TOP STORYLINES

- Kennesaw State returns home Saturday eyeing its sixth straight victory, welcoming North Alabama to town as the Owls look to extend their regular season home winning streak to 17 games.
- · Although North Alabama is a member of the Big South Conference in 2019, the Lions are unable to compete for the league title until 2022 and games this season do not count in the conference standings.
- · Kennesaw State is 2-0 in league play for the third straight year and is looking to become the first team in Big South history to win three straight outright conference championships.
- KSU is joined by Princeton as the only FCS teams in the country to be ranked in the top five in scoring offense and scoring defense. The Owls are ranked No. 4 in offense (41.0) and No. 5 in defense (13.9).
- The Owls are No. 4 in the latest Coaches' Poll and No. 6 in the STATS FCS poll. Kennesaw State has now been ranked in the top-25 for 28 consecutive weeks, including 24 straight weeks in the top-10.
- The Owls currently lead all FCS teams in total defense, surrendering just 250.6 yards per game. KSU is 11.5 yards ahead of North Dakota State, which ranks No. 2 in the nation at 262.1.
- · Kennesaw State ranks No. 2 in all of Division I football in rushing yards per game, averaging 352.3 yards per contest. The Owls lead all FBS and FCS football teams in rushing touchdowns with 31, sitting four scores ahead of Davidson, Louisiana and Air Force.

STREAKIN'

- Dating back to Week 2 of the 2017 season, Kennesaw State has won 29 of its last 33 games for an 87.8 winning percentage.
- The Owls have not lost a regular season home contest since Oct. 15, 2016, winning 16 consecutive games during the last four seasons.
- · Kennesaw State has won 22 consecutive regular season games against FCS opponents, dating back to the season opener of the 2017 season.
- With last Saturday's blowout win at Presbyterian, Kennesaw State has won 12 consecutive Big South Conference games, the second longest streak in league history. Liberty holds the record at 16 from 2006-09.

NOTING **NORTH ALABAMA**

- The Lions make their first trip to Fifth Third Bank Stadium with a 2-5 record, including back-to-back losses to Big South Conference foes.
- Although North Alabama is now a member of the Big South Conference, the Lions are not eligible to compete for the Big South Conference Championship until 2022 as part of the transition to Division I.
- The Lions opened the year with a 26-17 victory against Western Illinois and picked up their only other victory of the year against Presbyterian, knocking off the Blue Hose 41-21 at home.
- Head coach Chris Willis is in his 21st season at the helm of the Lions, sporting 13 NCAA Division II playoff appearances, eight conference championships and one national championship.
- North Alabama is 0-3 in true road games this year, including being outscored 131-63.
- Quarterback Christian Lopez is second in the Big South Conference in passing yards, averaging 260.0 per game to go along with 11 touchdowns. He also ranks third in the league in interceptions with seven.
- D'Andre Hart leads the team and ranks third in the league in total tackles with 66. He also has 3.0 tackles for loss, one interception and one forced fumble.

After becoming the first head football coach in Kennesaw State University history, Brian Bohannon has taken the Owls to heights never seen by a start-up football program.

In just four short years, Bohannon has led the Owls to a 37-12 record, back-to-back Big South Conference championships and consecutive appearances in the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs. After graduating the inaugural signing class in 2018, Bohannon has a new challenge ahead as the Owls go for an outright three-peat conference championship in 2019, something never done in the history of the league.

After putting the world on notice in 2017 with a 12-2 season, the outright Big South Conference title and two FCS Playoffs victories, the Owls somehow outdid themselves during the 2018 campaign. Ranked No. 2 in the nation for much of the year, KSU earned the No. 4 overall seed in the playoffs and took an 11-game winning streak to a second consecutive quarterfinal appearance where they held the third-longest home streak in the nation that dated back over two calendar years.

While the Owls have dominated on the field, Bohannon continues to collect accolades, earning the AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year following the 2017 season and earned AFCA District Coach of the Year after the 2018 campaign to go along with back-to-back Big South Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Bohannon, 47, put Kennesaw State on the map in 2017 when he led the Owls to a 12-2 season and an outright Big South Championship after finishing conference play undefeated at 5-0. Holding the country's top rushing offense, the Owls would make their first postseason berth in stellar fashion, getting revenge from their season-opening loss to Samford by winning 28-17 to advance.

