# TOP STORYLINES

- Kennesaw State travels to Kent State Saturday looking for its first victory over an FBS opponent in program history.
- The Owls are looking to become the fourth program in Big South Conference history to defeat an FBS opponent and the first since Liberty beat Baylor in the 2017 season opener. The Big South holds six total wins over FBS opponents.
- · The Owls are set to take on their second FBS opponent in program history after falling to Georgia State 24-20 in the season opener last year. So far in 2019, Central Arkansas' victory at Western Kentucky is the only FCS-over-FBS upset of the season.
- · After the opening week of the season, Kennesaw State leads all FCS programs in rushing offense, kick return average, scoring defense and passing efficiency. The Owls' 433 rushing vards are the most among any FCS or FBS team in week one.
- KSU recorded its sixth shutout in program history in the season opener and posted its largest margin of victory with a 59-0 victory over NAIA member Point University.
- With the season-opening victory, the Owls have not lost a regular season home contest since Oct. 15, 2016, winning 14 consecutive games.
- Kennesaw State entered the 2019 season looking to become the first team in Big South history to win three straight outright conference championships.

- Dating back to Week 2 of the 2017 season, KSU has won 24 of its last 27 games, including going 5-2 against FCS ranked teams.
- The Owls return just 29.3 percent of their scoring from a year ago and return just one starter on offense, the fewest of any team in the Big South.
- · Kennesaw State has finished in the top three nationally in rushing offense each of the last three years, including a programbest and Big South record 352.9 yards per game last season.
- Excluding the inaugural class of the "OG's" that featured 74 freshmen, the 2019 roster features the most freshmen that have been on a Kennesaw State roster with 48.

# BY THE **NUMBERS**



» KSU's one returning player on offense is the fewest by any team in the Big South Conference.



» The Owls finished No. 2 in the nation in rushing yards per game in 2018 and have finished top-3 in each of the last three seasons.



» Kennesaw State has at least one rushing TD in 39 consecutive games, a streak that spans three full seasons.

# NOTING **KENT STATE**

- Kent State opened the year with a 30-7 loss at Arizona State after trailing 10-0 at the half.
- The Golden Flashes were picked to finish fourth in the MAC East Division in 2019, returning 17 starters, including nine on offense.
- Kent State has lost to an FCS opponent 11 times in school history, including five times in the last 25 seasons.
- The Golden Flashes' last FCS loss came at the hands of North Carolina A&T during the 2016 season, a 39-36 defeat in four overtimes.
- After rushing for 657 yards and seven touchdowns last year, running back Jo-El Shaw opened the season with 16 carries for 67 yards, averaging 4.2 yards per rush.
- Starting quarterback Woody Barrett threw for 2,339 yards and 11 TD's last season and was 9-of-16 for 83 yards and a score in the season opener at Arizona State.
- The Golden Flashes return their top three receivers from 2018, as the trio combined to score 10 touchdowns.

After becoming the first head football coach in Kennesaw State University history, Brian Bohannon has taken the Owls to heights never seen by a start-up football program.

In just four short years, Bohannon has led the Owls to a 37-12 record, back-to-back Big South Conference championships and consecutive appearances in the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs. After graduating the inaugural signing class in 2018, Bohannon has a new challenge ahead as the Owls go for an outright three-peat conference championship in 2019, something never done in the history of the league.

After putting the world on notice in 2017 with a 12-2 season, the outright Big South Conference title and two FCS Playoffs victories, the Owls somehow outdid themselves during the 2018 campaign. Ranked No. 2 in the nation for much of the year, KSU earned the No. 4 overall seed in the playoffs and took an 11-game winning streak to a second consecutive quarterfinal appearance where they held the third-longest home streak in the nation that dated back over two calendar years.

While the Owls have dominated on the field, Bohannon continues to collect accolades, earning the AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year following the 2017 season and earned AFCA District Coach of the Year after the 2018 campaign to go along with back-to-back Big South Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Bohannon, 47, put Kennesaw State on the map in 2017 when he led the Owls to a 12-2 season and an outright Big South Championship after finishing conference play undefeated at 5-0. Holding the country's top rushing offense, the Owls would make their first postseason berth in stellar fashion, getting revenge from their season-opening loss to Samford by winning 28-17 to advance.

