TOP STORYLINES

- Kennesaw State looks to finish off a perfect four-game homestand when it welcomes Presbyterian to town Saturday to open conference play.
- The Owls are 2-1 all-time in Big South Conference openers. KSU has won five straight Big South games and eight of its last nine league games overall.
- Kennesaw State is looking to become the third team in Big South history and the first program in the last 10 years to win consecutive conference titles with an undefeated record in league play.
- During Kennesaw State's current four-game winning streak, it has outscored opponents by 159 points, allowing just 11.5 points per game during the stretch.
- The Owls enter Saturday's game with 12 consecutive home wins, having not lost at Fifth Third Bank Stadium since Oct. 15, 2016, a span of 721 days.
- KSU has the fourth-longest active home winning streak in FCS, and is one of four programs with a winning streak of 10 or more games. A win Saturday would tie the Big South record with 13 consecutive home victories.
- KSU has not lost a regular-season game to an FCS opponent since Aug. 31, 2017, winning 12 straight.
- Chandler Burks** has 10 rushing touchdowns on the year, the most in all of FCS. He also has the most rushing TD's among all FCS and FBS quarterbacks.
- The Owls have forced a turnover in 19 straight games dating back to last season, and have recorded an interception in 17 of the last 19 contests.
- The KSU defense held Samford to its lowest point total in the last 31 games. The Owls limited the Bulldogs to just 272 total yards after coming into the game averaging 485.5 yards per game.
- The Owls have given up just seven points all season in the third quarter, outscoring opponents 75-7.
- KSU has scored a touchdown on its opening possession of the game in three of the five games this year, and scored on the first possession of the second half four times.

NOTING THE OPPONENT

- Presbyterian is 2-1 on the year after having its second game of the year against Stetson cancelled due to inclement weather.
- Head coach Tommy Spangler is in his eighth year at the helm of the Blue Hose, accumulating a record of 48-32.
- PC leads the Big South in scoring defense, allowing 11.3 points per game, good for sixth in the nation.
- PC has just one rushing touchdown on the year, while KSU has had eight different players record a rushing TD this season.
- The Blue Hose are the only team in FCS to not allow a sack this season.
- John Walker leads the PC offense, going 47-74-2 for 448 yards and four TD's. His 155.0 total offensive yards per game ranks third in the Big South.
- Zola Davis ranks second in the league in rushing yards per game, averaging 76.0.
- DaShawn Davis is second in the Big South in touchdown receptions with three.
- The Blue Hose held KSU to its lowest point total in program history during the 2015 season, knocking off the Owls 14-6.

THE SIGNAL CALLER

• Graduate quarterback **Chandler Burks** has started the 2018 campaign with a bang, showcasing his skill through the air and on the ground.

• After finishing his junior season as a finalist for the Walter Payton Award as the nation's best player, Burks looks to lead the Owls back to the FCS Playoffs in 2018.

• Burks is **THREE TD PASSES** away from becoming the first player in Big South Conference history to record 30 career rushing and passing scores.

• With his 91 rushing yards at Tennessee Tech in Week 2, Burks became only the second quarterback in Big South history to reach the 2,000-yard milestone and the 24th player overall.

• Burks has started 29 consecutive games at QB and led the Owls to a 24-5 (.828) record.

• Burks is 14-1 as the starting QB inside Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

• Burks enters Week 6 with 10 rushing touchdowns, all coming in the last four games.

• He leads the FCS with 10 rushing TD's and all QB's in FBS or FCS in rushing scores.

• Burks is responsible for 16.8 points per game, good for 15th in the country.

• As the leader of the offense, Burks has accounted for multiple touchdowns in 12 of his last 16 games and at least one score in 15 of the last 16 contests.

• Burks leads all FCS players in total touchdowns with 10.

• For the first time in his career, Burks has rushed for multiple TD's in four consecutive games.

• Against Samford, Burks became the first player in Big South history with 2,000 rushing yards and 3,000 passing yards.



BIG SOUTH HISTORY

» Burks was the first player in league history to be voted Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year in the same season. He maintained a 3.9 GPA to earn a sports management degree in 2018.

