# TOP STORYLINES

- Kennesaw State hits the road Saturday for | the second of three straight road games, traveling to Alabama State to play the Hornets for the third consecutive year.
- The Owl are 2-0 all-time against Alabama State, outscoring the Hornets 82-27 the last two seasons.
- · After falling to Kent State 26-23 in overtime in week two, the Owls are 0-2 alltime against FBS opponents, losing the two games by a combined seven points. KSU is 1-2 in overtime games as a program.
- · KSU has not lost consecutive games in a season since the program's inaugural season in 2015. The Owls have played 40 games during the last two years without losing back-to-back contests.
- KSU's 18 consecutive regular season FCS wins are the most in Big South Conference history, including two against Alabama State. The Owls have also won their last nine regular season non-conference FCS contests, which is the third-longest streak in league history.
- KSU recorded its sixth shutout in program history in the season opener and posted its largest margin of victory with a 59-0 victory over NAIA member Point University.
- With the season-opening victory, the Owls have not lost a regular season home contest since Oct. 15, 2016, winning 14 consecutive games.

- Kennesaw State entered the 2019 season looking to become the first team in Big South history to win three straight outright conference championships.
- Dating back to Week 2 of the 2017 season, KSU has won 24 of its last 28 games, including going 5-2 against FCS ranked
- · Kennesaw State has finished in the top three nationally in rushing offense each of the last three years, including a programbest and Big South record 352.9 yards per game last season.
- Kennesaw State leads the Big South Conference in 16 team statistical categories, including scoring offense at 41.0 ppg and scoring defense at just 13.0 ppg.

# NOTING ALABAMA STATE

- Alabama State opened the year with a 24-19 loss at UAB.
- In week two, the Hornets picked up their first win of the season against Tuskegee 38-31 in Montgomery.
- Alabama State (4-7, 3-4 a season ago), was picked behind defending champion Alcorn State in the East Division. Alabama A&M and Jackson State were each picked above the Hornets in the preseason poll, while Mississippi Valley State was picked to finish fifth.
- Alabama State had five players selected as Preseason All-SWAC list (Christian Clark, Darron Johnson, Anthony Craven, Ezra Gray and Joshua Hill).
- Duran Bell was named the Newcomer of the Week after he finished with a careerhigh 112 yards on 10 carries in the Hornets' 24-19 loss to FBS-member and defending Conference USA champion UAB.
- Anthony Craven was one of 28 punters from across the country named to the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year Preseason Watch List, announced by the Augusta Sports Council Friday morning.
- Sophomore wide receiver Michael Jefferson was incredible against Tuskegee, hauling in five recpetions for 174 yards and three touchdowns.

After becoming the first head football coach in Kennesaw State University history, Brian Bohannon has taken the Owls to heights never seen by a start-up football program.

In just four short years, Bohannon has led the Owls to a 37-12 record, back-to-back Big South Conference championships and consecutive appearances in the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs. After graduating the inaugural signing class in 2018, Bohannon has a new challenge ahead as the Owls go for an outright three-peat conference championship in 2019, something never done in the history of the league.

After putting the world on notice in 2017 with a 12-2 season, the outright Big South Conference title and two FCS Playoffs victories, the Owls somehow outdid themselves during the 2018 campaign. Ranked No. 2 in the nation for much of the year, KSU earned the No. 4 overall seed in the playoffs and took an 11-game winning streak to a second consecutive quarterfinal appearance where they held the third-longest home streak in the nation that dated back over two calendar years.

While the Owls have dominated on the field, Bohannon continues to collect accolades, earning the AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year following the 2017 season and earned AFCA District Coach of the Year after the 2018 campaign to go along with back-to-back Big South Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Bohannon, 47, put Kennesaw State on the map in 2017 when he led the Owls to a 12-2 season and an outright Big South Championship after finishing conference play undefeated at 5-0. Holding the country's top rushing offense, the Owls would make their first postseason berth in stellar fashion, getting revenge from their season-opening loss to Samford by winning 28-17 to advance.

