TOP STORYLINES

• Kennesaw State is back on the road for the second straight week, traveling to Hampton for the first time in program history and looking to keep pace in Big South Conference play.

• The Owls are playing Hampton for the first time as the Pirates are in the middle of their first full season as members of the Big South Conference.

• KSU improved to 6-0 last week in games following a loss and has not lost back-to-back games since its inaugural season in 2015, a streak that spans 48 games.

• Kennesaw State captured its seventh consecutive Big South road win last week and will look to make it eight straight at Hampton, a streak that dates back to a 42-28 victory at Liberty during the 2017 season.

• The Owls continue to be the No. 1 rushing attack in the country, averaging 350.0 yards per game on the ground, including an FCS-best 42 rushing touchdowns.

• Kennesaw State is one of three teams in the nation to rank in the top-10 in scoring offense and total defense, ranking No. 6 in the nation in offense (39.0) and No. 8 in the county in defense (297.5).

• The KSU defense ranks eighth in the nation in stopping the run, giving up just 99 yards per game on the ground. The Owls have surrendered 100-plus rush yards four times in 10 games this year.

• The Owls are 21-8 against first-time FCS opponents and will play Hampton Saturday for the first time in program history.

STREAKIN'

• Dating back to Week 2 of the 2017 season, Kennesaw State has won 31 of its last 36 games for an 86.1 winning percentage.

• Kennesaw State has won 24 of its last 25 regular season games against FCS opponents, dating back to week two of the 2017 season.

• The Owls saw their streak of 12 consecutive Big South Conference victories come to an end on Nov. 2 against Monmouth, a mark that goes down as the second-longest streak in league history. Liberty holds the record at 16 from 2006-09.

• Kennesaw State has now been ranked in the top-25 for 31 consecutive weeks, a streak that dates back to week nine of the 2017 season. Of those 31 straight weeks in the national polls, 25 have been in the top 10.

NOTING HAMPTON

• Hampton is in its first full season in the Big South Conference and was picked to finish sixth overall in the league's preseason poll.

• The Pirates are 5-5 overall on the year, but have played their best football at home, going 4-1 at Armstrong Stadium, including a 40-17 victory over Presbyterian for its only conference win of the season.

• Head coach Robert Prunty is in his second season at the Helm of Hampton football, posting an overall record of 12-8. He was the first Pirate head coach to post a winning record in his first year since 2008.

• The Pirates lead the Big South Conference and rank fifth in the nation in time of possession, holding the ball for an average of 33:51 per game.

• The Hampton defense leads the league and is second in the nation with just two fumbles lost on the year, one of which came last week at Charleston Southern in an overtime loss.

• Florida State transfer quarterback Deondre Francois leads the Hampton offense, throwing for 2,362 yards and 23 touchdowns, while rushing for four more scores. He completes 59 percent of his passes and averages 236.2 passing yards per game.

• The top target at wide receiver is Jadakis Bonds, a 6-4, 179-pound sophomore who leads the country with 14 touchdown catches this season. He also leads the Big South Conference with 68 receptions and 84.5 yards per game. He is just 155 yards away from 1,000 yards receiving for the year.

• Fifth-year senior running back Shai McKenzie is on the brink of a 1,000-yard season on the ground, averaging 96.7 yards per game and needing just 33 yards to reach the mark. He has eight rushing touchdowns on the season and six 100-yard rushing games.

• Oral Varcciann leads the defense with 64 total tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss. Mason King has an FCS-best four fumble recoveries to go along with 32 tackles and 3.0 tackles for loss.

After becoming the first head football coach in Kennesaw State University history, Brian Bohannon has taken the Owls to heights never seen by a start-up football program.

In just four short years, Bohannon has led the Owls to a 37-12 record, back-to-back Big South Conference championships and consecutive appearances in the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs. After graduating the inaugural signing class in 2018, Bohannon has a new challenge ahead as the Owls go for an outright three-peat conference championship in 2019, something never done in the history of the league.

After putting the world on notice in 2017 with a 12-2 season, the outright Big South Conference title and two FCS Playoffs victories, the Owls somehow outdid themselves during the 2018 campaign. Ranked No. 2 in the nation for much of the year, KSU earned the No. 4 overall seed in the playoffs and took an 11-game winning streak to a second consecutive quarterfinal appearance where they held the third-longest home streak in the nation that dated back over two calendar years.