• The Owls routed the Blue Hose last year, recording a 28-0 victory for KSU's first shutout against a Big South opponent in program history.

• Kennesaw State rushed for 304 yards and added three touchdowns on the ground from **Chandler Burks**.

• **Jake McKenzie** hauled in his second career touchdown in the victory, finishing with two catches for 31 yards.

• **Anthony Gore** tallied a team-high seven tackles, and **Dorian Walker** added a sack, forced fumble and interception to lead the defense.

DOMINATION AT HOME

• Kennesaw State has won 12 consecutive games at Fifth Third Bank Stadium, a streak that dates back to Oct. 15, 2016.

• When the Owls take the field against Presbyterian, they will have not lost a home game in 721 days.

• In three-plus years as a program, KSU is 19-3 all-time at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

• During the current 12-game home winning streak, the Owls have outscored their opponents 505-138 and outrushed teams 4,148 to 1,108.

• KSU has the fourth-longest active home-winning streak in the FCS.

• The contest marks just the 17th FCS football game at a professional sports venue since 2010.

WINNINGEST THREE-YEAR STARTS

• Since 2008, Kennesaw State's 26 victories in its first three seasons are second among all NCAA Division I startups.

• Only Kennesaw State and Old Dominion were successful enough to secure winning seasons in each of their first three years.

• The Owls' 12 wins were the most for any FCS program in its third year.

DON'T BLINK

• KSU has five one-play scoring drives this season, giving it 13 in the last two seasons. The offense also has seven scoring drives this year under 60 seconds.

• Those five one-play TDs came in back-to-back weeks against Tennessee Tech (2) and Alabama State (3).

• In weeks two and three, the Owls opened the second half with a one-play 13-second TD thanks to a 75-yard run from **Darnell Holland** at TTU and a 100-yard kickoff return from **Isaac Foster** against ASU.

• After finishing last year in the top 25 in fourth-down conversions, the team currently ranks 31st in the country and first in the Big South at .647 (11-17).

RUNNING BACKS

• The Owls now have the third-best rushing offense in the FCS and the top-rated ground attack in the Big South at 332.8 yards per game.

• With a 75-yard TD run against Tennessee Tech, followed by a 70-yard score against Alabama State, **Darnell Holland** became just the second Big South Player with 70-plus yard touchdown runs in back-to-back games. He matched Coastal Carolina's Mike Tolbert's benchmark from 2006.

• Holland (13.4) and **Shaquil Terry** (8.8) are the top two running backs in the Big South in yards per rush and have combined for six rushing TD's this season.

OFFENSIVE PROWESS

• The Owls put up big numbers against Alabama State, posting 563 yards of total offense, marking the second straight game with 500 or more yards.

• KSU's 563 yards of offense is the best single-game performance since Nov. 12, 2016 against Presbyterian (567 yards).

• As a team, the Owls rank second in the Big South and 33rd in FCS, averaging 435.0 yards per game.

WIDE RECEIVERS

• **Justin Sumpter** recorded his 100th career reception against Samford, becoming the first KSU player to accomplish the feat.

• He is currently 166 receiving yards shy of becoming the 15th player in Big South history with 2,000.

• He is also one TD catch away from becoming the 11th player in league history with 20 touchdown receptions.

• Through five weeks, Sumpter ranks T-3rd in the Big South with two touchdown receptions.

• Last year, Sumpter caught just 33 passes on the season, but finished with 610 yards for an average of 43.6 receiving yards per game and 18.5 yards per catch -- good for second in the Big South.

• For his career, Sumpter leads all KSU receivers with three 100-yard receiving games.

• Sumpter is joined in the starting lineup by senior **Xavier Harper**, who is second all-time in program history for receiving yards behind Sumpter.

• For his career, Harper has 616 receiving yards and four touchdowns, averaging 19.9 yards per catch and 16.6 yards per game.

OFFENSIVE LINE

• Through five games, the offensive line ranks second in the country in sacks allowed, giving up just one.

• The returning offensive line recorded 458 knockdowns last season with the line holding 803 career knockdowns entering this season.



