## TOP STORYLINES

• The Kennesaw State football team goes for back-to-back conference championships on Saturday as it looks for its ninth straight victory overall.

• A win against Monmouth would make KSU the third team in Big South history and the first program in the last 10 years to win consecutive conference titles with an undefeated record in league play.

• Monmouth has won 10 consecutive home games with its last loss coming in 2016 against Kennesaw State, 49-17.

• KSU boasts the No. 1 scoring offense in the nation, averaging 47.1 points per game.

• Kennesaw State and Princeton are the only FCS teams to rank in the top five in scoring offense and defense. The Owls enter Week 10 at No. 1 in offense and No. 3 in defense.

• Kennesaw State is joined by Alabama, UCF and North Dakota State as the only Division I football teams with eight-game winning streaks in each of the last two years.

• During Kennesaw State's current eight-game winning streak, it has outscored opponents 404-73, allowing just 9.1 points per game during the stretch.

• KSU has the third-longest active home winning streak in FCS at 14 games and is one of six programs with a winning streak of 10 or more games.

• KSU has not lost a regular-season game to an FCS opponent since Aug. 31, 2017, winning 16 straight to set the Big South record.

• With 23 rushing TD's this year, **Chandler Burks** needs just four rushing TD's to tie the all-time **FCS record** of 27 rushing TD's in a season by a quarterback.

• **Isaac Foster** is currently the only player in the nation at the FCS or FBS level with two 100-yard kickoff returns for a TD this year.

• KSU is one of three teams in the nation (FBS & FCS) with three kickoff returns for TD's this year. KSU is joined by Bethune-Cookman and North Carolina A&T.

• The Owls have given up just seven points all season in the third quarter, outscoring opponents 138-7.

• KSU has scored on its first possession of the second half in eight games this year, including TD's in each of the last five games.

NOTING THE OPPONENT

- Monmouth heads into Saturday's game as the only other undefeated team in the Big South with a 3-0 conference record and 7-2 overall record.
- Monmouth has won five straight games, including a 37-3 victory against Charleston Southern last weekend.
- MU is the only other team in the Big South to average over 400 yards of total offense per game (451.6).
- The Hawks lead the conference in passing offense (238.2 ypg), while ranking second in rushing offense (213.3 ypg).
- Junior quarterback Kenji Bahar leads the Big South in passing yards per game (237.2) and total offense (248.7 ypg).
- Monmouth has the top two rushers in the league in Pete Guerriero (100.4 ypg) and Juwon Farri (95.3).
- Senior Reggie White, Jr. is Bahar's favorite target, averaging 6.3 receptions per game and 96.1 yards per game to lead the conference. White's seven receiving touchdowns are also tied for first in the Big South.
- Defensively, Monmouth has the No. 1 rushing defense in the conference, holding opponents to an average of 106.6 yards per game. That mark also ranks 13th in the FCS.
- The Hawks have blocked six total kicks this season.

THE RESULT

### THE SIGNAL CALLER

• Graduate quarterback **Chandler Burks** has lit up the scoreboard during the 2018 campaign, showcasing his skills through the air and on the ground.

• After finishing his junior season as a finalist for the Walter Payton Award as the nation's best player, Burks looks to lead the Owls back to the FCS Playoffs in 2018.

• With two TD passes at Charleston Southern, Burks became the first player in Big South Conference history to record 30 career rushing and passing scores.

• Burks has started 33 consecutive games at QB and led the Owls to a 28-5 (.848) record. He is also 16-1 as the starting QB inside Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

• Burks enters Week 10 with 23 rushing touchdowns to lead all FBS and FCS players. He has more TD's on the ground than 212 of the 253 FBS and FCS programs in the nation.

• Burks is responsible for 20.7 points per game, good for third in the country.

• As the leader of the offense, Burks has accounted for multiple touchdowns in 16 of his last 20 games and at least one score in 19 of the last 20 contests.

• For the first time in his career, Burks has rushed for multiple TD's in eight consecutive games, setting a Big South record.

• With 23 rushing TD's this year, Chandler Burks needs just four rushing TD's to tie the all-time **FCS record** of 27 rushing TD's in a season by a quarterback.