The Owls then upset No. 3 Jacksonville State in the second round by scoring 14 unanswered second-half points to win 17-7. KSU's historic run would falter in the quarterfinals in a tough 34-27 loss to No. 5 Sam Houston State, but not before solidifying a young Kennesaw State team as one of the nation's top programs, earning him 2017 Big South Coach of the Year and AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year honors.

After being named Kennesaw State's coach on March 24, 2013, it took Bohannon just two seasons to vie for a Big South Conference title and reach the Top 25 as the Owls finished their debut year 6-5 before posting an 8-3 mark in 2016.

A four-year letterwinner and standout wide receiver at Georgia, Bohannon started his coaching career at West Georgia before earning his first full-time position at Gardner-Webb (N.C.) as wide receivers coach in 1996.

Bohannon earned his bachelor's degree in general business from Georgia in 1993 and a master's in business education from West Georgia in 1996.

Residing in Woodstock, Ga., Bohannon is married to the former Melanie Cobb. The two have three children, sons Blake and Braden, and daughter Brooke Anna.

- The Owls are the only D1 team in the state to rush for 300+ yards per game in each of the last three seasons.
- Kennesaw State and the University of Georgia are the only two D1 teams in the state to record 30+ victories in the last four-plus years. UGA leads the way at 48, followed by KSU at 43.
- Kennesaw State has finished in the top three nationally in rushing offense each of the last three years, including a programbest and Big South record 352.9 yards per game last season.

BEST IN **BIG SOUTH**

- In just four years of existence, Kennesaw State and head coach Brian Bohannon have three all-time playoff wins -- the second-most by both a league member and head coach. Former member Coastal Carolina and its head coach, Joe Moglia, own the record of four playoff victories.
- Bohannon is seventh in Big South history with 43 career coaching wins, and became the second-fastest Big South coach to win 40 games when he reached the benchmark with KSU's 35-24 win over Missouri State on Nov. 21, 2019.

SPLITTIN' THE **UPRIGHTS**

- Sophomore kicker Nathan Robertson is the only kicker at the FCS level to connect on 38-plus extra points and make six field goals this year. He ranks 9th in the country among kickers with 8.0 points per game. He knocked through a career-long 46-yard try versus Charleston Southern.
- Nicholas Jones has been effective on kickoff attempts. recording touchbacks on 12 of 37 tries.

OWL STRONG

- The Owls rank No. 1 in the nation in passing yards per completion, averaging 20.09 yards per completion.
- Kennesaw State leads the Big South Conference in 21 team statistical categories, including scoring offense at 41.4 points per game and scoring defense at just 13.9 points per contest.
- KSU has blocked three punts this season and is tied for second in the country in blocked punts. Just four other programs have blocked three-or-more.
- The Owls are the only team in FBS or FCS that have had two 180+ yard rushers in the same game after Bronson Rechsteiner recorded 221 and Isaac Foster turned in 183 against Missouri State.

CARRYING THE **TORCH**

- KSU's Daniel David is one of two quarterbacks in Division I football (FBS & FCS) to have at least 11 rushing touchdowns this year.
- He is just two rushing touchdowns behind the nation's leader at QB, Citadel's Brandon Rainey.
- David has rushed for a TD in eight-straight games, dating back to Dec. 8, 2018.

BIG PLAY **PARKER**

- Joel Parker is just one of two freshman in FBS and FCS with 4.0 sacks on the season. The figure ranks 3rd in the Big South.
- Parker is the only player in college football that has turned in a 6.0 TFL and 3.0 sack performance, a feat he accomplished against Alabama State.
- Parker is third among freshmen with 7.5 tackles-for-loss this season. The figure ranks third in the conference.

MOORE, PLEASE

• Junior Peyton Moore has stepped up on the Owls' defensive line for the wounded parliament. He's recorded a tackle in every game that he has played and has collected 5.0 TFL's and 3.0 sacks.

- The Owls won 37 games in their first four years of existence, the second-most by a start-up program and only behind Old Dominion (38).
- KSU's three FCS Playoff wins in the last two seasons are more postseason victories than all other current Big South schools combined.
- KSU is the only team in its first four years to put together two separate 10-game winning streaks.
- With a perfect mark at home this season, the Owls have not lost a regular season home contest since Oct. 15, 2016, winning 16 consecutive games.
- KSU is joined by Alabama and UCF as the only Division I football teams with 10game winning streaks in each of the last two years.
- KSU has already won the Jerry Rice Award (Bryson Armstrong) and finished runnerup for the Walter Payton Award (Chandler Burks) and the Eddie Robinson Award (Brian Bohannon).