NOTING THE DEFENSE

STINGY GROUP

• Through five weeks of play, the Owls' defense ranks ninth nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 14.0 points per game.

• Kennesaw State leads the Big South and is 13th in the country in total defense, allowing 288.0 total yards per game.

• Kennesaw State had its streak of consecutive games with an interception snapped in Week 1, but the Owls have recorded at least one pick in 17 of the last 19 games.

• As a team, the Owls rank first in the Big South in tackles for loss, averaging 6.2 per game.

• **Cincere Mason** is currently fourth in the Big South for passes defended (breakups and interceptions), averaging 1.0 per game.

• **Charlie Patrick** is currently tied for first in the Big South with 4.5 tackles for loss.

• Kennesaw State has recovered a fumble in four of its five games. The Owls lead the Big South and rank 13th in the country in fumbles recovered with five.

THANK THE PLANK

• Kennesaw State and its sideline character, "Turnover Plank" wrecked opponent offenses last year, creating the nation's top turnover margin (+23) by creating 24 interceptions (second in FCS) — 11 more than the next Big South team.

• The Owls tied a program record for interceptions in a game against Clark Atlanta, recording four INT's, including returning two for touchdowns, The two Pick 6's tied the Big South single-game record.

• Five different players have recorded an interception this year, led by two from **Demetrius Pettway**.

• The Owls lead the Big South and rank No. 14 in the nation with six interceptions on the year. KSU also leads the league with 186 interception return yards and two Pick 6's.

LINEBACKERS

• **Anthony Gore, Jr.** and **Bryson Armstrong** rank seventh and eighth respectively in the Big South in tackles among linebackers.

DEFENSIVE LINE

• **Desmond Johnson, Jr.** leads all active linemen with 9.0 career sacks for 50 yards, all of which have been solo.

• A huge loss in the preseason was **Auzoyah "Big Z" Alufohai**, who will miss the 2018 campaign due to a lower-body injury.

• Hoping to help make up for the loss of Big Z, **McKenzie Billingslea** has looked locked and loaded to start the season with 10 total tackles and one sack.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

• Kennesaw State entered the year with just three defensive backs with starting experience, one being **LeVonte Larry**, who transferred from Iowa Central CC. They have combined to make 35 career starts.

• **Demetrius Pettway** has two of the four longest interception returns in school history in the last three weeks, returning a 34-yarder against Alabama State and a 56-yard pick 6 against Clark Atlanta.

ATLANTA – Despite a career receiving effort from Shaquil Terry, Kennesaw State was unable to hold on to a late three-point lead, falling 24-20 to Georgia State on Thursday night.

With 2:25 left in the fourth quarter, the Owls (0-1) were caught in no-man's land between a punt and a long fourth-down attempt at the GSU's 35-yard line. An 8-yard pass completion to Justin Sumpter wouldn't be enough and KSU turned it over on downs, giving the ball back to GSU with 2:01 left on the clock.

Two key penalties on the final drive kept hope alive for the Panthers (1-0), before they were able to score the go-ahead touchdown with 41 seconds remaining – not enough time for the Owls to respond.

Kennesaw State was led by quarterback Chandler Burks, who recorded his third-career 200-yard passing game, going a career-high 12-for-19 with 201 yards, one touchdown and one interception. His main receiver on the night was Sumpter, who finished 5 yards shy of his fourth-career 100-yard receiving game with seven receptions for 95 total yards and a 23-yard touchdown.

On the ground attack, Terry led the charge with seven rushes for 61 yards and a 5-yard touchdown. He also hauled in a career-best 63 yards in receiving yards, thanks mainly to a career-long 60-yard catch in the third quarter.

Defensively, the young Owls showed promise. The team held Georgia State to just 128 rushing yards, the least amount since Nov. 18, 2017 (Monmouth). Anthony Gore, Jr. led all defenders with nine tackles (all solo), one sack and 2.0 tackles-for-loss, while Bryson Armstrong also finished with nine tackles (five solo) and 0.5 sacks.