The Owls then upset No. 3 Jacksonville State in the second round by scoring 14 unanswered second-half points to win 17-7. KSU's historic run would falter in the quarterfinals in a tough 34-27 loss to No. 5 Sam Houston State, but not before solidifying a young Kennesaw State team as one of the nation's top programs, earning him 2017 Big South Coach of the Year and AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year honors.

After being named Kennesaw State's coach on March 24, 2013, it took Bohannon just two seasons to vie for a Big South Conference title and reach the Top 25 as the Owls finished their debut year 6-5 before posting an 8-3 mark in 2016.

A four-year letterwinner and standout wide receiver at Georgia, Bohannon started his coaching career at West Georgia before earning his first full-time position at Gardner-Webb (N.C.) as wide receivers coach in 1996.

Bohannon earned his bachelor's degree in general business from Georgia in 1993 and a master's in business education from West Georgia in 1996.

Residing in Woodstock, Ga., Bohannon is married to the former Melanie Cobb. The two have three children, sons Blake and Braden, and daughter Brooke Anna.

- The Owls are the only D1 team in the state to rush for 300+ yards per game in each of the last three seasons.
- Kennesaw State and the University of Georgia are the only two D1 teams in the state to record 30+ victories in the last four years. UGA leads the way at 43, followed by KSU at 38.
- Kennesaw State has finished in the top three nationally in rushing offense each of the last three years, including a programbest and Big South record 352.9 yards per game last season.

# BEST IN **BIG SOUTH**

- In just four years of existence, Kennesaw State and head coach Brian Bohannon have three all-time playoff wins -- the second-most by both a league member and head coach. Former member Coastal Carolina and its head coach, Joe Moglia, own the record of four playoff victories.
- Bohannon is seventh in Big South history with 38 career coaching wins, and became the second-fastest Big South coach to win 35 games when he reached the benchmark with KSU's 51-14 Big South championship win over Monmouth on Nov. 10, 2018 just his 46th career game on the sideline.

# SPLITTIN' THE **UPRIGHTS**

- Sophomore kicker Nathan Robertson is the only kicker at the FCS level to connect on 10-plus extra points and make four field goals this year. He ranks third in the country among kickers with 11.0 points per game.
- He also handles kickoff duties and has recorded one touchback on 14 tries.

# OWL STRONG

- The Owls rank No. 1 in the nation in passing yards per completion, averaging 24.57 yards per completion, while ranking No. 2 in the country in rushing yards per game at 342.5.
- Kennesaw State leads the Big South Conference in 16 team statistical categories, including scoring offense at 41.0 points per game and scoring defense at just 13.0 points per contest.
- KSU is one of five teams in the country to rank in the top 15 in the nation in scoring offense and scoring defense, ranking No. 6 on defense and No. 15 on offense.

# CARRYING THE **TORCH**

- KSU's Daniel David and Lamar University's Jordan Hoy are the only two quarterbacks in Division I football (FBS & FCS) to record four rushing touchdowns this year. Hoy leads the way with five, while David has four
- He is tied for second in the country in rushing touchdowns with four. He also ranks sixth in the nation in scoring, averaging 12.0 points per contest.



# RELOAD **NOT REBUILD**

- The Owls return just one starter on the offensive side of the ball after losing the Walter Payton Award runner-up at quarterback, and NFL free agent signees at running back and wide receiver.
- The Owls return just 29.3 percent of their scoring from a year ago, the fewest of any team in the Big South.
- Junior running back Shaquil Terry is the only returning starter on offense after rushing for 576 yards on 78 carries and six total touchdowns in 2018. So far through two games, he ranks second on the team with 101 rushing yards.
- Kennesaw State finished the 2018 season as the No. 2 rushing attack in all of Division I FBS and FCS football, averaging 352.9 yards per game on the ground.

- The Owls won 37 games in their first four years of existence, the second-most by a start-up program and only behind Old Dominion (38).
- KSU's three FCS Playoff wins in the last two seasons are more postseason victories than all other current Big South schools combined.