• He is the only player in league history with 2,000 rushing yards and 3,000 passing yards and the only signal caller with 30 rushing TD's and 30 passing TD's.

• He is the only FCS player in the country with four rushing scores in a game in each of the last two seasons.

## BIG SOUTH HISTORY

» Burks was the first player in league history to be voted Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year in the same season. He maintained a 3.9 GPA to earn a sports management degree in 2018.



## THE SERIES VS MONMOUTH

• Kennesaw State knocked off Monmouth 52-21 at home last year to clinch its first Big South Conference championship.

• In last year's blowout, Chandler Burks rushed for 131 yards and four touchdowns and threw for 114 yards and one score.

• Bryson Armstrong had 10 tackles against the Hawks last year, including 1.0 sack, 1.5 tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

• The Owls are 3-0 all-time in the series, outscoring the Hawks 124-51.

## DOMINATION AT HOME

• Kennesaw State has won 14 consecutive games at Fifth Third Bank Stadium, a streak that dates back to Oct. 15, 2016.

• The 14-game streak is the longest in Big South Conference history.

• In three-plus years as a program, KSU is 21-3 all-time at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

• During the current 14-game home winning streak, the Owls have outscored their opponents 610-138 and outrushed teams 5,028 to 1,218.

## SUNTRUST SHOWDOWN

• Kennesaw State will cap the regular season on Nov. 17 against Jacksonville State for the first football game in the history of SunTrust Park, the home of the Atlanta Braves.

• The contest marks just the 17th FCS football game at a professional sports venue since 2010.

## WINNINGEST THREE-YEAR STARTS

• Since 2008, Kennesaw State's 26 victories in its first three seasons are second among all NCAA Division I startups.

• Only Kennesaw State and Old Dominion were successful enough to secure winning seasons in each of their first three years.

• The Owls' 12 wins were the most for any FCS program in its third year.

• The Owls have converted six consecutive fourth down attempts dating back to Week 5 against Samford.

### RUNNING BACKS

• The Owls have the No. 3 rushing attack in all of Division I football, averaging 372.2 yards per game.

• With a 75-yard TD run against Tennessee Tech, followed by a 70-yard score against Alabama State, **Darnell Holland** became just the second Big South Player with 70-plus yard touchdown runs in back-to-back games. He matched Coastal Carolina's Mike Tolbert's benchmark from 2006.

• Holland owns three of the top six longest rushing attempts in school history.

### OFFENSIVE PROWESS

• The Owls have put up over 500 yards of total offense in five of the last eight games. KSU is averaging 535.0 yards of total offense in its four league games this year.

• KSU's 637 yards of total offense against PC is the second-highest total in program history and the most in the last 37 games.

• As a team, the Owls lead the Big South and rank ninth in FCS, averaging 479.4 yards of total offense per game.

• Kennesaw State set and tied a program record for most points against a Big South Conference opponent during its first two league games, scoring 56 points against Presbyterian and Gardner-Webb.

• KSU's clock-killing 11:18 touchdown drive in the fourth quarter against Charleston Southern was its longest in program history. CSU's final five drives lasted 9:46 and resulted in zero points.

### WIDE RECEIVERS

• With a 21-yard TD reception at Charleston Southern, **Justin Sumpter** became the 11th player in league history with 20 touchdown receptions.

• He is currently 64 receiving yards shy of becoming the 15th player in Big South history with 2,000.

• For his career, Sumpter leads all KSU receivers with three 100-yard receiving games.

• Sumpter is joined in the starting lineup by senior **Xavier Harper**, who is second all-time in program history for receiving yards behind Sumpter.

• For his career, Harper has 663 receiving yards and four touchdowns, averaging 20.1 yards per catch and 17.0 yards per game.

### OFFENSIVE LINE

• Through eight games, the offensive line ranks No. 1 in the country in sacks allowed, giving up just two on the year.

• The returning offensive line recorded 458 knockdowns last season with the line holding 803 career knockdowns entering this season.



## NOTING THE DEFENSE

### STINGY GROUP

• Through nine games, the Owls' defense ranks third nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 10.8 points per game.

• Kennesaw State is second in the country in total defense, allowing 241.4 total yards per game.