Both Le'Vonte Larry and Peyton Moore combined for defensive career-firsts in the first quarter when Larry forced his first fumble in GSU's lone redzone appearance, giving Moore the opportunity to snag his first fumble recovery at their own 15-yard line.

The Owls will now ready for its final Thursday night football game of the regular season, heading to take on Tennessee Tech on Sept. 6. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. ET and will be broadcast live on ESPNU.

With Moore's fumble recovery in the first quarter, Kennesaw State extended its turnover-forced streak is extended to 15-straight games ... COOKEVILLE, Tenn. – An hour rain delay couldn't cool the jets of Kennesaw State football's offense as it amassed 552 yards in the 49-10 victory over Tennessee Tech on Thursday night.

The Owls (1-1) used a program-record seven rushing touchdowns and record 507 rushing yards to defeat the Golden Eagles (0-2), winning their 13th game in their last 15.

The offensive charge was led by Chandler Burks, who finished with three rushing touchdowns and 91 rushing yards on the night. His three TDs made him the first Big South quarterback to rush 30 touchdowns in a career, while his yardage made him the second quarterback in conference history to reach the 2,000-yard milestone.

Tennessee Tech would actually get on the board first with a 41-yard field goal to start the game, before Kennesaw State was able to retake the lead with a 1-yard touchdown by Burks. The Owls would score twice in the second quarter – off a 27-yard rush by Trey Chivers and a 5-yard rush by Burks – to extend the lead to 21-3.

The Owls then broke out of the gate to open the second half, recording back-to-back one-play scoring drives on a 75-yard run by Darnell Holland and a 50-yard breakout by Burks on the first two possessions of the third quarter.

Backup quarterback Daniel David then entered the game, capitalizing fully to score at 10:38 in the third quarter on a 5-yard run to push the lead to 42-3.

The Golden Eagles then scored a fourth-quarter touchdown through the air to get to 10 points before Tommy Bryant used a 2-yard rush with 1:38 left in the game to set the final score at 49-10.

Holland finished as the game's leading rusher by 1 yard, finishing with 92 total yards off four carries while Burks finished with 11 carries for 91 yards. Kevin Ficklin and Trey Chivers also ran for more than 50 yards with 58 and 50, respectively.

With the ground attack firing on all cylinders, Justin Sumpter only targeted once on the night, but it was a deep one, going for 41 yards.

Defensively, Le'Vonte Larry continues to impress in his first year as a transfer, racking up a team-high nine tackles (eight solo), while Charlie Patrick finished with seven tackles and one for loss and Anthony Gore, Jr. with six and 0.5 for loss.

The Owls' defense extended its turnover forced streak to 16-straight games as freshman Cincere Mason jumped a route to nab his first career interception and Dorian Walker recovered a muffed punt. KSU has now forced an interception in 15 of its last 16 games.

Kennesaw State now returns home for its home-opener matchup against Alabama State on Sept. 15. Kickoff is scheduled for 5 p.m.

Burks' three touchdown effort was his sixth-career game with three or more rushing touchdowns and the seventh multi-rushing touchdown game for his career overall ... he's ran for a touchdown in 11 of his last 13 games ... freshman Isaac Foster recorded his first career carry for a key 11-yard rush in the first quarter ... KENNESAW, Ga. – A nearly two-hour lightning delay turned out to be a spark for Kennesaw State as it amassed 563 yards of offense and broke the program scoring record in a 62-13 victory over Alabama State in its home opener Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

After both teams waited out a one hour and 42-minute delay, lightning struck for the Owls (2-1) as they forced a quick turnover and scored on their second offensive play as Shaquil Terry capped a 27-yard drive with a 17-yard run, igniting Kennesaw State to its most lopsided victory over an FCS opponent in program history. The score came 1:10 into the game.

The Owls gained 417 yards on the ground, received three rushing touchdowns from quarterback Chandler Burks and 136 yards on the three first-half carries by running back Darnell Holland.

Kennesaw State scored on two of its first four possessions, then reached the end zone on its next four drives, capping the second quarter with a 70-yard run by Holland that sent the Owls into the locker room with a 42-6 halftime lead.

