-
- Kennesaw State's 181 points the last three weeks is tied with Texas Tech for the most points in Division I football. It also sets the Big South record for the most points scored in a three-game stretch.
- · The Owls enter Saturday's game with 11 consecutive home wins, having not lost at Fifth Third Bank Stadium since Oct. 15, 2016, a span of 714 days.
- KSU has the fourth-longest active home winning streak in FCS. The Owls are one of five programs with a winning streak of 10 or more games.
- Kennesaw State had three interception returns for touchdowns in program history. before Jace White and Demetrius Pettway both recorded a Pick 6 against Clark Atlanta last weekend.
- KSU has not lost a regular-season game to an FCS opponent since Aug. 31, 2017, when it fell to Samford, 28-23 (394 days).

- · KSU has five one-play scoring drives in the last three weeks, giving it 13 in the last two seasons. The offense also has seven scoring drives this year under 60 seconds.
- · Chandler Burks has eight rushing touchdowns on the year, the most in all of FCS. He also has the most rushing TD's among all FCS and FBS quarterbacks.
- · The Owls have forced a turnover in 18 straight games dating back to last season, and have recorded an interception in 17 of the last 18 contests.
- The KSU defense tied the program record for interceptions in a game last week with four. The Owls rank eighth in the nation with six INT's on the year.

NOTING THE OPPONENT

- Samford is 1-3 on the year after falling to Chattanooga, 27-20, Saturday. The Bulldogs have lost their last three games.
- Samford is under the direction of head coach Chris Hatcher. In his four seasons at Samford, Hatcher has accumulated a 23-17 record.
- The Bulldogs average 374.3 passing yards per game to lead the Southern Conference and rank second in the FCS.
- A 2018 Preseason Walter Payton Award Candidate, and 2017 finalist, senior quarterback Devlin Hodges leads the SoCon in completions per game (34.75), Passing TDs (11) and passing yards per game (367.8).
- Hodges' favorite target is Kelvin McKnight who averages 10.5 receptions per game to lead the FCS. McKnight leads the SoCon with five receiving touchdowns and ranks second in the conference in receiving yards per game (141.5).
- Defensively, the Bulldogs are holding opponents to an average of 116 yards rushing per game, which ranks second in the Southern Conference.
- Samford is led on the the defensive side by a pair of Aarons. Aaron Harris has a teamhigh 32 tackles, including two for a loss, while Aaron Atkinson has accounted for 22 tackles, 2.5 for loss and one interception.

THE SIGNAL CALLER

- Graduate quarterback **Chandler Burks** has started the 2018 campaign with a bang, showcasing his skill through the air and on the ground.
- After finishing his junior season as a finalist for the Walter Payton Award as the nation's best player, Burks looks to lead the Owls back to the FCS Playoffs in 2018.
- Burks is **FOUR TD PASSES** away from becoming the first player in Big South Conference history to record 30 career rushing and passing scores.
- With his 91 rushing yards at Tennessee Tech in Week 2, Burks became only the second quarterback in Big South history to reach the 2,000-yard milestone and the 24th player overall.

» Burks has rushed for multiple TD's nine times in his career, including each of the last three weeks.

- Burks has started 29 consecutive games at QB and led the Owls to a 23-6 (.793) record.
- Burks is 13-2 as the starting QB inside Fifth Third Bank Stadium.
- Burks enters Week 5 with eight rushing touchdowns, all coming in the last three games
- He leads the FCS with eight rushing TD's and all QB's in FBS or FCS in rushing scores.
- Burks is responsible for 16.5 points per game, good for 19th in the country.
- As the leader of the offense, Burks has accounted for multiple touchdowns in 11 of his last 15 games and at least one score in 14 of the last 15 contests.
- Burks is tied for the national lead in total touchdowns with eight, sitting alongside Davidson's William Wicks.



BIG SOUTH HISTORY

» Burks was the first player in league history to be voted Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year in the same season. He maintained a 3.9 GPA to earn a sports management degree in 2018.

- The Owls last played Samford on Nov. 25, 2017, hosting the Bulldogs in KSU's first FCS Playoff game in program history.
- · Kennesaw State would avenge a season-opening loss to Samford, using a 28-17 victory to push its winning streak to 11 games at the time.
- Justin Sumpter hauled in two TD receptions from Chandler Burks, and Shaquil Terry rushed for 120 yards, including an 84yard run.
- Bryson Armstrong wrapped up the Jerry Rice Award against Samford last year, setting a school record with 16 total tackles in the game, including 11 solo.