• The Owls have only allowed one score in the third quarter all season, giving up just seven points.

• KSU held Campbell to just 92 yards rushing last weekend, marking the third time this season the Owls have held an opponent to less than 100 rush yards.

• The Owls held Campbell to just 46 passing yards, the fewest since holding Edward Waters to 41 yards passing 43 games ago during the 2015 season.

• The Owls are the first team in Big South history to limit five consecutive opponents to 13 points or less, after doing so in the first five games of their current win-streak.

• Kennesaw State leads the Big South in scoring defense at 10.8 and total defense at 241.4. Both are pacing ahead of the conference's single-season records of 15.5 (scoring defense) and 292.0 (total defense).

• Kennesaw State had its streak of consecutive games with an interception snapped in Week 1, but the Owls have recorded at least one pick in 19 of the last 23 games.

• KSU had its streak of 22 games with at least one turnover snapped in Week 10 against Campbell.

• The Owls rank third in the country in third down defense with opponents converting just 25.9 percent of the time (30/116).

### THANK THE PLANK

• Kennesaw State and its sideline character, "Turnover Plank" wrecked opponent offenses last year, creating the nation's top turnover margin (+23) by creating 24 interceptions (second in FCS) — 11 more than the next Big South team.

• The Owls tied a program record for interceptions in a game against Clark Atlanta, recording four INT's, and returning two for touchdowns. The two Pick 6's tied the Big South single-game record.

• Five different players have recorded an interception this year, led by three from **Dorian Walker** and two from **Demetrius Pettway**. All three of Walker's interceptions have come in the last four games.

### LINEBACKERS

• **Bryson Armstrong** (50) and **Anthony Gore, Jr.** (47) rank eighth and ninth respectively in the Big South in tackles among linebackers.

### DEFENSIVE LINE

• **Desmond Johnson, Jr.** leads all active linemen with 12.0 career sacks for 74 yards, all of which have been solo.

• A huge loss in the preseason was **Auzoyah "Big Z" Alufohai**, who will miss the 2018 campaign due to a lower-body injury.

### DEFENSIVE BACKS

• Kennesaw State entered the year with just three defensive backs with starting experience, one being **Le'Vonte Larry**, who transferred from Iowa Central CC. They have combined to make 35 career starts.

• **Demetrius Pettway** has two of the six longest interception returns in school history this year, returning a 34-yarder against Alabama State and a 56-yard pick 6 against Clark Atlanta.

• **Dorian Walker** added a 34-yard interception return against Gardner-Webb to land among the longest INT returns in program history.

ATLANTA – Despite a career receiving effort from Shaquil Terry, Kennesaw State was unable to hold on to a late three-point lead, falling 24-20 to Georgia State on Thursday night.

With 2:25 left in the fourth quarter, the Owls (0-1) were caught in no-man's land between a punt and a long fourth-down attempt at the GSU's 35-yard line. An 8-yard pass completion to Justin Sumpter wouldn't be enough and KSU turned it over on downs, giving the ball back to GSU with 2:01 left on the clock.

Two key penalties on the final drive kept hope alive for the Panthers (1-0), before they were able to score the go-ahead touchdown with 41 seconds remaining – not enough time for the Owls to respond.

Kennesaw State was led by quarterback Chandler Burks, who recorded his third-career 200-yard passing game, going a career-high 12-for-19 with 201 yards, one touchdown and one interception. His main receiver on the night was Sumpter, who finished 5 yards shy of his fourth-career 100-yard receiving game with seven receptions for 95 total yards and a 23-yard touchdown.

On the ground attack, Terry led the charge with seven rushes for 61 yards and a 5-yard touchdown. He also hauled in a career-best 63 yards in receiving yards, thanks mainly to a career-long 60-yard catch in the third quarter.

Defensively, the young Owls showed promise. The team held Georgia State to just 128 rushing yards, the least amount since Nov. 18, 2017 (Monmouth). Anthony Gore, Jr. led all defenders with nine tackles (all solo), one sack and 2.0 tackles-for-loss, while Bryson Armstrong also finished with nine tackles (five solo) and 0.5 sacks.