The fireworks continued in the third quarter as Isaac Foster returned the second half kickoff a Kennesaw State-record 100 yards for a 49-6 lead. Two Nathan Robertson field goals and a 6-yard touchdown run by quarterback Daniel David concluded a stretch in which the Owls scored on eight straight possessions to lead 62-13 heading into the fourth quarter.

The Kennesaw State defense limited Alabama State (1-2) to 314 total yards, forced three turnovers and was led by Courtney Mills, Bryson Armstrong and Le'Vonte Larry, who had six tackles apiece. Mills had 1.5 tackles for loss, including half a sack, while Travis Bell had a forced fumble and recovery, Desmond Johnson, Jr. forced a fumble, Andrew Butcher recovered a fumble and Demetrius Pettway returned his first career interception 34 yards.

Kennesaw State continues its four-game home stand on Saturday (Sept. 22) when it hosts Clark Atlanta at 6 p.m.

KENNESAW, Ga. – Kennesaw State returned two interceptions for touchdowns and scored on a blocked punt to highlight a 70-13 victory over an outmanned Clark Atlanta team Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

For the second week in a row, the Owls (3-1) broke the program single-game scoring record and established the school mark for largest margin of victory (57 points). Kennesaw State registered a 62-13 victory over Alabama State a week ago to set the previous record.

Running back Shaquil Terry led the scoring barrage with three touchdowns, scoring on runs of 21 and 50, and added a five-yard reception from quarterback Chandler Burks. The Owls' quarterback also scored on runs of eight and one yard. Seven Owls found the end zone.

After Clark Atlanta (0-4) scored 13 points off two Kennesaw State turnovers to take a 13-7 lead less than 10 minutes into the game, the Owls scored 63 unanswered points.

Jace White (32 yards) and Demetrius Pettway (56 yards) returned interceptions for touchdowns and Courtney Mills returned a blocked punt by Cole Loden for a score to highlight the play of the defense and special teams. The defense totaled a program record-tying four interceptions.

Kyle Glover and Antavious Grier scored their first career touchdowns, finding the end zone on runs of one and 14 yards, respectively.

The Kennesaw State offense amassed 351 total yards, including 339 on the ground. Terry led the Owls with 71 yards on three carries.

Led by Anthony Gore, Jr. and Desmond Johnson, Jr., who had four tackles apiece, KSU's defense limited Clark Atlanta to 192 yards.

Kennesaw State continues its four-game home stand on Saturday (Sept. 29) when it hosts Samford at 6 p.m.

Kennesaw State improved to 3-1 on the year and 2-0 at home. KSU is now 2-0 all-time against Clark Atlanta ... The Owls have won 11 consecutive home games, a streak of 714 days ... The 70 points scored by KSU breaks the program's single-game scoring record, previously last week during a 62-13 victory over Alabama State ... The Owls set a record with 63 unanswered points ... The Owls 10 touchdowns are a program record ... With its four interceptions, KSU extended its takeaway streak to 18 straight games and has intercepted a pass in 17 of its last 18 games ... Cole Loden's blocked punt was the first by Kennesaw State since Oct. 14, 2017 when accomplished the feat at Liberty. It also marked the Owls' first blocked punt returned for a touchdown ... The four interceptions versus Clark Atlanta equals the previous single-game high set at Duquesne on Sept. 24, 2016. It also marks the fifth time KSU has three or more interceptions in a game ... The 56-yard interception return by Demetrius Pettway ranks as the second-longest interception return in program history. Adesola Abisoye's 41-yard return in the fifth longest, while Jace White's 32-yard interception ties for the seventh longest ... The Owls have scored six or more rushing touchdowns in three straight games. Prior to the 2018 season, KSU recorded six or more rushing touchdowns in six times ... Over the past three games, the Owls are averaging 60.3 points while allowing 12. ... The offensive line extended its streak without allowing a sack to 12 quarters ... Captains for tonight's game were Isaac Foster, Desmond Johnson, Jr., and Nick Eldridge ... Chandler Burks has recorded at least one rushing touchdown in seven of the last eight games. He has scored eight rushing touchdowns over the last three games ... With his two TDs, Burks eclipsed 200 points scored (210). He is second all-time behind Justin Sumpter (243) ... Adesola Abisoye's 41-yard interception return was the first of his career and marks the fifth-longest in KSU history ... Jace White's interception return for a touchdown ties for the seventh longest in program history ... Shaquil Terry's two rushing touchdown marks a single-game career high. career single-game high for the sophomore. Terry's 5-yard touchdown reception was the first of his career and his three scores were also a career best ... Terry's 70 rushing yards gave him 997 for his career and three shy of 1,000 ... Demetrius Pettway's 56-yard interception return is the second-longest in school history ... With eight extra points made, Justin Thompson extended his streak of successful PATs to 101. Thompson increased his program-record points total to 251.

