TOP STORYLINES

• Kennesaw State is set to play its first game against Georgia since Nov. 29, 2016 in Athens. The Owls fell 82-40 in the post-Thanksgiving matchup.

• The Owls return nine players, including all five starters from last year's squad. Kennesaw State comes into the 2019-20 season with last season's leading scorer, Kamiyah Street, (16.9 PPG), leading rebounder, Alexis Poole (8.4 RPG) and leader in assists (Amani Johnson (4.4).

• During the summer, it was announced that the Owls were ranked No. 20 in the WBCA Academic rankings. The Owls were the sole program in the ASUN to receive the honor as well as the only program in the state of Georgia to be recognized on the list. KSU ended the season with a 3.54 GPA.

• With Amani Johnson's 2018-19 ASUN Freshman of the year award, the Owls have won three-straight awards. Carlotta Gianolla won the award for the 2016-17 season, while Kamiyah Street won the award for the 2017-18 campaign.

• The Owls welcome two newcomers on this year's squad, Gillian Piccolino and Gabi Legister. Both hail from the Pittsburgh, Pa. area and logged significant playing time during the team's Italian Summer Tour.

• The Owls are coming off a 9-22 record, which included a 4-12 mark in conference play. The regular season was highlighted with a 70-47 win over NJIT on Feb. 9, 2018, when the Owls hosted Pink Day to honor Coach Berenato and her battle with breast cancer.

• After reaching the conference tournament with a No. 7 seed, the Owls knocked off No. 2 Stetson in the first round of the ASUN Championship Tournament. The victory was just the second time in league history that a No. 7 seed moved on the semifinals.

• Two new faces will be seen on the Kennesaw State bench this season. This summer, Coach Berenato introduced Janell Crayton and Alex Winchell as assistant coaches. Crayton comes to Kennesaw State from Hampton University, where she served as an assistant coach. Winchell joins the KSU staff from Memphis, where she served as the director of basketball operations.

• The Owls welcome two more student-athletes from the Pittsburgh, Pa., area with the additions of Piccolino and Legister, upping the total to four on the roster.

The only freshman to be named captain by Head Coach Agnus Berenato in her 33 years as a head coach, Amani Johnson made an immediate impact for the Owls during her freshman season. She played and started in all 31 games last season and ranked eighth in the nation in minutes per game (37:44). She also ranked second in the ASUN in assists per contest (4.4) and steals per game (2.26). The reigning ASUN Freshman of the Year, she looks to continue to her leadership role and guide the Owls in 2019-20.

2019 SUMMER TOUR



Kennesaw State was able to embark on a 10-day voyage to Italy in July. The team made stops in Rome, Florence and Venice and played three games while abroad. The Owls ended 3-0 after playing Italian Select, Venice Select and the Ottawa University. One of the most memorable parts of the trip was visiting the childhood home of senior Carlotta Gianolla. The team was able to dine and visit with Gianolla's hometown friends and family, while learning about the Italian culture.

SOUL SENIOR

After coming to the United States without being able to speak English in 2016, senior Carlotta Gianolla has accomplished many things on-and-off the court at Kennesaw State.

In 2016-17, she was selected as the unanimous ASUN Freshman of the Year, while off the court she has been able master the English language and serve as a tour guide to her teammates during the 2019 Summer Tour.

Gianolla looks to serve as an on-the-court leader this season as the Owls' only four-year season.

Agnus Berenato has earned a reputation of turning around struggling programs and building them into winners. After three seasons as the head coach of the Kennesaw State women's basketball program, the veteran head coach has the Owls trending in the right direction. In three seasons at the helm, Berenato has guided Kennesaw State to its first ASUN Conference Championship victory, including upsetting No. 2 Stetson as in the 2019 Tournament. Under Berenato's leadership,

Kennesaw State has reached the ASUN Tournament semifinal round in two out of three seasons. She has recruited back-to-back-to-back unanimous ASUN Conference Freshmen of the Year, in Carlotta Gianolla (2016-17) and Kamiyah Street (2017-18) and Amani Johnson (2018-19). The WBCA presented Berenato with the Carol Eckman Integrity in Coaching Award at the NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four in 2019.

Berenato came to Kennesaw State with the distinction of being the winningest coach at the University of Pittsburgh and the second-winningest at Georgia Tech. Within three years of assuming head-coaching duties at Georgia Tech, she led the Yellow Jackets to the 1992 WNIT championship. The next year, Tech made its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

Two years after taking the helm at Pitt, the Panthers rattled off five consecutive postseason berths, including back-to-back NCAA Sweet 16's in 2008 and 2009. Berenato has won 470 games in her 31-year head coaching career that spans four years at Rider University, 15 at Georgia Tech, 10 at Pitt and three at Kennesaw State.

Berenato devotes significant time to volunteer and mission work. She joined Surgicorps International on medical missions to Vietnam (2016) and Bhutan (2017), and was a Women's Leadership Ambassador for the US Embassy that traveled to third-world countries, Suriname and Ghiana, in August of 2017. Berenato's travels have also taken her to Kingston, Jamaica on a Pediatric AIDS Mission with Father Ho Loung of the Missionaries of the Poor, and to Afghanistan, Kuwait and Qatar where she visited US Military troops as part of a Good Will trip. Committed to also helping others at home, Berenato is actively involved in Hospice and the Girl Scouts of America.

In addition to several high school and college commencement addresses, the list of organizations that Berenato has spoken to includes such Fortune 500 Companies as the Risk Management Association, Chase Manhattan Bank, PNC, and Dollar Energy, while also presenting a TEDx Talk. Since coming to Kennesaw State, Berenato has spoken to the Kennesaw Business Association, Marietta Business Association and Acworth Business Association, while also serving as the keynote speaker for KSU Facilities Leadership and at the KSU Phenomenal Women Luncheon.

As head coach of the Kennesaw State women's basketball program, she led the team with the adoption of Cate Zavitz, a young girl who was diagnosed with Autosomal Recessive Congenital Ichthyosis-- a form of skin disease. The product of a basketball family, Berenato's sister is Bernadette McGlade, a former Georgia Tech head coach and now the commissioner of the Atlantic 10 Conference. A native of Gloucester City, N.J., Berenato and her husband Jack have five children: Theresa Marie (Mike, Frankie and LuLu Drapkin), Andrew, Santo (Alicia and John Lawton), Clare and Christina.

After earning the 2017-18 ASUN Freshman of the Year award, she ended last season as the conference's leader in scoring, after pouring in 16.9 points per game last season. She was also pesky on defense as well, as she led the conference in steals (94) and steals per game (3.03). She is a quick slasher that looks to score with the ball in her hands and will be the leader of the squad when she is on the court.

» Alexis Poole is going to be vital to this year's squad as she returns as the Owls leading rebounder (8.4) and second leading scorer (14.2). She looks to be more careful on defense and stay out of foul trouble this season. Poole is a leader and will play big minutes this season, barring foul trouble.

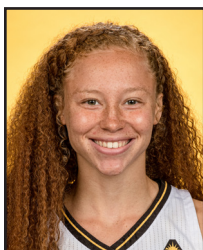

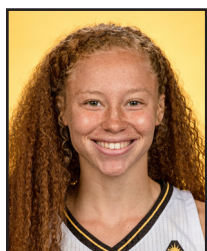