Both Le'Vonte Larry and Peyton Moore combined for defensive career-firsts in the first quarter when Larry forced his first fumble in GSU's lone redzone appearance, giving Moore the opportunity to snag his first fumble recovery at their own 15-yard line.

The Owls will now ready for its final Thursday night football game of the regular season, heading to take on Tennessee Tech on Sept. 6. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. ET and will be broadcast live on ESPNU.

With Moore's fumble recovery in the first quarter, Kennesaw State extended its turnover-forced streak is extended to 15-straight games ... KSU held an opponent scoreless for the first quarter for the first time since Nov. 11, 2018 (Charleston Southern) ... the loss snaps a three-game winning streak for Kennesaw State versus opponents from the state of Georgia (3-1 all-time) ... COOKEVILLE, Tenn. – An hour rain delay couldn't cool the jets of Kennesaw State football's offense as it amassed 552 yards in the 49-10 victory over Tennessee Tech on Thursday night.

The Owls (1-1) used a program-record seven rushing touchdowns and record 507 rushing yards to defeat the Golden Eagles (0-2), winning their 13th game in their last 15.

The offensive charge was led by Chandler Burks, who finished with three rushing touchdowns and 91 rushing yards on the night. His three TDs made him the first Big South quarterback to rush 30 touchdowns in a career, while his yardage made him the second quarterback in conference history to reach the 2,000-yard milestone.

Tennessee Tech would actually get on the board first with a 41-yard field goal to start the game, before Kennesaw State was able to retake the lead with a 1-yard touchdown by Burks. The Owls would score twice in the second quarter – off a 27-yard rush by Trey Chivers and a 5-yard rush by Burks – to extend the lead to 21-3.

The Owls then broke out of the gate to open the second half, recording back-to-back one-play scoring drives on a 75-yard run by Darnell Holland and a 50-yard breakout by Burks on the first two possessions of the third quarter.

Backup quarterback Daniel David then entered the game, capitalizing fully to score at 10:38 in the third quarter on a 5-yard run to push the lead to 42-3.

The Golden Eagles then scored a fourth-quarter touchdown through the air to get to 10 points before Tommy Bryant used a 2-yard rush with 1:38 left in the game to set the final score at 49-10.

Holland finished as the game's leading rusher by 1 yard, finishing with 92 total yards off four carries while Burks finished with 11 carries for 91 yards. Kevin Ficklin and Trey Chivers also ran for more than 50 yards with 58 and 50, respectively.

With the ground attack firing on all cylinders, Justin Sumpter only targeted once on the night, but it was a deep one, going for 41 yards.

Defensively, Le'Vonte Larry continues to impress in his first year as a transfer, racking up a team-high nine tackles (eight solo), while Charlie Patrick finished with seven tackles and one for loss and Anthony Gore, Jr. with six and 0.5 for loss.

The Owls' defense extended its turnover forced streak to 16-straight games as freshman Cincere Mason jumped a route to nab his first career interception and Dorian Walker recovered a muffed punt. KSU has now forced an interception in 15 of its last 16 games.

Kennesaw State now returns home for its home-opener matchup against Alabama State on Sept. 15. Kickoff is scheduled for 5 p.m.

Burks' three touchdown effort was his sixth-career game with three or more rushing touchdowns and the seventh multi-rushing touchdown game for his career overall ... he's ran for a touchdown in 11 of his last 13 games ... freshman Isaac Foster recorded his first career carry for a key 11-yard rush in the first quarter ... Chivers' rushing touchdown was the seventh of his career and first since Oct. 7, 2017 (Texas Southern) ... Sumpter's 41-yard completion ranks as the ninth-longest of his career ... Holland's 75-yard rushing TD is the second-longest of his career and fifth-longest in program history ... KENNESAW, Ga. – A nearly two-hour lightning delay turned out to be a spark for Kennesaw State as it amassed 563 yards of offense and broke the program scoring record in a 62-13 victory over Alabama State in its home opener Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

After both teams waited out a one hour and 42-minute delay, lightning struck for the Owls (2-1) as they forced a quick turnover and scored on their second offensive play as Shaquil Terry capped a 27-yard drive with a 17-yard run, igniting Kennesaw State to its most lopsided victory over an FCS opponent in program history. The score came 1:10 into the game.