- The Owls have not allowed a blocked field goal or punt since Aug. 31, 2017, vs Samford.



GIMME **THAT**

- Senior defensive back Dorian Walker is tied for first in the nation with two fumble recoveries, both coming on muffed punts against Kent State.
- The Owls have forced an opponent turnover in nine out of ten games, dating back to Jacksonville State on Nov. 17, 2018.

- Coming into the 2019 season, Armstrong is the program leader in sacks after just two years of play. He also surpassed 200 career tackles against Kent State and recorded a season-high 13 tackles against Missouri State.



A Nathan Robertson field goal with 7:24 to play capped off the Owls scoring.

The Owls defense was spectacular the entire night, allowing just 129 yards of total offense. Junior linebacker Kareem Taylor led the defense with five tackles and a sack, while Jeremy Dees, Demetric Barnes and Joel Parker each recorded a sack.

KENT, OHIO- In a grind-it-out game in which the Owls controlled the ball for 39 minutes, Kennesaw State fell 26-23 in overtime to Kent State.

After deferring the toss, the Kennesaw State defense stood strong on the first possession and forced a Golden Flash punt.

Daniel David led a field-goal drive on the first possession for the Owls and the Kennesaw State found themselves on top 3-0 with 8:15 to play after Nathan Robertson knocked through a 33-yard field goal.

On the ensuing Kent State possession, the Golden Flashes tied the ball game after a 32-yard field goal. The Owls answered with their second field goal that was set up by a 34-yard reception by Bronson Rechsteiner. Robertson hit a 21-yard field goal at the 11:58 mark in the second quarter to give the Owls the lead.

Daniel David found Isaac Foster streaking down the middle of the field for 32 yards on the next play. Following the reception, David found paydirt from two yards out and put the Owls on top, 13-3 midway through the second quarter.

Kent State answered with a 23-yard quarterback scramble to pull within three points with under five minutes in the first half.

The Owls capped off a nine-play 50-yard drive with a 32-yard field goal and took a 16-10 lead at the break

The Owls had a chance to put up points on the first possession of the second half after recovering a second muffed punt, but Daniel David threw his first interception of the season and the Golden Flashes took over at their 20-yard line.

Kent State took the 17-16 lead with 9:26 in the third quarter after converting a third-and-sixteen with a 75-yard touchdown pass down the sideline.

Kennesaw State looked like it was going to answer again- and thought it did- but a 43-yard rushing touchdown was called back on a holding penalty.

The KSU defense forced another three-and-out before the KSU offense converted a fourth down opportunity to push the ball into Kent State territory. On the fourth down play, David rolled out to his right and found K.J. Hancock down the right sideline who made a one-of-a-kind grab to keep the drive alive.

The Owls had their second touchdown of the day called back on the drive and couldn't pick up points after a missed field goal with 10:14 to play in the contest.

Kent State took a 20-16 lead at the 7:52 mark, but Kennesaw State answered the call and manufactured a 14-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 4-yard rushing touchdown from Daniel David to give the Owls the three-point advantage.

On final drive of the fourth quarter, the Golden Flashes drove the ball 49 yards and made a field goal to force the game into overtime at 23-23.

On its first possession of overtime, the Owls lost control of the football and turned it over, which gave the ball to the Golden Flashes.

Kent State drove home a 43-yard field goal to capture the victory.



MONTGOMERY, Ala.- On a muggy Saturday afternoon, the No. 7 Owls throttled Alabama State 42-7 at ASU Stadium in a game that was never in question.

All things were clicking for the Owls to begin the matinée at ASU Stadium, as Tanner Jones blocked the first Alabama State attempted punt after the defense forced a three-and-out to open the game. Daniel David scored from two yards out to give the Owls the first lead of the game.

Turnover Plank made an appearance during the ensuing possession, as Demetrius Pettway intercepted the Hornets' pass attempt and took it the distance to push the advantage to two scores at the 11:55 mark in the opening quarter.

After another defensive stop, Bronson Rechsteiner capped off a 9-play, 97-yard yard drive with a 55yard run between the tackles to extend the lead to 21-0 at the end of the first quarter.

Adesola Abisoye opened up the second quarter with the Owls' second interception of the contest and set up KSU on the Hornets' side of the field. The drive ended with Tommy Bryant muscling through the Hornets' defensive line from two yards out, which put the Owls on top, 28-0 with just over nine minutes to play in the first half.