The Owls then upset No. 3 Jacksonville State in the second round by scoring 14 unanswered second-half points to win 17-7. KSU's historic run would falter in the quarterfinals in a tough 34-27 loss to No. 5 Sam Houston State, but not before solidifying a young Kennesaw State team as one of the nation's top programs, earning him 2017 Big South Coach of the Year and AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year honors.

After being named Kennesaw State's coach on March 24, 2013, it took Bohannon just two seasons to vie for a Big South Conference title and reach the Top 25 as the Owls finished their debut year 6-5 before posting an 8-3 mark in 2016.

A four-year letterwinner and standout wide receiver at Georgia, Bohannon started his coaching career at West Georgia before earning his first full-time position at Gardner-Webb (N.C.) as wide receivers coach in 1996.

Bohannon earned his bachelor's degree in general business from Georgia in 1993 and a master's in business education from West Georgia in 1996.

Residing in Woodstock, Ga., Bohannon is married to the former Melanie Cobb. The two have three children, sons Blake and Braden, and daughter Brooke Anna.

# BEST IN BIG SOUTH

- In just four years of existence, Kennesaw State and head coach Brian Bohannon have three all-time playoff wins -- the secondmost by both a league member and head coach. Former member Coastal Carolina and its head coach, Joe Moglia, own the record of four playoff victories.
- Bohannon is seventh in Big South history with 38 career coaching wins, and became the second-fastest Big South coach to win 35 games when he reached the benchmark with KSU's 51-14 Big South championship win over Monmouth on Nov. 10, 2018 - just his 46th career game on the sideline.

· Sophomore Nathan Robertson will look to handle the placekicking duties, replacing stalwart Justin Thompson. During his freshman campaign, he was 2-for-2 kicking field goals, while making all four of his PAT's. Against Point, he made all eight PAT attempts and tacked on a field goal.

# STINGY GROUP

- The Owls' defense features eight returning starters from a unit that set the Big South conference record for points allowed per game last season (15.4).
- · Kennesaw State returns 90.4 percent of its turnover production from a season ago and 80.7 percent of its pass break-ups.
- KSU returns four of its top five tacklers from a year ago, including Bryson Armstrong, the former Jerry Rice Award winner.
- · Last season, the Owls became the first team in Big South history to limit five consecutive opponents to 13 points or less.
- KSU ended the 2018 campaign ranked No. 11 in the nation in third down defense with opponents converting just 28.9 percent of the time.
- The Kennesaw State defense experienced a coaching shakeup in the offseason. # TIME TO RELOAD

- · The Owls return just one starter on the offensive side of the ball after losing the Walter Payton Award runner-up at quarterback, and NFL free agent signees at running back and wide receiver.
- The Owls return just 29.3 percent of their scoring from a year ago, the fewest of any team in the Big South.
- · Junior running back Shaquil Terry is the only returning starter on offense after rushing for 576 yards on 78 carries and six total touchdowns in 2018.
- Kennesaw State finished the 2018 season as the No. 2 rushing attack in all of Division I FBS and FCS football, averaging 352.9 yards per game on the ground.

After a one-yard touchdown run from David, Bronson Rechsteiner took advantage of a gaping hole on the left side and sprinted 36 yards to put the Owls in front 14-0.

On the ensuing possession, Shaquil Terry scampered 44 yards for the Owls third rushing touchdown of the evening.

Kennesaw State's offense continued to roll and at the 1:11 mark in the first quarter, David found K.J. Hancock over the middle to push the edge to 28-0. The Owls added two more scores in the second quarter and held a 42-0 advantage at the break.

ommy Bryant added two more scores himself in the second half, rushing for one while finding T.J. Reed on a wheel route for another.

A Nathan Robertson field goal with 7:24 to play capped off the Owls scoring.

The Owls defense was spectacular the entire night, allowing just 129 yards of total offense. Junior linebacker Kareem Taylor led the defense with five tackles and a sack, while Jeremy Dees, Demetric Barnes and Joel Parker each recorded a sack.

As a team, the Owls surrendered just 37 rushing yards and 92 passing yards. The defense allowed just 4-of-16 third down attempts and a miniscule 2.3 yards per play.

The Owls look to win their first Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) game at Kent State on Sept. 7. Kickoff is slated for noon in Kent, Ohio.