The Owls' offense converted through the air and on the ground, as quarterback Daniel David rushed for two scores and threw for two more

After a one-yard touchdown run from David, Bronson Rechsteiner took advantage of a gaping hole on the left side and sprinted 36 yards to put the Owls in front 14-0.

On the ensuing possession, Shaquil Terry scampered 44 yards for the Owls third rushing touchdown of the evening.

Kennesaw State's offense continued to roll and at the 1:11 mark in the first quarter. David found K.J. Hancock over the middle to push the edge to 28-0. The Owls added two more scores in the second guarter and held a 42-0 advantage at the break.

Tommy Bryant added two more scores himself in the second half, rushing for one while finding T.J. Reed on a wheel route for another.

A Nathan Robertson field goal with 7:24 to play capped off the Owls scoring.

The Owls defense was spectacular the entire night, allowing just 129 yards of total offense. Junior linebacker Kareem Taylor led the defense with five tackles and a sack, while Jeremy Dees, Demetric Barnes and Joel Parker each recorded a sack.

As a team, the Owls surrendered just 37 rushing yards and 92 passing yards. The defense allowed just 4-of-16 third down attempts and a miniscule 2.3 yards per play.

The Owls look to win their first Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) game at Kent State on Sept. 7. Kickoff is slated for noon in Kent, Ohio.

**KENT, OHIO-** In a grind-it-out game in which the Owls controlled the ball for 39 minutes, Kennesaw State fell 26-23 in overtime to Kent State.

After deferring the toss, the Kennesaw State defense stood strong on the first possession and forced a Golden Flash punt.

Daniel David led a field-goal drive on the first possession for the Owls and the Kennesaw State found themselves on top 3-0 with 8:15 to play after Nathan Robertson knocked through a 33-yard field goal.

On the ensuing Kent State possession, the Golden Flashes tied the ball game after a 32-yard field goal. The Owls answered with their second field goal that was set up by a 34-yard reception by Bronson Rechsteiner. Robertson hit a 21-yard field goal at the 11:58 mark in the second quarter to give the Owls the lead.

The Owls third drive of the day stalled, but was kept alive after recovering a muffed Kent State punt. Daniel David found Isaac Foster streaking down the middle of the field for 32 yards on the next play. Following the reception, David found paydirt from two yards out and put the Owls on top, 13-3 midway through the second quarter.

Kent State answered with a 23-yard quarterback scramble to pull within three points with under five minutes in the first half.

The Owls capped off a nine-play 50-yard drive with a 32-yard field goal and took a 16-10 lead at the break.

The Owls had a chance to put up points on the first possession of the second half after recovering a second muffed punt, but Daniel David threw his first interception of the season and the Golden Flashes took over at their 20-yard line.

Kent State took the 17-16 lead with 9:26 in the third quarter after converting a third-and-sixteen with a 75-vard touchdown pass down the sideline.

Kennesaw State looked like it was going to answer again- and thought it did- but a 43-yard rushing touchdown was called back on a holding penalty.

The KSU defense forced another three-and-out before the KSU offense converted a fourth down opportunity to push the ball into Kent State territory. On the fourth down play, David rolled out to his right and found K.J. Hancock down the right sideline who made a one-of-a-kind grab to keep the drive alive.

The Owls had their second touchdown of the day called back on the drive and couldn't pick up points after a missed field goal with 10:14 to play in the contest.

Kent State took a 20-16 lead at the 7:52 mark, but Kennesaw State answered the call and manufactured a 14-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 4-yard rushing touchdown from Daniel David to give the Owls the three-point advantage.

On final drive of the fourth quarter, the Golden Flashes drove the ball 49 yards and made a field goal to force the game into overtime at 23-23.

On its first possession of overtime, the Owls lost control of the football and turned it over, which gave the ball to the Golden Flashes.

Kent State drove home a 43-yard field goal to capture the victory.