- Kennesaw State has won 11 consecutive games at Fifth Third Bank Stadium, a streak that dates back to Oct. 15, 2016.
- When the Owls take the field against Samford, they will have not lost a home game in 714 days.

• After finishing last year in the top 25 in fourth-down conversions, the team currently ranks 25th in the country and first in the Big South at .692 (9-13).

RUNNING BACKS

- The Owls now have the second-best rushing offense in FCS or FBS and the toprated ground attack in the Big South at 361.0 yards per game.
- **Darnell Holland** has touchdown runs of 75 and 70 yards and is the only player in the Big South with multiple TD runs of 70+ yards this season.
- Holland (66.8) and **Shaquil Terry** (47.8) are the top two running backs in the Big South in yards per rush and have combined for four rushing TD's in the last two games.

• Holland owns three of the top six longest rushing attempts in school history.

OFFENSIVE PROWESS

- The Owls put up big numbers against Alabama State, posting 563 yards of total offense, marking the second straight game with 500 or more yards.
- KSU's 563 yards of offense is the best single-game performance since Nov. 12, 2016 against Presbyterian (567 yards).
- As a team, the Owls lead the Big South and rank 12th in the FCS, averaging 472.2 yards per game.

WIDE RECEIVERS

• **Justin Sumpter** hauled in his second TD reception of the year against Alabama State, a 14-yard strike from Burks.

- Against Georgia State, Sumpter fell just five yards shy of his fourth 100-yard receiving game, leading the Big South with 95 yards.
- Through four weeks, Sumpter ranks T-2nd in the Big South with two touchdown receptions.
- He has amassed 150 yards of receiving through three games and caught two TDs.
- Sumpter needs just one more catch to reach 100 career receptions, making him the first wide receiver in KSU history to reach the century mark.
- Last year, Sumpter caught just 33 passes on the season, but finished with 610 yards for an average of 43.6 receiving yards per game and 18.5 yards per catch -- good for second in the Big South.
- For his career, Sumpter leads all KSU receivers with three 100-yard receiving games.

- Sumpter is joined in the starting lineup by senior **Xavier Harper**, who is second alltime in program history for receiving yards behind Sumpter.
- For his career, Harper has 616 receiving yards and four touchdowns, averaging 19.9 yards per catch and 16.6 yards per game.
- He finished with two receptions for 20 yards against Georgia State, hauling in a long 14-yarder.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Through four games, the offensive line ranks third in the country in sacks allowed, giving up just one.
- The returning offensive line recorded 458 knockdowns last season with the line holding 803 career knockdowns entering this season.
- Senior **Ryan Warrior** leads all linemen with 197 heading into this season, while All-American graduate center **C.J. Collins** recorded 195.
- Also reaching the 100-knockdown plateau were seniors **Joeseph Alexander**, **Jr.** (179) and **Chiaza Nwadike** (113), and sophomore **Nick Eldridge** (103).



NOTING THE **DEFENSE**

STINGY GROUP

- Through four weeks of play, the Owls' defense leads the Big South and ranks 12th nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 15.0 points per game.
- Kennesaw State leads the Big South and is 16th in the country in total defense, allowing 292.0 total yards per game.
- Kennesaw State had its streak of consecutive games with an interception snapped in Week 1, but the Owls have recorded at least one pick in 17 of the last 18 games.
- As a team, the Owls rank first in the Big South in tackles for loss, averaging 6.8 per game.
- **Cincere Mason** is currently fourth in the Big South for passes defended (breakups and interceptions), averaging 1.33 per game.
- Desmond Johnson, Jr. and Anthony Gore, Jr. are currently tied for fifth in the Big South with 3.0 tackles for loss.
- Kennesaw State recovered a fumble in each of its first three games. The Owls lead the Big South and rank 15th in the country in fumbles recovered with four.

THANK THE PLANK

- Kennesaw State and its sideline character, "Turnover Plank" wrecked opponent offenses last year, creating the nation's top turnover margin (+23) by creating 24 interceptions (second in FCS) 11 more than the next Big South team.
- The Owls tied a program record for interceptions in a game last Saturday, recording four INT's, including returning two for touchdowns.
- Five different players have recorded an interception this year, led by two from **Demetrius Pettway**.
- The Owls now face a quarterback in Samford's Devlin Hodges that leads the SoCon with eight interceptions thrown.