While the Owls have dominated on the field, Bohannon continues to collect accolades, earning the AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year following the 2017 season and earned AFCA District Coach of the Year after the 2018 campaign to go along with back-to-back Big South Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Bohannon, 47, put Kennesaw State on the map in 2017 when he led the Owls to a 12-2 season and an outright Big South Championship after finishing conference play undefeated at 5-0. Holding the country's top rushing offense, the Owls would make their first postseason berth in stellar fashion, getting revenge from their season-opening loss to Samford by winning 28-17 to advance.

The Owls then upset No. 3 Jacksonville State in the second round by scoring 14 unanswered second-half points to win 17-7. KSU's historic run would falter in the quarterfinals in a tough 34-27 loss to No. 5 Sam Houston State, but not before solidifying a young Kennesaw State team as one of the nation's top programs, earning him 2017 Big South Coach of the Year and AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year honors.

After being named Kennesaw State's coach on March 24, 2013, it took Bohannon just two seasons to vie for a Big South Conference title and reach the Top 25 as the Owls finished their debut year 6-5 before posting an 8-3 mark in 2016.

• In just four years of existence, Kennesaw State and head coach Brian Bohannon have three all-time playoff wins -- the second-most by both a league member and head coach. Former member Coastal Carolina and its head coach, Joe Moglia, own the record of four playoff victories.

• Bohannon is seventh in Big South history with 45 career coaching wins, and became the fastest Big South coach to win 45 games when he reached the benchmark with KSU's 38-35 win over Campbell on Nov. 9, 2019.

SPLITTIN' THE UPRIGHTS

• Sophomore kicker Nathan Robertson leads the FCS with 51 PATs this season. He ranks 24th in the country among kickers with 7.2 points per game. He knocked through a career-long 46-yard try versus Charleston Southern.

• Nicholas Jones handles kickoff duties for the Owls and comes into the bout with Hampton averaging 58.0 yards on 52 tries.

OWL STRONG

• The Owls rank No. 1 in the nation in passing yards per completion, averaging 21.17 yards per completion.

• Kennesaw State leads the Big South Conference in 21 team statistical categories, including scoring offense at 39.0 points per game and scoring defense at just 19.4 points per contest.

• KSU has blocked three punts this season and is tied for second in the country in blocked punts. Just four other programs have blocked three-or-more.

Kennesaw State's offense continued to roll and at the 1:11 mark in the first quarter, David found K.J. Hancock over the middle to push the edge to 28-0. The Owls added two more scores in the second quarter and held a 42-0 advantage at the break.

Tommy Bryant added two more scores himself in the second half, rushing for one while finding T.J. Reed on a wheel route for another.

A Nathan Robertson field goal with 7:24 to play capped off the Owls scoring.

The Owls defense was spectacular the entire night, allowing just 129 yards of total offense. Junior linebacker Kareem Taylor led the defense with five tackles and a sack, while Jeremy Dees, Demetric Barnes and Joel Parker each recorded a sack.

As a team, the Owls surrendered just 37 rushing yards and 92 passing yards. The defense allowed just 4-of-16 third down attempts and a miniscule 2.3 yards per play.

KENT, OHIO- In a grind-it-out game in which the Owls controlled the ball for 39 minutes, Kennesaw State fell 26-23 in overtime to Kent State.

After deferring the toss, the Kennesaw State defense stood strong on the first possession and forced a Golden Flash punt.

Daniel David led a field-goal drive on the first possession for the Owls and the Kennesaw State found themselves on top 3-0 with 8:15 to play after Nathan Robertson knocked through a 33-yard field goal.

On the ensuing Kent State possession, the Golden Flashes tied the ball game after a 32-yard field goal. The Owls answered with their second field goal that was set up by a 34-yard reception by Bronson Rechsteiner. Robertson hit a 21-yard field goal at the 11:58 mark in the second quarter to give the Owls the lead.

The Owls third drive of the day stalled, but was kept alive after recovering a muffed Kent State punt. Daniel David found Isaac Foster streaking down the middle of the field for 32 yards on the next play. Following the reception, David found paydirt from two yards out and put the Owls on top, 13-3 midway through the second quarter.

Kent State answered with a 23-yard quarterback scramble to pull within three points with under five minutes in the first half.