KENNESAW, Ga. – An efficient offense and stout defense proved a winning formula as No. 4 Kennesaw State defeated Samford 24-10 Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

In a rematch of last season's first-round FCS playoff game, the Owls (4-1) converted 8-of-14 third down attempts and scored 24 unanswered points en route to recording their fourth straight victory and 12th consecutive home win.

Facing the FCS's second-ranked passing offense, Kennesaw State limited Samford (1-4) to a season-low 150 yards through the air. The Bulldogs, who were averaging 374.3 passing yards a game, were also held to a season-low 272 total yards.

After Samford (1-4) went on a 16-play, 72-yard drive that consumed nearly seven minutes and culminated with a 20-yard field goal, Kennesaw State answered with a time-consuming drive of its own. Quarterback Chandler Burks led the Owls on a 15-play, 65-yard march that ended with a 1-yard Burks run, capping a seven-minute drive that gave KSU a 7-3 lead.

Burks connected with TJ Reed on a 9-yard touchdown pass with 4:40 remaining in the second quarter to increase Kennesaw State's lead to 14-3.

Darnell Holland opened the third quarter with a 72-yard kickoff return to Samford's 28-yard line. Burks capped the seven-play drive with a 3-yard touchdown run, increasing the Owls' lead to 24-3.

Burks finished as KSU's leading rusher, carrying the ball 15 times for 56 yards. He also completed 5-of-12 passes for 66 yards and a touchdown.

The trio of Anthony Gore, Jr., Bryson Armstrong and Cole Loden each recorded nine tackles to lead the Owls' defense. Peyton Moore had two tackles for loss and a fumble recovery while Andrew Butcher recorded a fumble, extending KSU's streak of at least one takeaway to 19 games.

Kennesaw State concludes its four-game home stand on Saturday (Oct. 6) when it hosts Presbyterian at 2 p.m.

NOTES

Kennesaw State has won 12 consecutive home games, a span of 721 days ... The Owls improved to 3-1 all-time against Samford ... KSU extended its takeaway streak to 19 straight games. The Owls have recovered a fumble in all four games this season ... Samford's 10 points scored marks its lowest point total since Sept. 26, 2015 against Louisville (three points), a span of 31 games ... Defensively, the Owls held Samford to a season-low 150 yards passing. Heading into the game, the Bulldogs averaged 374.3 yards passing per game ... This was the third straight game, fourth of the last five, in which KSU held its opponent to less than 150 yards rushing ... The offensive line did not allow a sack for the fourth consecutive game ... Captains for tonight's game were Shaquill Terry, Caleb O'Neil and Andrew Butcher ... Shaquill Terry became the sixth player in KSU history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards, recording 47 yards to bring his career total to 1,044 ... Chandler Burks has rushed for a touchdown in seven of the last eight games, and two or more in four straight games ... With his passing touchdown, Burks is now three touchdowns away from being the first QB in Big South history to record 30 rushing and 30 passing touchdowns ... Burks has recorded at least one passing and one rushing touchdown in 14 times. Justin Sumpter recorded his 100th career reception, making him the first Owl in KSU history to eclipse the century mark ... Darnell Holland's 72-yard kickoff return to open the second half marks the third-longest return in KSU history ... Cole Loden led the defense with a career-high nine tackles ... Justin Thompson has now made 104 consecutive PATs.