LINEBACKERS

- Kennesaw State's Anthony Gore, Jr. and Bryson Armstrong have led the way for the Owls early in 2018.
- The duo ranks in the Big South's top 10 for tackles among linebackers. Gore has 23, while Armstrong has totaled 21.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- **Desmond Johnson, Jr.** leads all active linemen with 9.0 career sacks for 50 yards, all of which have been solo.
- Through four weeks, Johnson ranks tied for fifth in tackles among Big South linemen, recording 15 total for 3.8 per game.
- A huge loss in the preseason was **Auzoyah** "**Big Z" Alufohai,** who will miss the 2018 campaign due to a lower-body injury.
- Hoping to help make up for the loss of Big Z, **McKenzie Billingslea** has looked locked and loaded to start the season. With 10 total tackles and one sack, Billingslea is 16th in the Big South among linemen.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- Kennesaw State entered the year with just three defensive backs with starting experience, one being **Le'Vonte Larry**, who transferred from lowa Central CC. They have combined to make 35 career starts.
- **Demetrius Pettway** has two of the four longest interception returns in school history in the last two weeks, returning a 34-yarder against Alabama State and a 56-yard pick 6 against Clark Atlanta.

ATLANTA – Despite a career receiving effort from Shaquil Terry, Kennesaw State was unable to hold on to a late three-point lead, falling 24-20 to Georgia State on Thursday night.

With 2:25 left in the fourth quarter, the Owls (0-1) were caught in no-man's land between a punt and a long fourth-down attempt at the GSU's 35-yard line. An 8-yard pass completion to Justin Sumpter wouldn't be enough and KSU turned it over on downs, giving the ball back to GSU with 2:01 left on the clock.

Two key penalties on the final drive kept hope alive for the Panthers (1-0), before they were able to score the go-ahead touchdown with 41 seconds remaining – not enough time for the Owls to respond.

Kennesaw State was led by quarterback Chandler Burks, who recorded his third-career 200-yard passing game, going a career-high 12-for-19 with 201 yards, one touchdown and one interception. His main receiver on the night was Sumpter, who finished 5 yards shy of his fourth-career 100-yard receiving game with seven receptions for 95 total yards and a 23-yard touchdown.

On the ground attack, Terry led the charge with seven rushes for 61 yards and a 5-yard touchdown. He also hauled in a career-best 63 yards in receiving yards, thanks mainly to a career-long 60-yard catch in the third quarter.

Defensively, the young Owls showed promise. The team held Georgia State to just 128 rushing yards, the least amount since Nov. 18, 2017 (Monmouth). Anthony Gore, Jr. led all defenders with nine tackles (all solo), one sack and 2.0 tackles-for-loss, while Bryson Armstrong also finished with nine tackles (five solo) and 0.5 sacks.

Both Le'Vonte Larry and Peyton Moore combined for defensive career-firsts in the first quarter when Larry forced his first fumble in GSU's lone redzone appearance, giving Moore the opportunity to snag his first fumble recovery at their own 15-yard line.

The Owls will now ready for its final Thursday night football game of the regular season, heading to take on Tennessee Tech on Sept. 6. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. ET and will be broadcast live on ESPNU.

With Moore's fumble recovery in the first quarter, Kennesaw State extended its turnover-forced streak is extended to 15-straight games ... KSU held an opponent scoreless for the first quarter for the first time since Nov. 11, 2018 (Charleston Southern) ... the loss snaps a three-game winning streak for Kennesaw State versus opponents from the state of Georgia (3-1 all-time) ... Burks has now thrown for 200-yards three times in his career ... in his last two season-openers, he's gone 32-41-2 for 426 yards ... with 0.5 sacks tonight, Armstrong has recorded at least half a sack in five of the last seven games ... COOKEVILLE, Tenn. - An hour rain delay couldn't cool the jets of Kennesaw State football's offense as it amassed 552 yards in the 49-10 victory over Tennessee Tech on Thursday night.

The Owls (1-1) used a program-record seven rushing touchdowns and record 507 rushing yards to defeat the Golden Eagles (0-2), winning their 13th game in their last 15.

The offensive charge was led by Chandler Burks, who finished with three rushing touchdowns and 91 rushing yards on the night. His three TDs made him the first Big South quarterback to rush 30 touchdowns in a career, while his yardage made him the second quarterback in conference history to reach the 2,000-yard milestone.

Tennessee Tech would actually get on the board first with a 41-yard field goal to start the game, before Kennesaw State was able to retake the lead with a 1-yard touchdown by Burks. The Owls would score twice in the second quarter - off a 27-yard rush by Trey Chivers and a 5-yard rush by Burks - to extend the lead to 21-3.