The Owls capped off a nine-play 50-yard drive with a 32-yard field goal and took a 16-10 lead at the break.

The Owls had a chance to put up points on the first possession of the second half after recovering a second muffed punt, but Daniel David threw his first interception of the season and the Golden Flashes took over at their 20-yard line.

Kent State took the 17-16 lead with 9:26 in the third quarter after converting a third-and-sixteen with a 75-yard touchdown pass down the sideline.

Kennesaw State looked like it was going to answer again- and thought it did- but a 43-yard rushing touchdown was called back on a holding penalty.

The KSU defense forced another three-and-out before the KSU offense converted a fourth down opportunity to push the ball into Kent State territory. On the fourth down play, David rolled out to his right and found K.J. Hancock down the right sideline who made a one-of-a-kind grab to keep the drive alive.

The Owls had their second touchdown of the day called back on the drive and couldn't pick up points after a missed field goal with 10:14 to play in the contest.

Kent State took a 20-16 lead at the 7:52 mark, but Kennesaw State answered the call and manufactured a 14-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 4-yard rushing touchdown from Daniel David to give the Owls the three-point advantage.

On final drive of the fourth quarter, the Golden Flashes drove the ball 49 yards and made a field goal to force the game into overtime at 23-23.

On its first possession of overtime, the Owls lost control of the football and turned it over, which gave the ball to the Golden Flashes.

Kent State drove home a 43-yard field goal to capture the victory.

All things were clicking for the Owls to begin the matinee at ASU Stadium, as Tanner Jones blocked the first Alabama State attempted punt after the defense forced a three-and-out to open the game. Daniel David scored from two yards out to give the Owls the first lead of the game.

Turnover Plank made an appearance during the ensuing possession, as Demetrius Pettway intercepted the Hornets' pass attempt and took it the distance to push the advantage to two scores at the 11:55 mark in the opening quarter.

After another defensive stop, Bronson Rechsteiner capped off a 9-play, 97-yard yard drive with a 55-yard run between the tackles to extend the lead to 21-0 at the end of the first quarter.

Adesola Abisoye opened up the second quarter with the Owls' second interception of the contest and set up KSU on the Hornets' side of the field. The drive ended with Tommy Bryant muscling through the Hornets' defensive line from two yards out, which put the Owls on top, 28-0 with just over nine minutes to play in the first half.

The half ended with the Owls up 28-0 after running out of time on the final drive of the second quarter. At the break, Kennesaw State had outgained the Hornets 232-78 and held a 215-to-19 advantage on the ground.

The second half started much like the first- the Owls scored on their first drive of the quarter that was highlighted by a 55-yard score by Antavious Grier.

The Hornets answered with a touchdown pass at the 12-minute mark to cut the lead to 35-7. KSU scored on a 14-yard rush by Tommy Bryant, whose second score of the day put the Owls up 42-7 with 5:39 left in the third quarter.

The final quarter was a defensive battle, as neither team scored and the score held 42-7 in favor of the Owls. Because the Owls' offense was effective all night, Kennesaw State's first punt of the contest came with 56 seconds in the fourth quarter. KSU ended with 481 yards on the ground, while six different rushers recorded 50-plus yards. Joel Parker led the Kennesaw State defense with eight tackles.

The Owls look to put together back-to-back wins and will end their three-game road swing at Missouri State on Saturday (Sept. 21).

SPRINGFIELD, Mo.- Behind a program-best 221 yards from Bronson Rechsteiner and another 183 from Isaac Foster, Kennesaw State rolled over Missouri State 35-24 for its second-straight victory.

For the first time this season, Kennesaw State allowed an opening-drive touchdown, as Missouri State took a 6-0 lead after having the ball for just under five minutes. Bryson Armstrong broke through the line and swatted the extra point attempt for his first blocked kick of the season.

Both teams went back-and-forth for the remainder of the quarter and score remained 6-0 through the end of the first frame. Kennesaw State missed an opportunity for three points with 8:04 in the second quarter when a 44-yard field was pushed right.

Missouri State took advantage of a 55-yard punt to pin the Owls on their own half-yard line and forced a fumble on KSU's first play of the drive. Two plays later, the Bears took a 13-0 lead with a two-yard run with 2:48 to go in the half.