The half ended with the Owls up 28-0 after running out of time on the final drive of the second quarter. At the break, Kennesaw State had outgained the Hornets 232-78 and held a 215-to-19 advantage on the around.

The second half started much like the first- the Owls scored on their first drive of the quarter that was highlighted by a 55-yard score by Antavius Grier.

The Hornets answered with a touchdown pass at the 12-minute mark to cut the lead to 35-7. KSU scored on a 14-yard rush by Tommy Bryant, whose second score of the day put the Owls up 42-7 with 5:39 left in the third quarter

The final quarter was a defensive battle, as neither team scored and the score held 42-7 in favor of the Owls. 

SPRINGFIELD, Mo.- Behind a program-best 221 yards from Bronson Rechsteiner and another 183 from Isaac Foster, Kennesaw State rolled over Missouri State 35-24 for its second-straight victory.

For the first time this season, Kennesaw State allowed an opening-drive touchdown, as Missouri State took a 6-0 lead after having the ball for just under five minutes. Bryson Armstrong broke through the line and swatted the extra point attempt for his first blocked kick of the season.

Both teams went back-and-forth for the remainder of the quarter and score remained 6-0 through the end of the first frame. Kennesaw State missed an opportunity for three points with 8:04 in the second quarter when a 44-yard field was pushed right.

Missouri State took advantage of a 55-yard punt to pin the Owls on their own half-yard line and forced a fumble on KSU's first play of the drive. Two plays later, the Bears took a 13-0 lead with a two-yard run with 2:48 to go in the half.

On the ensuing drive, Kennesaw State responded with 75-yard run by Foster that included the sophomore slinging off three defenders while staying upright to cut the lead to 13-7 with under two minutes to play in the half. Aided by two penalties, Missouri State was able to reach field goal range and took advantage and knocked through a 37-yard try as time expired in the first half.

Foster showed off his speed on the first play of the second half as he took the ball 67 yards to pull the Owls within two points, 16-14.

On the very next play from scrimmage for the Owls' offense, Rechsteiner bolted up the middle for an 85-yard score that gave the Owls their first lead of the game. In three offensive plays, the Owls garnered 227 rushing yards and three scores. The play was the longest play from scrimmage in program history.

In the third quarter alone, the Owls rushed for 223 yards.

Daniel David scampered in the end zone with 6:10 to play in the fourth quarter for his sixth rushing touchdown of the season that gave the Owls a 35-16 advantage. Missouri State answered with a 28yard passing touchdown to cut it to 35-24 with just under three minutes to play in the contest.

Kennesaw State outgained Missouri State 526-385 in total offense and finished with 479 on the ground.

The Owls defense stood strong for the remainder of the contest and KSU held on for their first win over a Missouri Valley Football Conference opponent.

KENNESAW, Ga.- In a weather-shortened affair, Kennesaw State defeated Reinhardt 31-7 in just over two quarters of action. Due to extended weather in the area and for the safety of fans and players, the game was called in the third quarter with 5:45 to play.

"There definitely some positives, and it was definitely good to be back home, the student section was phenomenal," said head coach Brian Bohannon. "I would have to say it was the best since we've been here. I don't know how many different ways I can tell you how big of a deal it is. Shoutout to the students and fans that came out tonight.'

After the defense allowed just 13 yards on the initial drive, the punt return team pressured the Reinhardt kicker and forced a 15-vard punt. Just four plays later, Kevin Ficklin took a pitch nine yards and scored his first touchdown of the season to put the Owls on top just four minutes into the contest.

The defense stood strong on the second Eagle drive before Kennesaw State manufactured a 11-play 73yard drive that was capped off by a one-yard quarterback dive from Daniel David. During the ensuing drive, Isaac Foster found paydirt after a 44-yard scamper that started on the right side of the field and continued into middle of the field after a cut by Foster.

Foster found the endzone for the second time at the 7:18 mark in the second quarter that extended the Kennesaw State lead to 28-7. Nathan Robertson tacked on a 40-yard field goal with 4:18 in the first half to push the advantage to 31-0. The Eagles scored with 17 seconds left in the second quarter to cut the Owl lead to 31-7 at the break.

Each team traded possessions in the third quarter before the game was called.

Foster ended with 127 yards on the ground with two scores and added 30 yards receiving. Daniel David finished 3-for-6 with 60 yards through the air and added a rushing touchdown.