The Owls then broke out of the gate to open the second half, recording back-to-back one-play scoring drives on a 75-yard run by Darnell Holland and a 50-yard breakout by Burks on the first two possessions of the third quarter.

Backup quarterback Daniel David then entered the game, capitalizing fully to score at 10:38 in the third quarter on a 5-yard run to push the lead to 42-3.

The Golden Eagles then scored a fourth-quarter touchdown through the air to get to 10 points before Tommy Bryant used a 2-yard rush with 1:38 left in the game to set the final score at 49-10.

Holland finished as the game's leading rusher by 1 yard, finishing with 92 total yards off four carries while Burks finished with 11 carries for 91 yards. Kevin Ficklin and Trey Chivers also ran for more than 50 yards with 58 and 50, respectively.

With the ground attack firing on all cylinders, Justin Sumpter only targeted once on the night, but it was a deep one, going for 41 yards.

Defensively, Le'Vonte Larry continues to impress in his first year as a transfer, racking up a teamhigh nine tackles (eight solo), while Charlie Patrick finished with seven tackles and one for loss and Anthony Gore, Jr. with six and 0.5 for loss.

The Owls' defense extended its turnover forced streak to 16-straight games as freshman Cincere Mason jumped a route to nab his first career interception and Dorian Walker recovered a muffed punt. KSU has now forced an interception in 15 of its last 16 games.

Kennesaw State now returns home for its home-opener matchup against Alabama State on Sept. 15. Kickoff is scheduled for 5 p.m.

Burks' 30 rushing touchdowns also rank him sixth all-time in Big South history among all positions ... Burks' three touchdown effort was his sixth-career game with three or more rushing touchdowns and the seventh multi-rushing touchdown game for his career overall ... he's ran for a touchdown in 11 of his last 13 games ... freshman Isaac Foster recorded his first career carry for a key 11-yard rush in the first quarter ... Chivers' rushing touchdown was the seventh of his career and first since Oct. 7, 2017 (Texas Southern) ... Sumpter's 41-yard completion ranks as the ninth-longest of his career ... Holland's 75-yard rushing TD is the second-longest of his career and fifth-longest in program history ... KENNESAW, Ga. – A nearly two-hour lightning delay turned out to be a spark for Kennesaw State as it amassed 563 yards of offense and broke the program scoring record in a 62-13 victory over Alabama State in its home opener Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

After both teams waited out a one hour and 42-minute delay, lightning struck for the Owls (2-1) as they forced a quick turnover and scored on their second offensive play as Shaquil Terry capped a 27-yard drive with a 17-yard run, igniting Kennesaw State to its most lopsided victory over an FCS opponent in program history. The score came 1:10 into the game.

The Owls gained 417 yards on the ground, received three rushing touchdowns from quarterback Chandler Burks and 136 yards on the three first-half carries by running back Darnell Holland

Kennesaw State scored on two of its first four possessions, then reached the end zone on its next four drives, capping the second quarter with a 70-yard run by Holland that sent the Owls into the locker room with a 42-6 halftime lead.

The fireworks continued in the third quarter as Isaac Foster returned the second half kickoff a Kennesaw State-record 100 yards for a 49-6 lead. Two Nathan Robertson field goals and a 6-yard touchdown run by quarterback Daniel David concluded a stretch in which the Owls scored on eight straight possessions to lead 62-13 heading into the fourth quarter.

The Kennesaw State defense limited Alabama State (1-2) to 314 total yards, forced three turnovers and was led by Courtney Mills, Bryson Armstrong and Le'Vonte Larry, who had six tackles apiece. Mills had 1.5 tackles for loss, including half a sack, while Travis Bell had a forced fumble and recovery, Desmond Johnson, Jr. forced a fumble, Andrew Butcher recovered a fumble and Demetrius Pettway returned his first career interception 34 yards.

Kennesaw State continues its four-game home stand on Saturday (Sept. 22) when it hosts Clark Atlanta at 6 p.m.