On the ensuing drive, Kennesaw State responded with 75-yard run by Foster that included the sophomore slinging off three defenders while staying upright to cut the lead to 13-7 with under two minutes to play in the half. Aided by two penalties, Missouri State was able to reach field goal range and took advantage and knocked through a 37-yard try as time expired in the first half.

Foster showed off his speed on the first play of the second half as he took the ball 67 yards to pull the Owls within two points, 16-14.

On the very next play from scrimmage for the Owls' offense, Rechsteiner bolted up the middle for an 85-yard score that gave the Owls their first lead of the game. In three offensive plays, the Owls garnered 227 rushing yards and three scores. The play was the longest play from scrimmage in program history.

In the third quarter alone, the Owls rushed for 223 yards.

Daniel David scampered in the end zone with 6:10 to play in the fourth quarter for his sixth rushing touchdown of the season that gave the Owls a 35-16 advantage. Missouri State answered with a 28-yard passing touchdown to cut it to 35-24 with just under three minutes to play in the contest.

Kennesaw State outgained Missouri State 526-385 in total offense and finished with 479 on the ground.

The Owls defense stood strong for the remainder of the contest and KSU held on for their first win over a Missouri Valley Football Conference opponent.

KENNESAW, Ga.— The No. 4 Kennesaw State football team won its 11th straight Big South conference game and improved to 5-1 on the year after beating Charleston Southern 45-23 on Saturday.

Bronson Rechsteiner dominated the rushing game for the Owls, scoring two 45-plus yard touchdowns and ending with 138 yards on the ground.

Isaac Foster displayed impressive vision and took the opening kickoff 32 yards to give the Owls the ball at the 39-yard line. After the Bucs forced a punt on the first possession, Charlie Patrick intercepted a deep ball on Charleston Southern's first possession and returned it to CSU's 21. Four plays later, Antavius Grier took a pitch around the left side 10 yards to put the Owls up 7-0 at the 11:34 mark in the first quarter.

Kennesaw State manufactured a 16-play, 72-yard touchdown drive on its third possession of the game and capped it off with a one-yard run from Daniel David. Midway through the drive, David found Shaquil Terry for 28 yards on 3rd-and-17 to extend the possession. The catch-and-run was Terry's second-longest of the season.

On the Owls ensuing possession, Rechsteiner showed off his speed and took the ball up the middle 49 yards to put KSU on top, 21-0. After completing three third downs on the next drive, Charleston Southern split the uprights on a 49-yard field goal with 8:08 in the half.

Both offenses were quiet until Charleston Southern booted a 50-yard field with just over a minute in the half to cut the Owls' lead to 21-6. It was the first 50-plus yard field goal allowed by KSU since Oct. 24, 2015 versus Liberty.

Just before the half, Rechsteiner took a dive play 56 yards while shaking off four Bucs to extend the Kennesaw State lead to 28-6 at the break.

Both defenses tightened up to begin the second half, as the first two possessions for either team boasted more than 25 yards. Aided by a 54-yard punt return, Charleston Southern scored on its third drive to shrink the KSU lead to 28-13.

With 49 seconds left in the third quarter, Nathan Robertson drilled a 46-yard field goal, setting a career-high. CSU answered with a 43-yard touchdown pass on the next possession to pull within 11, 31-20. Kennesaw State marched down on its following possession going five plays and 62 yards, highlighted by a six-yard touchdown from David.

Kennesaw State went up 45-23 after David rushed for his third rushing touchdown of the day from the one-yard line. The senior signal caller set up his rushing score after finding T.J. Reed down the middle for 27 yards.

CSU drove the ball into the redzone in the final minute of the game, but could not convert the opportunity into points.

The Owls ended with 343 yards on the ground and outgained Charleston Southern 448-380.

Bryant collected a 51 yards rushing, including a pair of scores, and threw for 76 yards to go along with two additional scores. The four touchdowns responsible for were a career-high.

KENNESAW, Ga. - For the first time in program history, No. 4 Kennesaw State did not complete a pass, but it did not matter as the Owls ran for a season-high 492 yards to roll North Alabama 41-17 on a wet, windy afternoon at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

Kennesaw State found itself down early after surrendering a touchdown on the opening drive. The Lions capped off a 65-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown to take the first lead of the game with 11:29 in the opening quarter.