"We had great blocking down the field tonight," said Foster. "The funny thing about my touchdown run is, before the game, Bronson Rechsteiner told me that he had a vision that he was going to cut somebody and get up and block they safety for a touchdown run for me and that is exactly what he did. There was great blocking on the perimeter all night.

Kareem Taylor led the Owl defense with five total tackles, while Charlie Patrick recorded a trio.

The Owls are off on Oct. 5, but will be back in action at home Oct. 12 against Charleston Southern.

KENNESAW, Ga.- The No. 4 Kennesaw State football team won its 11th straight Big South conference game and improved to 5-1 on the year after beating Charleston Southern 45-23 on Saturday.

Bronson Rechsteiner dominated the rushing game for the Owls, scoring two 45-plus yard touchdowns and ending with 138 yards on the ground.

Isaac Foster displayed impressive vision and took the opening kickoff 32 yards to give the Owls the ball at the 39-yard line. After the Bucs forced a punt on the first possession, Charlie Patrick intercepted a deep ball on Charleston Southern's first possession and returned it to CSU's 21. Four plays later, Antavius Grier took a pitch around the left side 10 yards to put the Owls up 7-0 at the 11:34 mark in the first quarter.

Kennesaw State manufactured a 16-play, 72-yard touchdown drive on its third possession of the game and capped it off with a one-yard run from Daniel David. Midway through the drive, David found Shaquil Terry for 28 yards on 3rd-and-17 to extend the possession. The catch-and-run was Terry's second-longest of the season.

On the Owls ensuing possession, Rechsteiner showed off his speed and took the ball up the middle 49 yards to put KSU on top, 21-0. After completing three third downs on the next drive, Charleston Southern split the uprights on a 49-yard field goal with 8:08 in the half.

Both offenses were quiet until Charleston Southern booted a 50-yard field with just over a minute in the half to cut the Owls' lead to 21-6. It was the first 50-plus yard field goal allowed by KSU since Oct. 24, 2015 versus Liberty.

Just before the half, Rechsteiner took a dive play 56 yards while shaking off four Bucs to extend the Kennesaw State lead to 28-6 at the break.

Both defenses tightened up to begin the second half, as the first two possessions for either team boasted more than 25 yards. Aided by a 54-yard punt return, Charleston Southern scored on its third drive to shrink the KSU lead to 28-13.

With 49 seconds left in the third quarter, Nathan Robertson drilled a 46-yard field goal, setting a career-high. CSU answered with a 43-yard touchdown pass on the next possession to pull within 11, 31-20. Kennesaw State marched down on its following possession going five plays and 62 yards, highlighted by a six-yard touchdown from David.

Kennesaw State went up 45-23 after David rushed for his third rushing touchdown of the day from the one-yard line. The senior signal caller set up his rushing score after finding T.J. Reed down the middle for 27 yards.

CSU drove the ball into the redzone in the final minute of the game, but could not convert the opportunity into points.

The Owls ended with 343 yards on the ground and outgained Charleston Southern 448-380.

Bryant collected a 51 yards rushing, including a pair of scores, and threw for 76 yards to go along with two additional scores. The four touchdowns responsible for were a career-high.

The Owls opened the game with an impressive 12 play, 63-yard drive that was capped by a one-yard touchdown rush from Daniel David. The drive sucked up 5 minutes and 19 seconds as the Owls rushed for all 63 yards.

The Kennesaw State defense scored its second touchdown of the year on Presbyterian's first drive of the contest when Tyler Moore picked up a fumble forced by Desmond Johnson Jr. on the 16-yard line and returned it for six. KSU found itself up 14 points at the nine-minute mark in the first quarter.

The Blue Hose scored on a wide receiver pass on their second possession and cut the score in half at with 6:30 in the first frame.

Three plays after the punt return, Bryant snuck in from the one line to push the lead to 42-10 with 10:02 in the third quarter.

Kennesaw State forced another fumble on PC's next possession and Kennesaw State capitalized on the favorable field possession as Bryant Found Jalen Jackson for a 28-yard strike to extend the lead to 49-

Shaq Terry found the end zone from six yards out to put the Owls on top 55-10 with 3:09 in the third quarter. The Owls defense was outstanding in the third quarter, as it allowed just 47 yards and forced three turnovers

The fourth quarter was back-and-forth on both sides of the ball as neither team scored. The Owls ended the game on a grueling, 11 play drive that gobbled up 6 minutes and 28 seconds before ending the game.