The game began late after experiencing officially a one hour and 42-minute weather delay ... Kennesaw State improves to 2-1 on the season and 1-0 at home. It also improves to 2-0 all-time against Alabama State ... The win extends KSU's home-winning streak to 10 games. The Owls have not lost at Fifth Third Bank Stadium since Oct. 15, 2016 (700 days) ... The Owls have now won 14 of their last 16 games dating back to 2017 ... The Owls improve to 4-1 all-time against opponents hailing from the state of Alabama. Kennesaw State's 62 points are the most points scored in a game for KSU. The previous record was 58 scored against Edwards on Sept. 12, 2015 ... KSU extended its takeaway streak to 17 games with two fumble recoveries and an interception ... Kennesaw State has recorded a fumble recovery in all three games this season ... KSU had three one-play scoring drives against ASU, the fifth one-play drive of the season and 13th in the last two years ... The Owls had four scoring drives of less than a minute, increasing its season total to seven ... KSU's 42 points in the first half marks the most points scored in the opening half since Oct. 10, 2016 against Furman (49) ... KSU recorded 563 yards of total offense, the second straight game with 500 or more yards. ... Chandler Burks recorded three rushing touchdowns for the second straight game, his seventh career game with three or more rushing touchdowns ... Burks moves into fifth place in Big South Conference history with 33 career rushing touchdowns ... With his three touchdowns today. Burks recorded his seventh career game to move into a tie for first place in Big South history ... Justin Sumpter scored his second touchdown of the season, moving him into a tie for fourth place on Kennesaw State's all-time scoring list with 114 career points ... Sumpter has the Owls' only two receiving touchdowns this season ... Darnell Holland led the team with a career-high 136 rushing yards on three first-half carries ... KENNESAW, Ga. – Kennesaw State returned two interceptions for touchdowns and scored on a blocked punt to highlight a 70-13 victory over an outmanned Clark Atlanta team Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

For the second week in a row, the Owls (3-1) broke the program single-game scoring record and established the school mark for largest margin of victory (57 points). Kennesaw State registered a 62-13 victory over Alabama State a week ago to set the previous record.

Running back Shaquil Terry led the scoring barrage with three touchdowns, scoring on runs of 21 and 50, and added a five-yard reception from quarterback Chandler Burks. The Owls' quarterback also scored on runs of eight and one yard. Seven Owls found the end zone.

After Clark Atlanta (0-4) scored 13 points off two Kennesaw State turnovers to take a 13-7 lead less than 10 minutes into the game, the Owls scored 63 unanswered points.

Jace White (32 yards) and Demetrius Pettway (56 yards) returned interceptions for touchdowns and Courtney Mills returned a blocked punt by Cole Loden for a score to highlight the play of the defense and special teams. The defense totaled a program record-tying four interceptions.

Kyle Glover and Antavius Grier scored their first career touchdowns, finding the end zone on runs of one and 14 yards, respectively.

The Kennesaw State offense amassed 351 total yards, including 339 on the ground. Terry led the Owls with 71 yards on three carries.

Led by Anthony Gore, Jr. and Desmond Johnson, Jr., who had four tackles apiece, KSU's defense limited Clark Atlanta to 192 yards.

Kennesaw State continues its four-game home stand on Saturday (Sept. 29) when it hosts Samford at 6 p.m.

Kennesaw State improved to 3-1 on the year and 2-0 at home. KSU is now 2-0 all-time against Clark Atlanta ... The Owls have won 11 consecutive home games, a streak of 714 days ... The 70 points scored by KSU breaks the program's single-game scoring record, previously last week during a 62-13 victory over Alabama State ... The Owls set a record with 63 unanswered points ... The Owls 10 touchdowns are a program record ... With its four interceptions, KSU extended its takeaway streak to 18 straight games and has intercepted a pass in 17 of its last 18 games ... Cole Loden's blocked punt was the first by Kennesaw State since Oct. 14, 2017 when accomplished the feat at Liberty. It also marked the Owls' first blocked punt returned for a touchdown ... The four interceptions versus Clark Atlanta equals the previous single-game high set at Duquesne on Sept. 24, 2016. It also marks the fifth time KSU has three or more interceptions in a game ... The 56-yard interception return by Demetrius Pettway ranks as the second-longest interception return in program history. Adesola Abisoye's 41-yard return in the fifth longest, while Jace White's 32-yard interception ties for the seventh longest ... The Owls have scored six or more rushing touchdowns in three straight games. Prior to the 2018 season, KSU recorded six or more rushing touchdowns in six times ... Over the past three games, the Owls are averaging 60.3 points while allowing 12. ... The offensive line extended its streak without allowing a sack to 12 quarters ... Captains for tonight's game were Isaac Foster, Desmond Johnson, Jr., and Nick Eldridge ... Chandler Burks has recorded at least one rushing touchdown in seven of the last eight games. He has scored eight rushing touchdowns over the last three games ... With his two TDs, Burks eclipsed 200 points scored (210). He is second all-time behind Justin Sumpter (243) ...