The Owls gained 417 yards on the ground, received three rushing touchdowns from quarterback Chandler Burks and 136 yards on the three first-half carries by running back Darnell Holland.

Kennesaw State scored on two of its first four possessions, then reached the end zone on its next four drives, capping the second quarter with a 70-yard run by Holland that sent the Owls into the locker room with a 42-6 halftime lead.

The fireworks continued in the third quarter as Isaac Foster returned the second half kickoff a Kennesaw State-record 100 yards for a 49-6 lead. Two Nathan Robertson field goals and a 6-yard touchdown run by quarterback Daniel David concluded a stretch in which the Owls scored on eight straight possessions to lead 62-13 heading into the fourth quarter.

The Kennesaw State defense limited Alabama State (1-2) to 314 total yards, forced three turnovers and was led by Courtney Mills, Bryson Armstrong and Le'Vonte Larry, who had six tackles apiece. Mills had 1.5 tackles for loss, including half a sack, while Travis Bell had a forced fumble and recovery, Desmond Johnson, Jr. forced a fumble, Andrew Butcher recovered a fumble and Demetrius Pettway returned his first career interception 34 yards.

Kennesaw State continues its four-game home stand on Saturday (Sept. 22) when it hosts Clark Atlanta at 6 p.m.

KENNESAW, Ga. – Kennesaw State returned two interceptions for touchdowns and scored on a blocked punt to highlight a 70-13 victory over an outmanned Clark Atlanta team Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

For the second week in a row, the Owls (3-1) broke the program single-game scoring record and established the school mark for largest margin of victory (57 points). Kennesaw State registered a 62-13 victory over Alabama State a week ago to set the previous record.

Running back Shaquil Terry led the scoring barrage with three touchdowns, scoring on runs of 21 and 50, and added a five-yard reception from quarterback Chandler Burks. The Owls' quarterback also scored on runs of eight and one yard. Seven Owls found the end zone.

After Clark Atlanta (0-4) scored 13 points off two Kennesaw State turnovers to take a 13-7 lead less than 10 minutes into the game, the Owls scored 63 unanswered points.

Jace White (32 yards) and Demetrius Pettway (56 yards) returned interceptions for touchdowns and Courtney Mills returned a blocked punt by Cole Loden for a score to highlight the play of the defense and special teams. The defense totaled a program record-tying four interceptions.

Kyle Glover and Antavious Grier scored their first career touchdowns, finding the end zone on runs of one and 14 yards, respectively.

The Kennesaw State offense amassed 351 total yards, including 339 on the ground. Terry led the Owls with 71 yards on three carries.

Led by Anthony Gore, Jr. and Desmond Johnson, Jr., who had four tackles apiece, KSU's defense limited Clark Atlanta to 192 yards.

Kennesaw State continues its four-game home stand on Saturday (Sept. 29) when it hosts Samford at 6 p.m.

KENNESAW, Ga. – An efficient offense and stout defense proved a winning formula as No. 4 Kennesaw State defeated Samford 24-10 Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

In a rematch of last season's first-round FCS playoff game, the Owls (4-1) converted 8-of-14 third down attempts and scored 24 unanswered points en route to recording their fourth straight victory and 12th consecutive home win.

Facing the FCS's second-ranked passing offense, Kennesaw State limited Samford (1-4) to a season-low 150 yards through the air. The Bulldogs, who were averaging 374.3 passing yards a game, were also held to a season-low 272 total yards.

After Samford (1-4) went on a 16-play, 72-yard drive that consumed nearly seven minutes and culminated with a 20-yard field goal, Kennesaw State answered with a time-consuming drive of its own. Quarterback Chandler Burks led the Owls on a 15-play, 65-yard march that ended with a 1-yard Burks run, capping a seven-minute drive that gave KSU a 7-3 lead.

Burks connected with TJ Reed on a 9-yard touchdown pass with 4:40 remaining in the second quarter to increase Kennesaw State's lead to 14-3.