The Owls marched down the field midway through the first quarter as Daniel David orchestrated a nine-play, 85-yard drive and capped it off with his 12th rushing touchdown of the season to cut UNA's lead to one point after the PAT was blocked. Adelolu Adeleke aided the drive with a 30-yard scamper down the left sideline.

David etched his fourth multi-rushing touchdown game of the season just 12 minutes into the second quarter with a 13-yard rush up the middle. With the rush, Kennesaw State took its first lead of the day, 13-7, with 11:54 in the half. North Alabama answered with a play action pass from 28 yards out to take a 14-13 lead at the 9:03 mark in the second quarter.

Kevin Ficklin then put the Owls back on top with a 17-yard rush around the right end with just under five minutes left in the half. On the ensuing offensive possession for the Owls, Ficklin scored once again, sprinting from 30 yards out to extend the KSU lead to 27-17 at the half.

At the break, the Owls out-rushed the Lions 316-13.

The Owls opened the second half with an impressive 15 play, 63 yard drive that concluded with a two-yard touchdown rush from David, which tied his career-high. The touchdown marked the fifth-straight drive in which the Owls scored a touchdown.

KSU's defense was stout in the third quarter and allowed just 13 yards by the Lions.

Jonathan Murphy made his Owls debut in the third quarter and went on to lead a touchdown drive on his second possession under center. Through his first two drives, Murphy collected 72 yards and a touchdown.

The Owls continued to grind out the game and finished off the Lions, 41-17, to win their 23rd-straight regular season FCS game.

KENNESAW, Ga.- After winning 12-straight Big South games, Kennesaw State stumbled against Monmouth, 45-21, on a brisk Saturday afternoon at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

The Kennesaw State defense came out of the gate destructive, as it forced back-to-back three-and-outs to begin the game. After upping the tempo on the third drive, Monmouth was able to drive the ball deep into Kennesaw State territory and knocked through a 22-yard field goal.

BUIES CREEK, N.C. – In the Owls first trip to Campbell in program history, No. 11 Kennesaw State edged Campbell 38-35 on a chilled afternoon at Baker-Lane Stadium.

Coming in for an injured Daniel David, Tommy Bryant put on a show with three rushing scores and two passing touchdowns. The junior recorded 105 yards on the ground to help propel the Owls to their 13th Big South victory in 14 tries.

Campbell drove down the field on its first drive of the game, but pushed a 38-yard field goal attempt right to give Kennesaw State its first possession of the game on the 21-yard line. After the Owls went three-and-out on their opening drive, Campbell took a 7-0 lead after a two-yard rush at the 5:04 mark in the first quarter.

On the Owls' third offensive possession of the game, Kennesaw State went 28 yards on 5 plays to cut the lead to 7-3 after a 43-yard field goal from Nathan Robertson. Campbell answered with a 79-yard drive to put the Camels on top, 14-3, with 11:47 in the half.

Kennesaw State cut the Camel lead to four points with just over six minutes to go in the half after Bryant kept the ball, made a move near the right hashmark and scored from eight yards out. The Camels scored their third touchdown of the half with 1:57 to extend the advantage to 21-10.

Bryant orchestrated an impressive drive to end the half that began on the Campbell 46-yard line after a 33-yard yard return by Antavious Grier and a personal foul penalty. On third-and-two on the CU 20-yard line, Bryant threw a dart and found Shaquill Terry wide open for a touchdown. The Owls went into the break down 21-17.

Markeith Montgomery displayed incredible concentration on the Owls' first defensive possession of the second half as he intercepted the ball 40 yards down the field after the football had bounced off of the wide receiver's helmet. The Owls capitalized on the turnover and took a 24-21 lead after Bryant scampered in the end zone from two yards out with under four minutes to play in the quarter.

Momentum stayed on the Owls side for the rest of the third frame as Bryson Armstrong picked off a pass down the middle of the field on the Camels next possession. On the ensuing play, Bryant found Terry for 26-yard touchdown to push the Owls' lead to 31-21.

After recovering an Owl fumble in the fourth frame, Campbell cut the lead to 31-28 after a three-yard rush.

Bryant dashed in the end zone for his third touchdown of the day with 6:51 left in the contest. The signal called kept the football from one-yard out to tie his career-high. Campbell scored at the 3:01 mark in the fourth quarter to bring the ballgame to 38-35, but a reception by Terry kept the final drive alive for the Owls, who ultimately ran out the clock.