Darnell Holland opened the third quarter with a 72-yard kickoff return to Samford's 28-yard line. Burks capped the seven-play drive with a 3-yard touchdown run, increasing the Owls' lead to 24-3.

Burks finished as KSU's leading rusher, carrying the ball 15 times for 56 yards. He also completed 5-of-12 passes for 66 yards and a touchdown.

The trio of Anthony Gore, Jr., Bryson Armstrong and Cole Loden each recorded nine tackles to lead the Owls' defense. Peyton Moore had two tackles for loss and a fumble recovery while Andrew Butcher recorded a fumble, extending KSU's streak of at least one takeaway to 19 games.

Kennesaw State concludes its four-game home stand on Saturday (Oct. 6) when it hosts Presbyterian at 2 p.m.

KENNESAW, Ga. – Quarterback Chandler Burks rushed for a career-high tying four scores and threw for another to lead No. 3 Kennesaw State to a 56-0 victory over visiting Presbyterian in both teams’ Big South Conference opener Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

The win was the fifth straight for the Owls (5-1, 1-0), who extended their home winning streak to 13 games, which ties the Big South record. The 56-point margin of victory was Kennesaw State’s largest over an FCS opponent and marked its second straight shutout of the Blue Hose (2-2, 0-1).

Burks led a dominating offensive performance, rushing 16 times for 135 yards as the Owls amassed 637 total yards, including 485 on the ground. Meanwhile, the KSU defense had a big afternoon, establishing program single-game records for fewest total yards (141) and rushing yards (18) allowed.

Junior defensive back Dorian Walker set up Kennesaw State for its first score, intercepting a pass and returning it 28 yards to the Presbyterian 26-yard line. The Owls converted the turnover into points when Burks hooked up with Darnell Holland for a 25-yard touchdown with 12:24 remaining in the first quarter.

Burks then scored on runs of 1, 10 and 3 yards to help KSU build a 28-0 halftime lead. The KSU senior capped his day with a 38-yard touchdown scamper on the Owls’ opening drive of the third quarter.

Running back Isaac Foster scored on a 12-yard run and reserve quarterback Daniel David accounted for Kennesaw State’s sixth rushing touchdown of the afternoon, scoring from a yard out with under two minutes remaining in the third quarter for a 49-0 lead.

Tommy Bryant and Kevin Ficklin connected for the game’s final score as the two hooked up on a 55-yard pass play with 5:36 remaining.

Kennesaw State returns to action next Saturday when it travels to Boiling Springs, N.C. to take on Gardner-Webb in a Big South Conference game. Kickoff is 1:30 p.m.

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. – The No. 2 Kennesaw State football team racked up 490 yards and seven touchdowns on the ground to defeat Gardner-Webb 56-17 Saturday afternoon.

Quarterback Chandler Burks recorded three of the Owls' rushing scores, his sixth straight game with multiple rushing touchdowns as Kennesaw State improved to 6-1 overall and 2-0 in league play.

After being held to a three-and-out on its first possession of the game, KSU's defense held strong in the red zone to force a 35-yard field goal from Gardner-Webb.

Isaac Foster provided a spark for KSU, returning the following kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. It was the second time this season Foster returned a kickoff for a touchdown, making him the first Owl in history to accomplish the feat.

Burks extended KSU's lead with back-to-back touchdowns from four and 15 yards out. Junior defensive back Dorian Walker set up the second touchdown with his third interception of the season, extending KSU's takeaway streak to 21 games.

Senior Darnell Holland added a 48-yard rushing touchdown to give the Owls a 28-3 lead at halftime.

Kennesaw State chewed up the clock in their opening drive of the third quarter with a methodical 68-yard 14-play drive resulting in a five-yard rushing touchdown for Burks.

Daniel David added another rushing touchdown in the third quarter, using a second-effort to fall in the endzone from one yard out.

In the fourth, senior Jake McKenzie and freshman Adeolu Adeleke recorded a pair of career-long rushing touchdowns with 54 and 60-yard scampers, respectively.

GWU's Dexter Brown snapped KSU's 49 straight points with a 75-yard rushing touchdown.

Following a crucial penalty that negated an interception for KSU, quarterback Jaylen Myers recorded the final points of the game, breaking free for a 63-yard score to snap the Owls' five-game streak of holding opponents to 13 points or less.

Charlie Patrick led the defense, tying his career-high with seven tackles followed by Bryson Armstrong with six.

The Owls will now enjoy a bye week, before returning to action on Saturday, Oct. 27 at Charleston Southern.

Kennesaw State has won 14 straight regular season games against FCS opponents, improving to 4-0 all-time against Gardner-Webb ... The Owls recorded two scoring drives under one minute, bringing their season total to 10 ... KSU has recorded at least six rushing touchdowns in five of the last six games ... CHARLESTON, S.C. – Quarterback Chandler Burks scored two touchdowns and threw for a pair of scores to lead No. 2 Kennesaw State to a 38-10 victory over Charleston Southern in Big South Conference action Saturday evening.

The victory extended the Owls' (7-1, 3-0) winning streak to seven games and was KSU's eighth consecutive conference win dating back to last season.

Burks continued to etch his name in the Big South Conference record book as he became the first player in league history with 30 rushing and 30 passing touchdowns. For his career, the Owls' graduate quarterback has 30 passing scores and 46 rushing touchdowns.

For the fifth time this season, Kennesaw State amassed over 500 yards of offense, totaling 508, including 316 on the ground. Burks led the attack, rushing for 102 yards on 23 carries, while completing 11-of-18 passes for 192 yards.

Kennesaw State fell behind 3-0 and was forced to punt on its first two possessions before scoring 24 unanswered points and led 24-10 at halftime.

Burks capped a 7-play, 67-yard drive with a 3-yard touchdown run to get the Owls on the board with 1:52 remaining in the first quarter. All 67 yards were gained on the ground.

Kennesaw State went to the air for its next two touchdowns, as Burks connected with Justin Sumpter on a 21-yard pass midway through the second quarter and then on the opening play of the Owls' next possession hooked up with Darnell Holland on a 65-yard scoring play to put KSU up 24-3 with 5:54 remaining in the first half.

Burks led Kennesaw State on an 11-play, 42-yard drive that culminated with a 3-yard run by the graduate quarterback to open the third quarter.

The Owls' final score came on a 1-yard run by Shaquil Terry with 4:50 remaining in the game to give Kennesaw State a 38-10 lead.

Sophomore Bryson Armstrong totaled nine tackles, including eight solo, and had a sack to lead a defense that limited Charleston Southern to 186 total yards, including just 63 passing yards.

KENNESAW, Ga. - Graduate quarterback Chandler Burks scored four rushing touchdowns and threw for another to lead No. 2 Kennesaw State to a 49-0 victory over Campbell on Senior Day Saturday at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

The Owls (8-1, 4-0) capped an undefeated regular season (5-0) at Fifth Third Bank Stadium and extend their home winning streak to a Big South Conference record 14 games.

Burks led a group of 22 seniors, including 17 "OG's" who were part of the first recruiting class, to their ninth straight Big South Conference victory and one win away from a second straight conference title.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Owls scored on three straight possessions, as Burks produced a pair of one-yard runs and a 50-yard scamper to help Kennesaw State build a 21-0 halftime lead.

The fireworks continued in the third quarter as Darnell Holland returned the second half kickoff 84 yards for a touchdown and 28-0 lead.

Kennesaw State, which scored on seven straight possessions, built a 42-0 lead heading into the fourth quarter as Burks connected with senior wide receiver Justin Sumpter on a 24-yard pass play and capped his day with a 4-yard run with 1:16 remaining in the third quarter.

Junior quarterback Daniel David threw a 23-yard touchdown pass to junior running back TJ Reed with 8:36 remaining for the Owls' final score.

Kennesaw State totaled 467 total yards of offense, including 395 on the ground. Sophomore running back Shaquil Terry rushed for a game-high 112 yards on eight carries.

The Kennesaw State defense limited Campbell (5-4, 0-3) to 138 total yards and was led by sophomore linebacker Charlie Patrick, who had five solo tackles, including two for loss.

Kennesaw State returns to action next Saturday when it travels to West Long Beach, N.J. looking to clinch back-to-back Big South Conference championships at Monmouth. Kickoff is set for 12-noon.
